From the "Associate's" Press

Today we are beginning our year long journey through the Gospel of Luke in year C of the Lectionary for Sunday Masses. In the opening prologue to his Gospel, St. Luke speaks of the historical accuracy which he strives for in his writing "so that you may realize the certainty of the teachings you have received". His main concern is that his sources be "eyewitnesses" to the events in the life of Christ and His Church. This eyewitness testimony is a great reminder to us that our faith is not based on clever myths or cool stories (c.f. 2 Peter 1:16) but on the actual encounter of Jesus coming and living in the midst our world.

However, greater still is the reality of our Faith which is not bound to one particular time but endures to our own day. The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that "the Christian faith is not a "religion of the book." Christianity is the religion of the "Word" of God, a word which is "not a written and mute word, but the Word which is incarnate and living". If the Scriptures are not to remain a dead letter, Christ, the eternal Word of the living God, must, through the Holy Spirit, "open our minds to understand the Scriptures."" (CCC 108).

With this in mind, I encourage each of you to read through the entire Gospel of Luke at home so that his words might be more familiar when they are heard at Mass. Before any reading of Scripture, you should always say a short prayer to the Holy Spirit to give you Wisdom and Understanding that the Word might be living and effective within you. What we have received as sure fact from eyewitness testimony endures to our day and continually challenges us in our own historical time and place.

This is an excellent volunteer opportunity for someone, usually one of our Extraordinary Eucharistic Ministers to the Homebound, to help make sure that our parishioners who cannot get to Mass are able to receive their Sacraments. This person is the point of contact between any homebound parishioners who need Communion brought to them on a regular basis, our homebound Eucharistic Ministers, and our pastor. They also arrange for the priests to do home visits to everyone periodically throughout the year. Volunteers Needed

As a parish family, we are all called to not only come to Masses, but to share our time, talent, and treasure to enable our parish to minister to our people. Often times, a select few volunteers take on so many roles because we don't have enough volunteers to go around. We have some roles at St. Mary's Parish to be filled that are easy opportunities for someone to help our parish with minimal commitment. These are once a month commitments that only require you to arrive early for Mass.

We are in need of four to five volunteers to take on the role of sacristan for the 4:00pm Saturday Masses. The sacristan arrives at church about a hour before Mass, unlocks the doors, and sets up for Mass. This would be a once a month commitment. When your scheduled day doesn't work for you, other sacristans will usually either switch or cover for you. Training is provided.

We are also in need of Rosary leaders for the 9:00am Sunday Mass at St. Mary's. This would be a once a month commitment. The leader arrives at the church a half hour before Mass and prays the rosary out loud for everyone there to join. 
January is National Slavery and Human Trafficking **Prevention Month.**




