

PASTOR'S REFLECTIONS

In the Gospel this weekend we see a clear act of, "Come on, we know you!" Maybe we could call it, "You can't go home again." This Gospel is the continuation of the Gospel from last week. Jesus tells the people that He is the fulfillment of the scripture from Isaiah, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord." The problem is, He is in his hometown.

As we are growing up we often form deep seated opinions about others and often do not believe they could ever change. I know growing up I often felt like my personal identity was tied into my parents identity. This was more so at Church, where my parents were well known. I was always "Do and Elmer's son." In school I was known for something else. I was one who was not in the 'in group'. As a matter of fact, I was often the target for the 'in group'. We often get put in boxes and sometimes we never get ourselves out of those boxes, even if those boxes are not who we really are.

One of the major growing moments in my own life happened my first summer of Major seminary. We were to go through CPE (Clinical Pastoral Education). It was a chaplaincy program and the person who interviewed me to write up a report to include with my application to different sites, decided I would have a really hard time with CPE. Why? Because she found out I was the last of nine children. She was a firm believer in birth order. Guess what? My CPE summer was AMAZING. I came back and people could tell that something had happened to me, that I had changed for the better.

I stepped out of the box that I had been put in. I was growing into who God wanted me to be. If we are really honest with ourselves, we see that we never stop growing. We are always learning something. Sure maybe we are not good at everything we try, but if we stop trying we may never find what we truly are great at.

I'm sure many of you have gone back to your hometown for a visit or a reunion, and have found many things changed. Either the people have changed or the town has changed. Often times both have changed. Perhaps you are the one who has changed, even if others have not. We need to see people for who they are, not who they were. To welcome the fact that we can take any event, good or bad, and we can learn from it. We can grow for having gone through it.

I sometimes consider how much people have changed this last two years. Good or bad, I think all of us have seen sides of people we have never seen before. Or maybe we have seen different sides of ourselves?? I believe after we get through this, we will all have much rebuilding to do. We will need to rebuild relationships with people that were on different sides. Some relationships likely will never heal. They may be lost forever. We may come to see how some relationships mean very much to us and we should never again take that relationship for granted.

I pray through all of this, your faith has been something you could cling to for strength. Even if it has caused us to question at times, I pray your faith remains strong. Because the relationship we should never go without is the one we have with Jesus Christ.




PARISH & COMMUNITY EVENTS

Faith and Family

Jesus' statement that no prophet is accepted in his home town reminds us that it is often difficult to hear a challenging message from those who know us best, even if it is true. Perhaps we remember and even regret this aspect of our childhood and adolescence. We may have overlooked the wisdom and guidance of our parents, while allowing the voices of others—teachers, friends, and counselors—to carry more weight, even when these people were telling us the same thing. Perhaps this developmental stage is unavoidable. Perhaps as we have matured, we have come to a new appreciation for our parents and others whose perspective and experience we once rejected. Today's Gospel provides an opportunity to talk about and to learn from such experiences. Think about proverbs or other wise sayings that are familiar to your family ("Blood is thicker than water;" "All that glitters is not gold."). Consider what these proverbs mean and whether you believe them to be true. Why or why not? Jesus challenges the people of Nazareth by reminding them of old sayings that seem to have a lot of truth in them. Let's listen to this Gospel and consider what these proverbs mean. Read aloud today's Gospel, Luke 4:21-30. Ask: What were the proverbs that Jesus quoted? (Physician, cure yourself; No prophet is accepted in his native place.) Consider the meaning of these proverbs and look for examples from your own family life that show their truth. Consider how your family might accept one another's wisdom and guidance and not reject the prophets in your midst. Conclude by praying together the Prayer of the Holy Spirit. -Sunday Connection
