PASTOR'S REFLECTIONS

I hope you will allow me to share a personal moment with you. Last weekend we had a missionary saying the Masses here at St. Luke's. Since he was a priest, it allowed me a chance to get away for the weekend, or at least to be free to do some things.

I took a bit of a road trip on Saturday. (Yes, I did hit a few antique stores, no good rescues.) The main point of the trip was to go back down to Cleveland MN, where I was assigned for 2 years, and visit my DRE (Director of Religious Education) who is dealing with a second round of fighting breast cancer. It was last minute and on a whim, so I contacted her daughter on Facebook Messenger to make sure she would be home and not have anything going on. I wanted my visit to be a total surprise. It was! I enjoyed a nice 2 1/2 hour visit with her and her family. So Saturday was good - a long drive, but I like a long drive now and then.

Sunday I decided to face a fear. I shared with a few of you that I was going to do this. Without going into great detail, I had left my last parish abruptly, by way of a hospital stay. That first year, I was in no condition to go back and visit. Much healing has happened in the last 7 years. But a part of me has realized I have been practicing avoidance. How can I say I am healed if I have simply avoided some things? I then learned that one of my former servers got engaged and wanted me to celebrate her wedding. To be able to fulfill this, I would have to go back. Granted, she gave me an out when she said, "I will get married somewhere else if I have to, but I want you!" But I did not think it was fair to ask.

So I decided to go to Mass there last weekend. To be honest with you there were a lot of emotions moving around inside of me. I had talked to the Pastor and he knew I was coming. The bride and her family knew I was coming, but thought I was going to be in street clothes and sitting with them. I told them, "If you're going to face the devil, go head on." Walking down that main aisle was powerful and emotions were flowing. Overall Mass went well. I had visited with a few people before Mass, as they were coming in. I received a few hugs and many "We miss you." I started wondering, is this what I have been avoiding?

Sure, it was not all up. I felt one person looking at me with hate. But I also know they are a very unhappy person, and could no longer make me join in their unhappiness. After the Mass out front of Church I once again found out how many were happy to see me. We often only think of the negative, and forget the positive and the love. I know I had; that is what kept me away for 7 years.

We sometimes see avoidance as protecting ourselves. If we avoid it, it can't hurt us. But as I found out Sunday, we also avoid the love and the good. Over time, all things change, even us. But avoidance and fear can hold us back and can keep us from growing. Sunday was a good day for me. I confronted avoidance and a fear and came out ahead of things. What have you been avoiding in your life? Is it something you should confront? Don't be afraid to grow. I sure am glad I faced one of my fears. It feels so good to be done with that.

Sometimes what we think will be a ton a bricks falling down on us can end up being a lot of loving hands lifting us up. But until you face it, you will never know.

Faith and Family

As much as we long for and enjoy summer, we pack our schedules full, get overwhelmed, and worry. We worry whether we can get all the activities in, do a good job at work and get the house cleaned, the yard work done or whether our child will make the soccer team or not. Often times these are small things or things considered “first world” problems, while our neighbors in less fortunate countries worry about having a clean water supply or whether their children will get an education beyond age 10, or if they will have enough money to buy their food for the next day. While we know that our day-to-day issues are less worrisome we still worry. Our Lord tells us in scripture to not worry but to give our cares over to Him. “Why are you downcast, O my soul? Why so disturbed within me? Put your hope in God, for I will yet praise him, my Savior and my God” (Psalm 42:5). If something is taking up space in your head, give it to God in prayer. Ask the Lord to help you give up control, and ask the Lord to lead you or your child to where you need to be. Our children can pick up on our feelings and can begin to worry as well. Learning not to worry is a difficult task and must be taken one day at a time. Establishing a time for daily prayer, receiving the Eucharist often, and reading the Bible are all much more productive than worrying. These practices will also bring us peace, even in the midst of turmoil. As time progresses, we will begin to trust in the Lord’s plan for our lives, give our cares over to him and obtain peace and joy even in the most difficult times. “Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your paths straight. Do not be wise in your own eyes; fear the LORD and shun evil. This will bring health to your body and nourishment to your bones” (Proverbs 3:5-8).
