

FROM THE PASTORS Happy New Year! Six Months at St. Mary's for Frs. Evans and Hagan

What a joy for Fr. Evans and I to celebrate our first Christmas and New Year here at St. Mary's, Lowertown. With all of the hard work, learning curve, personal adjustments and even occasional bewilderment that comes with moving as pastor to a new parish, we can say unreservedly that it has been a joy to serve you all this past half-year. We look forward with great hope to the next six months as we continue to work for a revitalized St. Mary's while continuing our personal and pastoral "settling in."

We'd like to begin by expressing our profound gratitude to the staff, trustees, volunteers, and Finance and Parish Council members, who have continued with diligence their usual responsibilities throughout this time of transition while being so very helpful to and patient with us as we learn the ins-and-outs of the parish and seek to establish a new mode of life and work while continuing to develop our community life in the aspiring Oratory of St. Philip Neri. We are especially thankful to our Business Administrator, Debby Heymans, who announced to us about six weeks ago her plans to take retirement after over twenty-seven years of dedicated-even heroic!-service to St. Mary's. Debby will complete her employment at the parish on March 31st. One doesn't simply "replace" someone like Debby, who has been more than just an employee but a beloved friend and support to all at St. Mary's and a true co-worker in this little corner of the Lord's field in Lowertown. Not to mention that over the years she has aggregated such various and disparate tasks into her office that it would take a small army to cover her workload! Fortunately, in Lighthouse Strategic Services of Faribault MN (LSS) this is just what we've done. LSS works with numerous Catholic parishes in the Archdiocese, offering economy of scale in their eight-person office to provide top-level accounting, business administration, and other financial services at a most-affordable fee. In addition to adding LSS to our admin roster we will be hiring a new office manager to work the front desk, sacramental records, and day-to-day tasks on-site at the parish. Pray the Lord send us the right person.

Fr. Evans and I, in consultation with the parish councils and trustees, are working in other ways to shore up various additional areas of parish infrastructure which will prepare St. Mary's for a renewed apostolate in the decades to come. Stay tuned for more updates on these plans in the coming weeks.

We would also like to offer our warm appreciation for the music staff: Mary Ann Zabinski (organist), and also Emma Arachtingi our new (since September) Lead Cantor and schola director for the 1030am Sunday Mass, whose talents were especially on display during Advent and Christmas. We look forward to bringing the St. Mary's Schola back to full strength during Lent and Easter.
