

A Message from Father David

Happy news for me. I am going to be able to go to LA for a retreat at my favorite place in the world, the Sacred Heart Retreat Center run by the Carmelite Sisters. Because of COVID I have not been able to go on retreat for over 2 years. It is sorely needed. I leave on February 14th and return on the 24th. I am planning on doing an 8-day Ignatius retreat while I am there and go up to the Observatory and the Hollywood Sign and maybe Balboa Park and the Beach once. I'm excited. I will be back in time for the start of Lent.

I want to thank all who helped with the recent vigil and funerals for the two young men who recently were involved in that tragic snowmobile accident. We had to confront an increase in numbers attending these services so more "hands-on-deck" were required and I thank you for doing that. Please continue to pray for the families of Westin and Isaac and the repose of their souls.

The spear-fishing season is a bust. I've told the story to a few about the interesting time I had helping to get a portable spear-house off the slushy lake. We had it on the lake for 6 days before we realized that it had to come off. Taking my four-wheeler at a certain point through foot thick slush was scary and exhilarating at the same time. In the end there's nothing like surviving certain peril. When I first drove on to the lake it was like "this is it" and when I drove off it was like "that is that." Be safe out there; the ice is crazy everywhere. Where there's slush there's danger.

May 24 is a Tuesday and Bishop Daniel will be here to confirm our students currently being made ready for this great sacrament. The Confirmation is at 7pm and it is open to all parishioners. I will be trying to get the Bishop to make a pastoral visit before 5/24/22 to Aitkin and McGregor. He has been visiting parishes since his ordination as the Bishop of Duluth.

Finally I wanted to say how proud I am of you for continuing to support the Rainy Day Fund. Recently we have made two donations, one to a private family (not Catholic) who has suffered some major financial issues from a case of COVID in the family and the other donation was to help a company who assists with the elderly and vulnerable. This local company receives clients who sometimes come with nothing but the clothes on their back. We are helping with the essentials for them like towels and washcloths, clothes and toiletries, bath-maps and light bulbs. All because of your generosity. We still have over \$6,500.00 in the fund even after these two donations. Please continue to give. We were later told by the person asking for donations for the COVID case that none of the other churches (she asked all the churches in town) gave money for this family saying simply that their churches don't give money in this way. In the end (as far as I know) only the Catholic Church gave money to feed this family and help pay their bills, to keep their heads above water. Honestly I was a little shocked by this report because of the Gospel and Jesus' love for the poor. Also the maxim that "you can't outgive God." Tithing creates wealth. Now there are two sides to every story and maybe these churches will take up a second collection or they just don't have it in the budget (for now). I do wonder though and pray that it is not indicative of something more insidious and misaligned within Christian Churches.

GOSPEL MEDITATION -January 16, 2022 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

God delights in you. How do you feel when you hear that? Delight usually comes with an exuberant flow of joy that seemingly arises from one's toes with the expression of great glee. Reflecting upon the deep measure of joy God has in us can be a source of joy for ourselves. Delight is infectious. A very young brother and sister were playing on the beach when the all too familiar ice cream truck made its daily rounds. The boy shook with excitement and delight as he took his sister's hand and exclaimed, "The ice cream man is here, isn't it great!" As they ran off toward the truck, one could hear the girl reply, "Yeah, I can't wait!" The experience of a child's delight in something so simple as ice cream, lifts our spirits from our burdens and transports us to the lighter, more innocent side of life.

Life is not meant to be a burden. Believe it or not, God actually wants us to be happy! In fact, the wedding feast at Cana shows us that God even puts His blessing on our happiness. It is okay to celebrate the wonder of ourselves and others. Life is good. It is always interesting to note that Jesus saves the good wine until last.

You would think it would be the other way around. The superb quality of Jesus' wine points to the superior quality of life we find in Christ. It is not a life of burdens but a life of wonder and delight! In Christ, we are lifted from the superficial and mundane to a life of purpose, hope, and love.

God is with us through the long haul, through the challenges and sorrows as well as the successes and accomplishments. In spite of the fact that we often wander from the path, God's celebratory delight in us remains. 


