PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Priests' Retreat

Since due to the Pandemic the annual priest's retreat was canceled. I am doing a personal retreat for 2020. I will be gone October 5th to the 9th. If any emergencies occur, kindly call to cluster office or Deacon Mike Ryan.

The common theme of this weekend readings is the necessity of bearing fruit in Christian life and the punishment for sterility and wickedness. *"I expected my vineyard to yield good grapes. Why did it yield sour ones instead?"* God's chosen people failed to bear fruit in spite of the blessings lavished upon them by a loving and forgiving God. Hence the message clearly stated is that God's people have been poor tenants in the Lord's vineyard. The psalmist pleads with God to look down from heaven and to "take care of this vine," knowing that if any good is to come of it it will be God's doing and not the people's.

Giving a theological explanation of Israel history of gross ingratitude through a Parable, Jesus reminds Christians that we are the "new" Israel, enriched with additional blessings in the Church. We are expected to show our gratitude to God by bearing fruits of the kingdom.

In first reading, which is called **Isaiah's Song of the Vineyard**, the prophet describes God's care for and interest in His Chosen People. *"What more was there to do for my vineyard that I had not done?"* Yahweh asks.

Following the classic biblical imagery, Isaiah describes Israel as a non-productive vineyard. Though God has done everything necessary to produce a good crop, the vineyard yields only "wild grapes." In second reading, Paul's words of instruction as to how the Philippians should be fruit bearing wines are equally applicable to us. We too must relate ourselves to God through prayer of adoration and thanksgiving. This should be followed by prayers of petitions in which we ask for spiritual and temporal favors. Paul assures us too that such prayers will bring peace of mind in this life and eternal peace and happiness in the life to come.

Be good fruit producers in the vineyard of the Church. Jesus has given the Church everything necessary to make Christians fruit bearing. i) The Bible to know the will of God. ii) The priesthood to lead the people in God's ways. iii) The sacrament of reconciliation for the remission of sins. iv) The Holy Eucharist as our spiritual food. v) The sacrament of confirmation for a dynamic life of faith. vi) The sacrament of matrimony for the sharing of love in families, the fundamental unit of the Church. We are expected make use of these gifts and produce fruits for God.

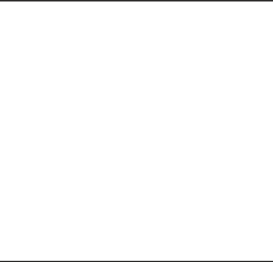

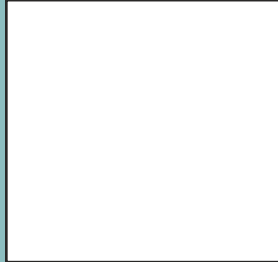
