The Hour of Mercy

At three o'clock, implore My mercy, especially for sinners; and, if only for a brief moment, immerse yourself in My Passion, particularly in My abandonment at the moment of agony. This is the hour of great mercy ... In this hour I will refuse nothing to the soul that makes a request of Me in virtue of My Passion. (St. Faustina - Diary, 1320)

At 3pm on Good Friday, our Lord Jesus died on the wood of the cross to forgive us our sins. That hour ever since has been sanctified and has become known as the hour of mercy. While always a part of the tradition of the Church, the theme of Divine Mercy has been emphasized in our own time, especially through the revelations of Jesus as recounted by St. Faustina Kowalska. Where sin abounds, Grace abounds all the more. It was Pope John Paul II who dedicated the second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday. The Image of Divine Mercy which we venerate today has the two rays of red and blue shining from the heart of Jesus. These rays remind us of the blood and water which poured forth from the pierced heart of Jesus as a fountain of mercy for the forgiveness of our sins.

Today it is possible to obtain the indulgence attached to devotions in honor of Divine Mercy. Today many people are unaware and do not take advantage of the great spiritual riches the Church offers in the form of indulgences. The Catechism defines an indulgence as a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven... (n.1471).

To obtain the indulgence offered today the faithful must make a sacramental confession (typically within 8 days before or after), receive Holy Communion, and pray for the intentions of Pope Francis.

In addition to the above requirements: "the faithful who, on the Second Sunday of Easter or Divine Mercy Sunday, in any church or chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy, or who, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or reserved in

Latin Mass with Procession and Blessing of Fields

Monday, April 25th at 8:30am at Holy Rosary in Lima. Throughout the tradition of the Church, April 25th came to be known as the day of "Major Rogation". This tradition has its roots from the time of St. Gregory the Great (~590AD) when he led a procession through the streets of Rome while asking God to end the plague that was devastating the city at that time. Tradition holds that as he was ending his procession he saw a vision of St. Michael the Archangel sheathing his sword, symbolizing that the plague was over. A statue of St. Michael sheathing his sword can still be seen today atop Castel Sant'Angelo in Rome.

The word "rogation" has its origins in the Latin word "rogare", which means to supplicate or ask, and the purpose of the Day of Rogation is to beg God for His mercy. to turn away His anger, and to ask Him to bless the fruits of the earth while protecting us from natural disasters. The procession, which will follow after the Mass, includes the blessing of the fields and the reading of the Gospel while reciting the Litany of the Saints.
