

PASTOR'S REFLECTIONS

This weekend we are celebrating the Baptism of the Lord. From time to time someone will ask me about why Jesus needed to be Baptized? When we are Baptized, we are changed, we are cleansed from origin sin. Jesus did not have the stain of origin sin, when He was Baptized, He changed the waters of Baptism. In our Gospel today, John again talks about the "one mightier than I is coming." John never pointed to himself, he always pointed to Christ. Our own Baptism permanently connects us to Christ.

I have always felt strongly about Baptism. One, that it should not be taken lightly. Parents and God Parents stand up before God and His Church stating that they are willing to raise the child in the faith. This is no small statement. I wonder sometimes how true the "We are!" is. I remember Baptizing one of my niece's babies. My nephew was standing up as God Father. We got up to the house following for the lunch/party. He said to me, "So how did I do?" I looked right at him and said, "Your job has just begun. What we did today was the ceremony, your role of God Father just started today." I love the ceremony for Baptism, but fear too many see it as beginning and end, it is just a beginning.

Some of you know that I keep a book in my office that holds the names of all of those I have Baptized into a relationship with Jesus Christ. I say a prayer every day for those I have baptized. My first Baptism was as a transitional Deacon on July 2, 2006 at the parish where I was placed for my summer deacon program. Her name was Madeline Ann, and I still hear from this young couple and hope after Covid to get together with them. By the way, Madeline was recently confirmed. Madeline may have been my first, but Flora Lynn was my most recent and #233 in my book. I will forever feel connected to those children and adults I have baptized.

On the other side it is special too. The priest who baptized me and who I am named after, had moved over to the Green Bay Diocese in the 80's. As I was entering seminary I reached out to try and let him know I was studying to become a priest. I received a nice ordination card from him at my first parish. Just a few years ago I was at a seminar at King's House and one of the speakers was from the Green Bay Diocese, so I asked if he knew him. He said, "Yes, he just died." I so wish I would have made a stronger effort to get over and see him. I contacted the parish he had been serving in his retirement. Expressing my condolences. A few months later I was contacted by them stating that since He was an only child, the Diocese and the closest living relatives, wished to pass on to me his ordination chalice. I was and still am deeply touched to be able to have and use this chalice that he received from his parents when he was ordained (a year before I was born).

Do you remember your baptism? Unless you were an adult when you were baptized, you likely do not remember. Parents, share stories with your children about what you remember about their baptism. Celebrate the date of baptism, it was a second birthday of sorts. I always remember my baptism date, January 1st, when I was young I thought people were staying up until midnight to wish me a Happy Baptism date. I know better now. I think we need to make an effort to see Baptism as important as it really is.

Lastly, this last month has been full of early bulletin deadlines. It is so hard to write weeks in advance. So, I would like to take this chance to thank all of you for the Christmas Greetings, cards, or gifts. I try my best to get Thank You cards written and sent, but know sometimes it gets missed. This year one of my Thank-you's is for someone who wished to remain anonymous.

Blessings to all of you as we start this new year. Father Backer

Faith and Family

The feast of the Baptism of the Lord celebrates the baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist. We know that, because Jesus was born without sin, he did not really need to be baptized. And yet, Jesus has John the Baptist baptize him as an example for all of us and as a sign of his true identity. He is God's son, the living presence of God on earth. He is true God and true man. The Gospels tell us that Jesus was a human man whose goal was to discern and do God's will and to bring others along with him to grow in Faith and Love for his Father. Jesus had lived an ordinary life and worked with his hands as a carpenter. Then one day, he joined the tax collectors, soldiers and throngs of ordinary people going to John. He identified himself with their hopes and needs. Jesus loved all the people whom he served and journeyed with the people who desired a radical return to God for themselves and their world. When we renew our baptismal promises, we proclaim our belief in the waters of baptism and our new and ongoing life in Christ. Baptism is so important, and it's a great thing to make sure that our children truly understand. One thing we can do to get across the importance of Baptism to our kids is to celebrate their Baptism anniversary. Look up their Baptism date, put it on the calendar, and make them a cake. Also, light their Baptism candle at dinner. Provide some holy water for everyone to bless themselves, and renew their Baptismal promises. Teach them what we are taught in the Catechism of the Catholic church "Holy Baptism is the basis of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit (vitae spiritualis ianua), and the door which gives access to the other sacraments. Through Baptism we are freed from sin and reborn as sons of God; we become members of Christ, are incorporated into the Church and made sharers in her mission: "Baptism is the sacrament of regeneration through water in the word."


