

#### FROM THE PASTORS

The Conversion of St. Paul and a New Bishop

This past Tuesday the whole of this local Church of the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis celebrated the ordination of our new Auxiliary Bishop, Joseph Williams, As Fr. Williams he has served the Archdiocese for well over twenty years as a faithful priest and pastor, and the fruit of his ministry has been a matter of local renown for some time. Bishop Williams is a humble worker in the field of the Lord, who has received the devout formation in the Catholic faith given to him in childhood by his Stillwater, MN family and parish and allowed that faith to be blown into a strong maturity by the Holy Spirit. In times of trouble and social tension it is an extra-special blessing for the Church to welcome such a good and faithful leader into the episcopacy. Let us join together in thanking the Lord, for his providence never ends, never relents, and comes to us in ways ever salutary for our spiritual sustenance. Let us pray also in these early days for Bishop Williams as he takes on the herculean task of assisting Archbishop Hebda in the governance and sanctification of all in the Archdiocese.

Bishop Williams chose the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul as the day of his episcopal ordination, and rightly did he so choose, for the call to be a priest and bishop comes to a man not as a polite invitation which he can mull over and decline without effect if he wishes, but rather as the very command of the Lord which appears at an unexpected moment to upend a man's life, take hold of his freedom, gifts, and energy, and appropriate them directly for the service of the Church and the evangelization of the world. The nuncio of the Holy Father calls the priest and says to him, "The Holy Father elects you to serve as bishop. Do you accept?" In such a moment the man no doubt feels much as St. Paul did when he met the Lord on the road: at once interrupted in his way of life and overwhelmed with the power of the divine presence in its personal address to him, sensing that this command that comes from Christ himself is the end of a certain sort of freedom and the beginning of another, deeper freedom, in God. It is this way when a man receives his letter from the diocesan bishop calling him from the lay state to holy orders. The man has prepared best he can, but there is no way to practice and prepare adequately for the mission he will receive as a deacon, priest, and certainly as a bishop. For this he requires a special grace. St. Paul received this grace from the Lord, who told him in his moment of deep anguish over his weakness and sense of unsuitability for ministry, "my grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness" (2 Cor 12:9).

Your deacons, priests, and bishops exist not for their own sake, but for you, for the spiritual upbuilding of the Body of Christ. You have, as members of the Baptized, an absolute right to all that the Lord has destined to give you through them, and we priests have the absolute responsibility to remain always open to the Holy Spirit and to give you what he gives to us, to do what he commands us—no more and no less. In this is ever our joy and our freedom. But we need your prayers so that as "unprofitable, unworthy servants" we may be the spiritual profit to you which is our sole reason for being and which shows the infinite worth of Christ. Let us pray then for one another as we go forward together in faith, hope, and love during this new year.
