The Eucharist transforms us; then we are sent forth to transform the world.

Welcome back to Mass!

As many people are returning to the pews and as we get closer to the Bishop's dispensation being lifted on June 5, we wanted to share three reasons it is important to attend Mass in person:

1. Removal from the "ordinary"

While a relationship with Christ should be part of our daily and weekly routine (*God is with us always*), breaking out of our routine and engaging in something out of the ordinary helps us to deepen our love for the Lord.

Just like a married couple may have many wonderful and loving moments throughout the week, they also need time set aside to grow in their relationship. By stepping into the Mass, we enter into a sacred space the Lord has established specifically for us to encounter him in an extraordinary way.

2. Receiving the Eucharist

Jesus is the Lamb of God, and the Eucharist is the incredible gift of his Body and Blood, which we can participate in and receive sacramentally when we attend Mass.

And not only is it a gift, but it is also necessary for our salvation. As Christ tell us in John 6:53-54, "unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day."

The Eucharist transforms us to be more like Christ and have a heart like his.

3. Because the Church says so

Today's culture isn't big on individuals being told what to do, but the reality is that Christ gave his Church the authority to bind certain things on us during this life, that will be bound in heaven.

Christians have gathered together to celebrate the Mass and the Eucharist on the Lord's Day since the time of the Apostles, and over the centuries the Church has evolved that tradition into an obligation that draws us into a life of deeper holiness.



Andrea is especially thankful for her husband (her "constant support, cheerleader, and proofreader") and kids ("who put up with me saying 'you will have to wait until I'm finished with this project to ask me.'")

Andrea Mendoza earned a masters degree

When Andrea Mendoza earned a Masters in Music Education from Wichita State this month, she wore the traditional pink graduation stole of a music major. She could have worn (*but didn't*) multiple hats signifying her many other roles:

1) Paid positions as a private piano instructor, and church pianist at Resurrection Lutheran Church, and

2) Her vocation as wife and mother of four. This past year she was also a homeschool teacher of four (*her daughters will return to St Mary this Fall*) due to the pandemic.

3) As a Steward, Andrea has been a pianist at St Mary Masses and school concerts; and has mentored high school students as they learned to accompany cantors at Mass.

For her final project for her masters, she identified the basics of coordinated movements and alignment for the beginner piano student, then found supporting research from biomechanics, anatomy, and ergonomics.

"I started classes with the goal of recertification for my state teaching license," said Andrea. "But I loved what I was learning and could see how each class was making me a better teacher. I can see a difference in how my students learn, because my teaching approach has changed from tradition-based to research-based."

Andrea just completed teaching early childhood music at Envision in Wichita as part of her WSU graduate assistantship.

She has a B.A. in Music Education from Southwestern College.

"Next year I am hoping to find a location to teach early childhood music classes, and increase the amount of students who can come during the daytime – this means students who homeschooled, or adults who have always wanted to play and their own children are in school, or they are retired," she said.

As a child, Andrea took piano lessons from a woman in her community. Her grandmother would come over once a week to help her with her pieces for lessons. In high school, Andrea started playing piano at church while her grandmother played the organ.

"We often would not receive the hymns until Sunday morning, so I had to learn how to sight read accurately," Andrea said. "We would also prepare piano/organ duets for preludes and offertories."

Reflection: Matthew tells us that the apostles now recognize Jesus in his risen life and they worship him. Jesus drew near to them, having formed them as his disciples. He now sends to make disciples of all nations. They are to baptize people in a way that they will be seen as children of God. The trinity describes an experience of the one, true God who creates, liberates and makes holy. Into this God, we are plunged by our Baptism.




