## SUNDAY OBLIGATION

Dear Friends in Christ,

This coming July 25th, the Seventeenth Sunday of Ordinary Time, the Sunday and holy day Mass obligation will be restored in the Des Moines Diocese. It was a profoundly sobering decision to suspend public Masses and the Sunday obligation over a year ago, and throughout this pandemic I know we have all longed for a more ordinary rhythm in our life of faith and communal worship. Reinstating the Sunday obligation is an encouraging step forward; it is being taken in response to a much improved public health situation, and the widespread accessibility of effective vaccines against COVID-19.

We have all experienced times when an unchosen period of absence has helped us to more deeply appreciate the many gifts in our lives, and my hope is that the same will be true in our experience of Sunday Eucharist and the obligation that points the way toward shared presence with Jesus and one another. Our society often views obligations as burdens to be endured or obstacles to freedom. A healthier "human ecology" recognizes that obligations can often orient us toward the good, especially if we are mixed in our dispositions toward that good. I hope that the restoration of the Sunday obligation will give us all an opportunity to reflect on the marvelous generosity of the "One who alone is good" (see Mark 10:18), yet whose goodness is instilled in everything in this world in which we live, move, and have our being.

Fundamentally, our participation in communal worship on Sundays and holy days is both an entry into, and an expression of, an intimate personal relationship with Jesus. This intimacy is the transforming experience that gives life "a new horizon and a decisive direction" (Pope Benedict XVI, *Deus caritas est*/God is Love n. 1). We are invited to worship God who has gratuitously given us everything we have, including life itself. Further, the Mass draws us ever more deeply into the communal Body of Christ, the People of God whom Jesus calls and redeems. Our participation in Mass is not a supplemental practice in the life of discipleship; it is the beating heart of faith, the source and summit of our entire Christian life. If you have been away from Mass, whether due to the pandemic or for any other reason, I'd like to personally invite you to join us again at the wellspring of God's love.

While the general dispensation from the obligation will be lifted on July 25th, there will always be cases where individuals are excused or dispensed for serious reasons (see the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* n. 2181). These reasons would include, but are not limited to, personal illness, known or suspected exposure to COVID-19, or if you are a caretaker of a member of the vulnerable population and your participation in Mass would expose him or her to a significant risk of contracting COVID-19. If you are unsure of your situation, please consult with your pastor who can assist you in your discernment.

On July 25<sup>th</sup>, the Gospel at Mass will recount Jesus' feeding the 5,000, and in the following weeks we will hear successive passages from the John 6 account of Jesus' Bread of Life discourse. As we prepare for the reinstatement of the Sunday obligation, please join me in praying for a greater awareness of, and attraction to, Jesus as the Bread of Life. Jesus nourishes and sustains us in all seasons of life. May we grow in our appreciation of Mass, and in our observance of Sunday itself, a day of rest and feasting "which heals our relationships with God, with ourselves, with others and with the world... the pledge of the final transfiguration of all created reality" (Pope Francis, *Laudato Si'*/On Care for Our Common Home n. 237).

Let us continue to pray for Eucharistic Renewal, in our own Diocese and in the world. Please know of my prayers for you and all your loved ones. May you receive the blessing Jesus promises to those who Eucharistic hunger inspires all they do: "Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied" (Matthew 5:6).

# REGATHERING GUIDELINES

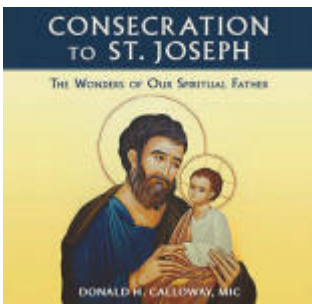
All Saints Parishioners:

Per the Diocese and All Saints Regathering Guidelines – Weekday Masses are at 8:00 AM on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday; Saturday Mass is at 4:00 PM; and Sunday Mass is at 9:00 AM. These Mass times and the guidelines below are subject to change and will be in effect until further notice. Following are the guidelines:

1. Effective 7-25-21, the Sunday and holy day Mass obligation will be restored in the Des Moines Diocese. While the general dispensation from the obligation will be lifted, there will always be cases where individuals are excused or dispensed for serious reasons (see the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* n. 2181). These reasons would include, but are not limited to, personal illness, known or suspected exposure to COVID-19, or if you are a caretaker of a member of the vulnerable population and your participation in Mass would expose him or her to a significant risk of contracting COVID-19.
2. Livestreaming will still be made available for now
3. Social distancing is encouraged throughout the Mass.
4. Parishioners are encouraged to enter and exit the parish in a staggered fashion, to avoid a bottleneck or congregating before or after Mass.
5. During the reception of Holy Communion, a single communion line should be formed adhering to social distancing, and the Host will only be received on the hand and not on the tongue. The consecrated Host must NOT be taken back to the pew to be consumed. Distribution from the chalice of wine to the assembly is absolutely forbidden.
6. Masks are no longer required at liturgies and parish events. Parishioners who are not yet fully vaccinated are strongly encouraged to continue to wear a mask at Mass and other parish activities.
7. Offertory collections during Mass are resumed. Also, the use of the lockbox outside the gathering space door will be made available for parishioners' offerings as well.
8. No bulletins will be handed out after Mass. Bulletins are available on the tables by each church entrance and on the All Saints website. No one should accept materials from others at any time.
9. Hand sanitizers will be provided at each entrance. Parishioners are expected to use it before entering Mass.
10. Holy water fonts are now refilled.
11. Some hymnals are now available for use and return in pews.
12. Shaking hands, exchanging hugs, or in any way making physical contact with each other outside the family/household unit is discouraged.
13. The church, gathering space, and restrooms will be cleaned and disinfected routinely using directives provided by the Diocese via CDC guidelines.

## THE YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH 2021

How well do you know St. Joseph? Do you feel you understand his greatness and love for you? We have an opportunity to become close to the greatest saint who ever lived. Many remarkable events within the last 150 years are evidence of a growing devotion to St. Joseph within the Church. There are many reasons for this, but perhaps two stand out as significant:

First, we need the spiritual fatherhood of St. Joseph to help us protect marriage and the family, which are being attacked at extraordinary levels;

Second, the entire world needs to be re-evangelized, including the vast majority of baptized Christians. St. Joseph was the first missionary; he desires once again to bring Jesus to the nations.

*Now is the time to consecrate ourselves to St. Joseph* – as a Christian community, as Christian families and as individuals. Now is the time to invite St. Joseph into our homes, where along with Mary will be our intercessors in heaven.



### Did You Know?

That St. Joseph is the greatest saint, ever? You might say “What about Mary” and you would have a valid point, except Mary, as the mother of God, is on a higher level than the saints. Only St. Joseph comes close to her holiness.

That All Saints has an altar to St. Joseph? It is on the east (right hand) side of the Nave.

That there are many novenas to St. Joseph to help you grow closer? On St. Joseph’s altar is one developed by the same folks who create the Magnificat. Please take one and pray it together as a family (one book per family please). Help yourselves to a prayer card as well.

St. Joseph was the first human being to adore Christ, every moment of every day. Jesus is asking for more adorers, more St. Josephs to fill our pews with adoration. You can always come to the church during regular business hours to pray in front of the tabernacle, to give adoration to Christ, and devotion to St. Joseph. Deacon Dr. Burdt will lead Adoration and Benediction on the First and Third Wednesdays from 7:00 pm - 8:00 pm, which will provide additional opportunities for adoration and devotion.
