GOSPEL MEDITATION

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

May 9, 2021, 6th Sunday of Easter

"Remain in my love," and, "I call you friends," are powerful words that are found in John's Gospel. Most of us probably have them committed to memory or have at least heard them proclaimed dozens of times. They are words that can easily become trite and quickly glossed over without fully pondering and digesting their profound beauty. When we take the time to immerse ourselves in them, they can radically change our lives and our relationships. They can open up new doors of adventure and hold countless possibilities for meaning. The essence of love and friendship are things that can easily be taken for granted. They have always been there and are a significant part of our lives. Many would say that they could not live without love and friendship, and they put a great deal of care into preserving, deepening and sustaining them. Love and friendship share a mutual relationship with each other that deserves more reflection.

Where does love come from? We can consider relationships that have not succeeded and conclude that they were somehow due to our "failures in love." In doing so, we assume that human beings are the ones responsible for love, its success and also its failure. While our weakness, emotional composition and sinfulness can easily impact our ability to love, its origin is not human. God is love. God is love's author and origin. When we love, it is God who loves in and through us. It is because of this divine closeness that Jesus is able to call us friends! It is not because of anything we have done but simply because of who we are. Realizing and contemplating this awesome reality becomes a game changer across the board. It gives us reason to clear the table of anything that can adversely affect the way we love so that we can open the door for its author to shine forth.

Coming upon this truth is what leads folks like St. Francis of Assisi to leave that which is comfortable and worldly and live a radical life. They relate with the love of God that radiates in and through all living things and appreciate their sacredness. It was having an intimate experience of God's love and friendship that propelled St. Francis and others to embrace simplicity, act nonviolently, pursue humility, love enemies, care for the earth and open up avenues for true justice. Understanding this profound truth will also help us find peaceful solutions to world's problems, restore relationships with our sisters and brothers, bring the grace of loving stewardship to creation and heal many wounds. Once we begin to see how wonderfully holy all of life really is, we discover joy. We lose our need for fear, develop a fierce fortitude, act prudently and seek justice. There is great power in love because it comes from God. It will never fail. It also enjoys the company of two other friends who are eager to become our friends as well: faith and hope. These are just as important to have and to share.

To be considered for a scholarship for the (2021-2022) school year **NEW** applicants will need to complete an endowment scholarship application. **ALL** new applicants and previous recipients must provide proof of **acceptance from a regionally accredited college** or proof of **enrollment in next semester courses** if currently attending college; proof of an **official certified transcript** showing that an **unweighted GPA of 2.5** has been maintained in the prior school year (if new applicant), or in the prior college semester (if previous recipient); and an **original letter dated and submitted by the applicant** stating why they feel they are in need of this scholarship. In addition, the parents/guardians/student must be an All Saints **tithing member for at least the 12 months prior to application** (tithing requirement does not apply to the benefactor's relatives or to graduate student seminarians). The applicant must have begun their course of study no later than the beginning of the Fall semester in the year of their 20th birthday and terminate no later than the end of the Spring semester in the year of their 24th birthday. All of the above is required and will be reviewed by the Scholarship Committee **per the terms and conditions of the last will and testament of Nick R. Zagar**. Award amounts will vary in any given year due to funds available. Failure to complete the application in its entirety, failure to provide all documentation that shows the scholarship requirements have been met, and failure to comply with the deadline will automatically disqualify a student for a scholarship award. REGATHERING GUIDELINES

All Saints Parishioners:

Per the Diocese and All Saints Regathering Guidelines – Weekday Masses are at 8:00 AM on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday; Saturday Mass is at 4:00 PM; and Sunday Mass is at 9:00 AM. These Mass times and the guidelines below are subject to change and will be in effect as we continue in Phase 3, or until an escalation of the COVID-19 outbreak warrants a return to the state of all public Masses being suspended. Following are the guidelines:

1. Participating at Mass is a health risk for any individual. For those who do not attend Mass during this time God's infinite grace and mercy remain abundantly available.
2. Parishioners should be reminded often that the Sunday obligation remains suspended, and that vulnerable individuals, individuals who live with vulnerable individuals, and those who are ill or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19 like symptoms should not attend Mass. For now, livestreaming will still be made available.
3. Parishioners are encouraged to cultivate an occasional presence when attending Mass, and not a daily presence. This is an act of charity toward others, as it can allow more people to participate in weekday Mass and better serves the common good.
4. Parishioners should only attend Mass at their own parish. Traveling to neighboring parishes creates a greater health risk for all and hinders the Diocese in its efforts to make the sacraments publicly available in the safest way possible.
5. Social distancing must be maintained throughout the Mass. This includes a six feet social distance between one family/household unit and another.
6. Parishioners are encouraged to enter and exit the parish in a staggered fashion, to avoid a bottleneck or congregating before or after Mass.
7. During the reception of Holy Communion, a single communion line should be formed with at least six feet of distance between family units, including when leaving the pews. Holy Communion will only be received on the hand and not on the tongue. When approaching Holy Communion, parishioners are to bow, after responding with the usual "Amen", place their hands out in the usual manner to receive the Host, step to the side, pull their mask down, place the Host in their mouth, and pull the mask back up. The consecrated Host must NOT be taken back to the pew to be consumed. Distribution from the chalice of wine to the assembly is absolutely forbidden.
8. Parishioners are encouraged to take their temperature and should not be ill before travelling to Mass. When attending Mass, parishioners over the age of five, who do not have a medical or psychological condition prohibiting mask use, are required to wear a mask during Mass and while in the building.
9. Offertory collections during Mass will resume. Also, the use of the lockbox outside the gathering space door will be made available for parishioners' offerings as well.
10. No bulletins will be handed out after Mass. Bulletins are available on the tables by each church entrance and on the All Saints website. No one should accept materials from others at any time.
11. Hand sanitizers will be provided at each entrance. Parishioners are expected to use it before entering Mass.
12. Holy water fonts will remain empty until after the Easter Vigil.
13. All hymnals have been removed from all pews.
14. No one should shake hands, exchange hugs, or in any way make physical contact with each other. There are to be no social gatherings whatsoever after Mass.
15. The church, gathering space, and restrooms will be cleaned and disinfected routinely using directives provided by the Diocese via CDC guidelines.

DIOCESAN PROTOCOL ADJUSTMENT EFFECTIVE MAY 15, 2021

Per the Diocese, beginning on May 15, 2021, some COVID restrictions have been lifted, such as there is no longer a requirement of 100 person attendance cap for social gatherings. Instead, parishes will be able to accommodate the number of people they can properly social distance between households or tables in any parish space. It is important to note that this does not mean 100% capacity, instead parishes are responsible for establishing their own attendance caps.

Additionally, parishes must remain attentive to other diocesan COVID protocols, such as masks and social distancing are still in effect, and that all events during the pandemic are conditional based on the public health situation. Parishioners should be informed that if the public health situation deteriorates, events may need to be cancelled or further mitigation efforts may need to be taken. This change has been approved by Bishop Joensen and was made in consultation with local medical experts, and in discernment with the regathering team. If anyone at All Saints would want to use the parish facilities, it must be approved by Fr. Harris.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL CONFERENCE

Our All Saints Parish St. Vincent de Paul (SVdP) group, called a Conference, is made up of parishioners who are trying to "live their faith" by providing person-to-person assistance to those in need in our parish as well as in the greater community. We are one of about 12 parishes in the Des Moines area with a St. Vincent de Paul Conference. We are organized under the umbrella of the Des Moines Council of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, which is part of a worldwide network of charity, which includes over 150 countries. Our National HQ is in St. Louis and the International HQ is in Paris, France.

Locally our Des Moines Council operates two locations: 1426 6th Avenue, and 520 Army Post Road, in Des Moines. Both locations have thrift stores, donations centers, food and clothing pantries, and a variety of other services including an education center. The Council also hosts a number of support programs such as workforce development skills, a BACK 2 WORK Program, an IMMERSION Re-entry support program, and offers in-person and/or virtual courses or personal assistance in healthy relationships, financial literacy, resume development and job search, and other areas as needed. These operations and programs provide many opportunities for our members to lend a "hand UP" as a volunteer in areas that may be of interest to them.

Clothing, furniture and household goods donations are always welcome, as the revenue from the sale of these items at our thrift stores directly support our operations and our supportive programs. Your donation of volunteer time as well as financial support is always valued and appreciated.
