# **Celebrating Catholic Schools Week!**

Happy Catholic Schools Week! I was asked to share about our very own Catholic school and while I could fill the page with data that states that Catholic school students nationally score higher on achievement tests, or that graduates of Catholic schools are less likely to divorce and that they statistically have a 99.3% high school graduation rate, I've decided to share an experience I had recently in one of our Atrium classrooms.

A little background first: The motto of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd in the Atrium is: "Help me fall in love with God by myself."

In this program, the image of Christ as the Good Shepherd, who loves his sheep and gives everything He is for them, forms the center of the young child's relationship with God. The Good Shepherd knows His sheep and calls them by their name. The child comes to discover who the Shepherd is and who they are – His children.

In the midst of this blossoming relationship, these same children are exposed to small, isolated items and "moments" of the Mass. They hold a small chalice, learn to name each of the vestments that the priest wears, and wonder at what occurs at specific moments of the liturgy. Their relationship with the Good Shepherd is nurtured in such a way that they are preparing to live the fullness of the life of the Catholic Church through the liturgy and the sacraments.

We are very blessed that our children can learn about the Good Shepherd and His gift of the Eucharist, and they will be able



to immediately apply this knowledge by joining our parish around the table of Our Lord! We have great trust in the grace that these children have received at their Baptism, and are excited to show them that this Catholic faith we share is truly one not just for adults but for all. As our Lord Jesus said, "Let the children come to me."

In the Atrium recently, a Catechist was showing the material on the shepherd's adoration of Jesus. The Catechist asked a 3 year old if she thought the shepherds said anything to Jesus as he lay in the manger. The child shook her head no. After a few minutes of pondering, the 3 year old said, "They just looked at the baby Jesus and they saw that He was good." AH! What a beautiful thought! It is so wonderful to see how the Atrium enables these young children to personally encounter Christ. *Continued on Page 5.*

# **Mass Roots – The Eucharistic Prayer**

It's easy to diminish the Eucharistic Prayer to a super long prayer during which we stand and kneel, stand, and kneel again. But this is the crux of not only the Mass, but the *source and summit of Christian life* itself! Though we learned about the Eucharistic Prayer at length on the Feast of Corpus Christi, it's worth repeating again today:

Every Eucharistic Prayer begins with the **Preface**. This starts after the altar is prepared and we stand to "lift up our hearts to the Lord!", and continues through the singing of the "Holy, Holy, Holy," after which we kneel.

Next is the **Anaphora**, which is broken down into six parts:

1) The **epiclesis**, during which the Holy Spirit is invoked to make Jesus present in the gifts of bread and wine.

2) The **Institution Narrative**, during which the priest restates Jesus' words at the last supper. However, the priest isn't retelling the story *to us*. Rather, this prayer is *addressed to God!* Here, as throughout the rest of the Mass, w*e make the priest's prayer our own* as we participate in the Mass together.

3) The **anamnesis**, or memorial prayer, during which our calling to mind of Jesus' actions at the Last Supper and on the Cross *make that historical*  *moment truly present again*, hence why we call Mass a "sacrifice." Jesus, of course, isn't being crucified again, but the moment comes to life in a way that is just as real as the day it happened long ago!

4) The **oblation** is when we offer this very sacrifice, Jesus truly present, to the Father. We, by uniting ourselves to Christ, also offer our own selves at this time.

5) The **intercessions** express that "the Eucharist is celebrated in communion with the *whole* Church, of both *heaven and of earth*, and that the oblation is made for her and for *all her members, living and dead,* who are called to participate in the redemption and salvation purchased by the Body and Blood of Christ" (USCCB).

6) Finally, the **doxology**: "through him, with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours almighty Father, forever and ever, amen." This is a moment of uniting ourselves, through the Holy Spirit, to Jesus' *perfect worship* of God the Father!

So there you have it! Pay extra attention to the Eucharistic Prayer next time you're at Mass, striving to enter more deeply into this ancient, holiest prayer of the Church.
