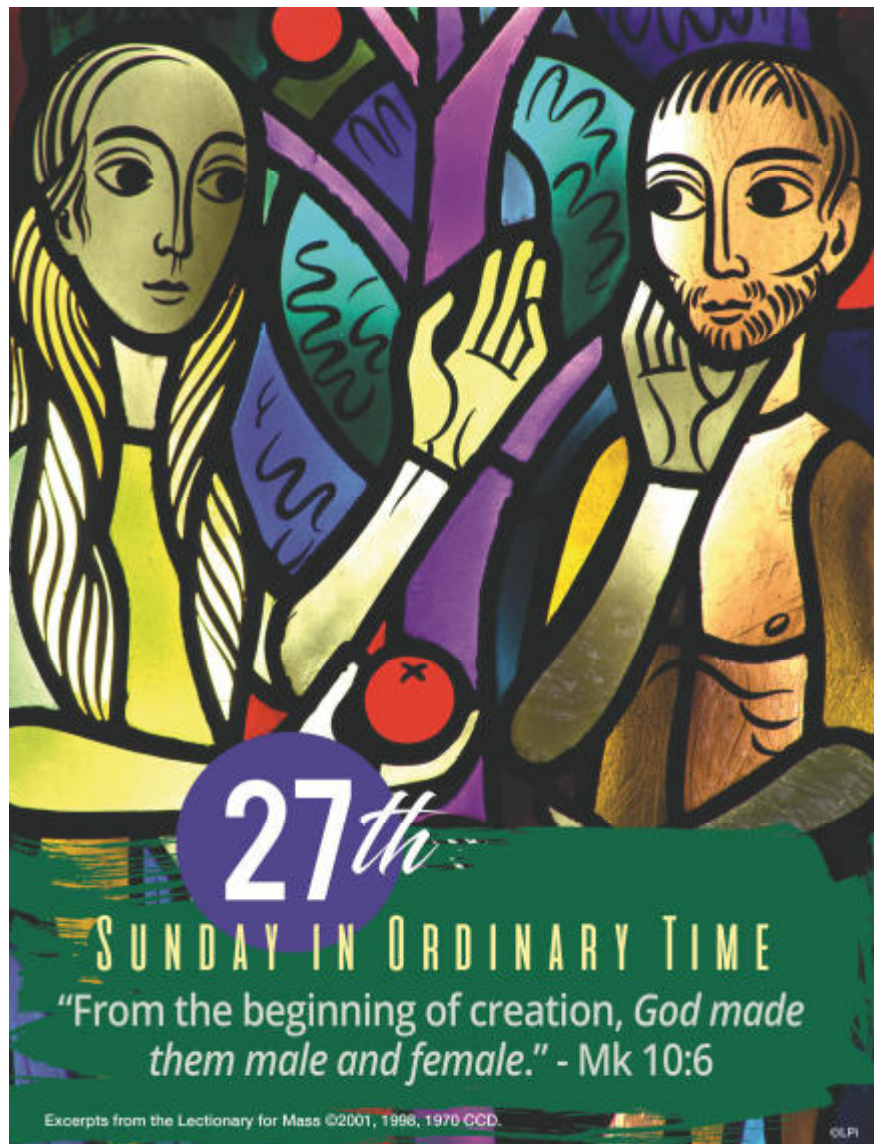

Pop Tabs - A JP II Tradition

Many of you know that third graders at JP II collect pop tabs for Ronald McDonald House, a 'home away from home,' for families of sick children needing care at Children's Mercy Hospital. If you didn't know, now you do! Kansas City currently has 3 houses for parents from out of town to stay free of charge while their child is in the hospital. This third grade service project is two-fold. Not only does our school community help a very deserving charity, but third grade students count every one of those pop tabs! At various times throughout the school year, third graders are learning about place value, estimation, and big numbers as they put tabs in piles of 10's, then 100's. Students also practice adding fluently when they add up the total counted.

In the spring, third graders have more real world math when they weigh all the pop tabs and put them in bags of 20 lbs. for collection by the Ronald McDonald House team. The pop tab caravan with the semi-truck full of pop tabs from schools all over the Kansas City area pulls into JP II school parking lot on collection day. Sometimes Ronald McDonald himself comes to our school.

Third graders are asking you to please help 'shelter the homeless' by saving pop tabs to benefit Ronald McDonald House. Please save your pop tabs from drinks and other cans in whatever container you would like to use. Many families use zipper lock bags. When your container is full, send it to school with a student, and it will make its way to the third grade classroom. Then start all over! Ask aunts, uncles, grandmas and grandpas, cousins, and friends down the street to join us. The more we have, the more we serve others. Watch this newsletter or your email for the final date in the spring to send your pop tabs to school, but don't stop then. Please collect all summer long for the next school year. Thank you!!
