# How Green Are Your Branches?

I would like to wish each and every one of our All Saints parishioners and our visitors a very Merry Christmas! We have been so very blessed this past year even if we cannot, yet, recognize every blessing for what it is. This Advent season has certainly been a busy one, but as we enter the celebration of Christmas I cannot help but think about the steadfast love, hope, and joy that Jesus brings to us every time we receive him at Mass.

I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing. (John 15:5)

In the song "O' Christmas Tree" the lyricist, Ernst Anschutz, wrote: O Christmas tree, O' Christmas tree, how lovely are your branches! Not only in summer's heat, but also winter's snow and sleet. O' Christmas tree, O' Christmas tree how lovely are your branches!

As we all know... evergreen trees, those most commonly used as Christmas trees, got their name because they keep their foliage all year round. Something you might not know is that one of the reasons their leaves stay green even in harsh conditions is because they do not require a great deal of nutrients. Evergreens do not use as much energy as other deciduous trees because they do not grow all of their leaves at one time. Their leaves also help insulate the tree from frost and the dead leaves, once fallen, act as a natural mulch to protect the tree's roots.

#### But the song goes on in the third verse:

O' Christmas tree, O' Christmas tree, we learn from all your beauty. Your bright green leaves with festive cheer, Give hope and strength throughout the year. O Christmas tree, O' Christmas tree we learn from all your beauty.

What does all of this have to do with us? Well if we head back into the Gospel of John we will find that Jesus reveals himself as the true vine. He says:

Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing. (John 15:1-5)

Christ is eternal. Christ is our hope and our strength. And it is only through him that we are nourished and bear fruit. He is the mighty evergreen... and we are his branches. When we obey the Father, follow the Son, and listen to the Holy Spirit by living our lives according to His will and not our own we bear much fruit. # **REGATHERING GUIDELINES**

### All Saints Parishioners:

Per the Diocese and All Saints Regathering Guidelines – Weekday Masses are at 8:00 AM on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday; Saturday Mass is at 4:00 PM; and Sunday Mass is at 9:00 AM. These Mass times and the guidelines below are subject to change and will be in effect until further notice. Following are the guidelines:

- Effective 7-25-21, the Sunday and holy day Mass obligation will be restored in the Des Moines Diocese. While the general dispensation from the obligation will be lifted, there will always be cases where individuals are excused or dispensed for serious reasons (see the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* n. 2181). These reasons would include, but are not limited to, personal illness, known or suspected exposure to COVID-19, or if you are a caretaker of a member of the vulnerable population and your participation in Mass would expose him or her to a significant risk of contracting COVID-19.
- 2. Livestreaming will still be made available for now
- 3. Social distancing is encouraged throughout the Mass.
- 4. Parishioners are encouraged to enter and exit the parish in a staggered fashion, to avoid a bottleneck or congregating before or after Mass.
- 5. During the reception of Holy Communion, a single communion line should be formed adhering to social distancing, and the Host will only be received on the hand and not on the tongue. The consecrated Host must NOT be taken back to the pew to be consumed. Distribution from the chalice of wine to the assembly is absolutely forbidden.
- 6. Masks are no longer required at liturgies and parish events. Parishioners who are not yet fully vaccinated are strongly encouraged to continue to wear a mask at Mass and other parish activities.
- 7. Offertory collections during Mass are resumed. Also, the use of the lockbox outside the gathering space door will be made available for parishioners' offerings as well.
- 8. No bulletins will be handed out after Mass. Bulletins are available on the tables by each church entrance and on the All Saints website. No one should accept materials from others at any time.
- 9. Hand sanitizers will be provided at each entrance. Parishioners are expected to use it before entering Mass.
- 10. Holy water fonts are now refilled.
- 11. Some hymnals are now available for use and return in pews.
- 12. Shaking hands, exchanging hugs, or in any way making physical contact with each other outside the family/ household unit is discouraged.
- 13. The church, gathering space, and restrooms will be cleaned and disinfected routinely using directives provided by the Diocese via CDC guidelines.

# **MASK GUIDELINE**

Due to the current increase in COVID-19 cases and the new CDC guidance and advice of local medical consultants, effective August 14, 2021 the Diocese is now <u>recommending</u>, not requiring, wearing of masks for parishioners over the age of five during all indoor liturgies and other indoor parish events. Additionally, masks will be <u>required</u> for all clergy and Eucharistic Ministers of Holy Communion during the distribution of communion.
