

Mass Roots - Incense

Well, our in-depth journey through the parts of the Mass is already halfway complete! Before we move from the Liturgy of the Word to the Liturgy of the Eucharist, let's pause today and explore an element occasionally found in both portions of the Mass – incense.

First of all, what *is* incense? If you've ever noticed the priest, deacon, or server swinging a chain connected to an ornate metal container with holes in the top, this is what we call a **thurible or censer**. Inside, charcoal is lit and incense sprinkled on top, releasing not just smoke, but a sweet-smelling aroma! This is due to the composition of the incense, which most commonly consists of frankincense or myrrh. Sound familiar? The gifts of the three kings! They are actually resin from trees, and are valuable precisely because of their sweet scents as well as medicinal qualities.

So how did this smelly tree substance come to be associated with the Mass? We can actually go all the way back to the Old Testament and find Moses and the Israelites using incense for worship! Here and many other places, incense is associated with purification and **sanctification**. We hear in the book of Psalms: "Let my *prayer come like incense before you . . .*" The smoke from the incense is a visible symbol of our otherwise invisible **prayers** rising to heaven! St. John the Apostle speaks of incense similarly in his visions of heaven in the book of Revelation: "Another angel came and stood at the altar with a golden censer . . . and the smoke of the incense rose with

the prayers of the saints from the hand of the angel before God."

If the angels in heaven use incense to worship the Lord, it only makes



sense that we do the same! The Mass is precisely where heaven and earth meet; where we join the communion of saints in the absolute highest form of prayer here on earth. So next time we smell that sweet scent as the altar, book of the Gospels. offertory gifts, or we ourselves are incensed, let us be reminded of the presence of the angels and saints worshiping among us. As we watch the smoke rise, let us enter deeper into worship and remember the sanctifying power of prayer communing with the Lord, the Word made flesh in a manger so many years ago, whom we are destined to worship for all eternity!
