## **PASTOR'S REFLECTIONS**

We are officially back into Ordinary Time, on the Church calendar. Our world is still anything but ordinary at this time. At the time of this writing, Covid numbers have continued to spike. I pray that it will start to show signs of changing. We need to be offering prayers for all of our health care workers. Yes, we have all likely been under added stress these last few years dealing with this Pandemic. However, many of our health care workers have again and again put themselves at risk to care for those who are suffering. Many of them have been called in to cover extra shifts. I am sure some have walked away from their jobs, simply because Covid has taken its toll on them with jobs that must be done. From one day to another it has been hard to keep track of where things are, with different facilities having different policies about who can and cannot get in.

Ordinary Time in Liturgy is between the other more focus times of Advent / Christmas, and Lent/ Easter. The green vestments come back too. Once again, I wish that during this time our world would come back to an 'ordinary time', however, I don't think we are quite out of this yet. It is hard to believe we are already half way through January, this gives me hope for the arrival of Spring. As we get closer to March and April we will see more concrete signs of springs arrival. Yet we need to take things day by day, and remind ourselves that the Lord is with us through it all.

In the Gospel this weekend we see Jesus' perform his first miracle. At the Wedding of Cana he changes water into wine. Notice, not just wine, but fine wine, better than what was already served. Jesus can also change us in all that we are going through at the moment, change us into something better, even better than we were before Covid. Yet, I often think we resist this change. Sometimes change scares us and we simply want to remain the same (even if it is not good) just because we know what to expect. Change asks us to be open to something different, something new. It's not just Covid that asks us to change; a new job can, the loss of a loved one can, even a simple change in our routine can. We may not want to face these changes, but some of them are out of our control and we must face them. We can't often see the positive side of change until after we have gone through it.

Remember, Jesus did not just make wine, he made fine wine. Jesus can make us into amazing things. Sometimes we simply need to "let go and let God." We have all been affected in some way these last few years, but we may have not been affected in the same way. I think it would do us good to understand that we all have not experienced that stress in the same way. We have not all responded in the same way. The 2nd reading this weekend reminds us that we all receive the same spirit, but that spirit gives each of us different gifts. The Lord gives us all gifts. What we do with those gifts is our gift back to God.

Two things I have been praying for a lot lately. One, that Covid numbers go down. Two, that the temperature numbers go up. Let's all be praying for our world right now. That Jesus will make that change in our world, making it better than it was before.

#### Faith and Family

Mary knew how to treat the Lord: there was a crisis, and she went to him for a solution. The vast majority of Jews living in Palestine were poor. Wedding feasts and religious festivals were their sole respite from a life of hard labor and simple survival. In fact, wedding feasts often lasted for days at a time (they took the place of our honeymoons, which didn't exist in first-century Israel), and the entire town participated. To run out of wine in the middle of it would not only deflate the festive atmosphere, but it would also deeply shame the newlyweds and their families, turning what should be the most joyous days of their lives into an embarrassment. Attentive to the needs of those around her, Mary saw the crisis coming, and she knew just what to do. Even when the words of Jesus' answer seemed like a rebuff, she knew that he would come through. Jesus will never reject the humble appeal of faith - he is a Lord who "came not be served but to serve" (Matthew 20:28), and he's hoping that we will have as much confidence in him as his mother did.

We shouldn't overlook the power Jesus shows in this miracle. It was the "first of his signs", and by it he "let his glory be seen", to the benefit of his disciples, whose faith it deepened. Picture what happened. Pretend you are one of the servants. You fill up six huge stone kegs with water (no easy task when you have to go back and forth to the well). Then this young rabbi from the neighboring town tells you to draw some out (some of the water, remember - you know it's water, because you put it in there yourself) and bring it to the steward in charge of testing the wine before serving it. Imagine how dumbfounded you would be by such an order. But you do it. And you're carrying the water over to the steward, glancing nervously back over your shoulder at Mary and Jesus, who motion for you to keep going. You hand the gourd to the boss, looking down, maybe even closing your eyes in anticipation of his wrathful rebuke. And then, all of a sudden, he smacks his lips and hums with pleasure... Jesus turned a hundred gallons of water into excellent wine, effortlessly. This is our Lord. -The Better Part.
