GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

June 13, 2021, 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time

A favorite motto of St. Teresa of Calcutta was, "do small things with great love." This is how it works in the kingdom of God. God can do tremendous things with the smallest gesture, especially when it is done in love. We can clearly see that our world is suffering greatly. People are struggling to find peace, navigate through conflicts, earn a sustainable living, find security and enough food to eat, and work through political tensions and conflicts. In the light of the magnitude of the difficulties that exist around us and even within us, we can find ourselves floundering to discover practical, effective solutions. How can something so large be helped by someone as small and seemingly insignificant as me? While whole systems and structures may be out of the league of our personal influence, are we really that helpless in the midst of all of the turmoil, sadness, and suffering?

If we believe that God is with us and that God is still working to bring about the glory of God's kingdom, then the answer is no. We are never helpless or without hope. Armed with a strong life of prayer, we can always flee to God and ask for inspiration, wisdom, and especially love. We are all blessed with unique gifts and talents and it often seems that considering all that the world lacks, love and charity remain at the top of the list. Life can easily become a battleground of hostility. Because life is challenging and difficult, anger is not far away. We see it on people's faces and hear it in their voices. There is a measure of frustration that permeates all avenues of life. It is even felt in the air.

As people of faith, we know that what we see here is not the end but only a part of something far greater to come. We know that God's kingdom is where we are ultimately meant to be, and the Gospel is the way to get there. If love and charity can prevail in us, then God will be able to do what God does best. God will use us to scatter the seeds of his kingdom. Through our small gestures, those seeds can receive the nurturing attention that is necessary for them to bear great fruit. We cannot fall victim to the strife that is around us. We have to keep ourselves refreshed and focused so that even in small ways, we can become part of the solution, not the problem. Love and charity, which come from God, can help to heal the ills of the world. May we bring these simple gifts to the very day simple tasks of our lives! Watch how big the plant grows!

To be considered for a scholarship for the **(2021-2022)** school year **NEW** applicants will need to complete an endowment scholarship application. **ALL** new applicants and previous recipients must provide proof of **acceptance from a regionally accredited college** or proof of **enrollment in next semester courses** if currently attending college; proof of an **official certified transcript** showing that an **unweighted GPA of 2.5** has been maintained in the prior school year (if new applicant), or in the prior college semester (if previous recipient); and an **original letter dated and submitted by the applicant** stating why they feel they are in need of this scholarship. In addition, the parents/guardians/student must be an All Saints **tithing member for at least the 12 months prior to application** (tithing requirement does not apply to the benefactor's relatives or to graduate student seminarians). The applicant must have begun their course of study no later than the beginning of the Fall semester in the year of their 20th birthday and terminate no later than the end of the Spring semester in the year of their 24th birthday. All of the above is required and will be reviewed by the Scholarship Committee **per the terms and conditions of the last will and testament of Nick R. Zagar**. Award amounts will vary in any given year due to funds available. Failure to complete the application in its entirety, failure to provide all documentation that shows the scholarship requirements have been met, and failure to comply with the deadline will automatically disqualify a student for a scholarship award. DIOCESAN PROTOCOL ADJUSTMENT EFFECTIVE MAY 14, 2021

Following recently released CDC recommendations, effective May 14, 2021, per the Diocese of Des Moines, we will no longer require masks at liturgies and parish events. Parishioners who are not yet fully vaccinated are strongly encouraged to continue to wear a mask at Mass and other parish activities.

Additionally, the Diocese continues to consult with local medical experts to enact other changes in our mitigation practices that will draw us toward a more normal, yet safe, experience of our communal worship. These changes are a hopeful step in our battle against COVID-19, and yet we should remember that we have not yet fully emerged from this pandemic, and a need for vigilance persists.

Other mitigation practices such as washing hands, staying home when sick, and social distancing when appropriate remain important. As we implement these latest changes, let us all (whether vaccinated or not) show solicitude and charity for each other, so that all members of the Body of Christ feel welcome at the Mass and all parish events.

REGATHERING GUIDELINES

All Saints Parishioners:

Per the Diocese and All Saints Regathering Guidelines – Weekday Masses are at 8:00 AM on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday; Saturday Mass is at 4:00 PM; and Sunday Mass is at 9:00 AM. These Mass times and the guidelines below are subject to change and will be in effect as we continue in phases, or until an escalation of the COVID-19 outbreak warrants a return to the state of all public Masses being suspended. Following are the guidelines:

1. All the faithful remain dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further notice. Vulnerable individuals, individuals who live with vulnerable individuals, and those who are ill or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19 like symptoms should not attend Mass.
2. Livestreaming will still be made available for now.
3. Social distancing must be maintained throughout the Mass. This includes a six feet social distance between one family/household unit and another.
4. Parishioners are encouraged to enter and exit the parish in a staggered fashion, to avoid a bottleneck or congregating before or after Mass.
5. During the reception of Holy Communion, a single communion line should be formed with at least six feet of distance between family units, including when leaving the pews. Holy Communion will only be received on the hand and not on the tongue. When approaching Holy Communion, parishioners are to bow, after responding with the usual “Amen”, place their hands out in the usual manner to receive the Host, step to the side, pull their mask down, place the Host in their mouth, and pull the mask back up. The consecrated Host must NOT be taken back to the pew to be consumed. Distribution from the chalice of wine to the assembly is absolutely forbidden.
6. Masks are no longer required at liturgies and parish events. Parishioners who are not yet fully vaccinated are strongly encouraged to continue to wear a mask at Mass and other parish activities.
7. Offertory collections during Mass are resumed. Also, the use of the lockbox outside the gathering space door will be made available for parishioners’ offerings as well.
8. No bulletins will be handed out after Mass. Bulletins are available on the tables by each church entrance and on the All Saints website. No one should accept materials from others at any time.
9. Hand sanitizers will be provided at each entrance. Parishioners are expected to use it before entering Mass.
10. Holy water fonts are now refilled.
11. All hymnals have been removed from all pews for now.
12. No one should shake hands, exchange hugs, or in any way make physical contact with each other outside the family/household unit.
13. The church, gathering space, and restrooms will be cleaned and disinfected routinely using directives provided by the Diocese via CDC guidelines.

THE YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH 2021

How well do you know St. Joseph? Do you feel you understand his greatness and love for you? We have an opportunity to become close to the greatest saint who ever lived. Many remarkable events within the last 150 years are evidence of a growing devotion to St. Joseph within the Church. There are many reasons for this, but perhaps two stand out as significant:

Did You Know?

That St. Joseph is the greatest saint, ever? You might say “What about Mary” and you would have a valid point, except Mary, as the mother of God, is on a higher level than the saints. Only St. Joseph comes close to her holiness.

That All Saints has an altar to St. Joseph? It is on the east (right hand) side of the Nave.

That there are many novenas to St. Joseph to help you grow closer? On St. Joseph’s altar is one developed by the same folks who create the Magnificat. Please take one and pray it together as a family (one book per family please). Help yourselves to a prayer card as well.

St. Joseph was the first human being to adore Christ, every moment of every day. Jesus is asking for more adorers, more St. Josephs to fill our pews with adoration. You can always come to the church during regular business hours to pray in front of the tabernacle, to give adoration to Christ, and devotion to St. Joseph. Deacon Dr. Burdt will lead Adoration and Benediction on the First and Third Wednesdays, which will provide additional opportunities for adoration and devotion.
