

FATHER'S MESSAGE



Happy Easter,

May God Bless you with Easter blessings.

We are to be resurrection people: Easter, the feast of the resurrection, gives us the joyful message that we are a 'resurrection people.' This means that we are not supposed to lie buried in the tomb of our sins, evil habits and dangerous addictions. It gives us the good news that no tomb can hold us down anymore - neither the tomb of despair, discouragement, doubt nor death. Instead, we are expected to live a joyful and peaceful life, constantly experiencing the real presence of the resurrected Lord in all the events of our lives. "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad" (Psalm 118:24). Source of lasting peace and celestial joy: The living presence of the resurrected Lord gives us lasting peace and celestial joy amid the boredom, suffering, pain and tensions of our day-to-day life. "Peace be with you" was his salutation to his disciples on all post-resurrection appearances. Be transparent Christians: We are called to be transparent Christians, showing others through our lives of love, mercy and compassion and through our spirit of self-sacrificing service that the risen Jesus is living in our hearts and is an integral part of our lives. Inspiration for self-control and selfless service: The awareness of the all-pervading presence of the risen Lord in and around us, and the strong conviction of our own resurrection, help us control our thoughts, desires, words and behavior. This salutary thought inspires us to honor our bodies, keeping them holy, pure and free from evil habits and addictions. Our conviction about the presence of the risen Lord in our neighbors, and in all those with whom we come into contact, should encourage us to respect them, and to render them loving, humble and selfless service. Easter gives us the assurance that Good Friday is not the end: Easter reminds us that every Good Friday in our lives will have an Easter Sunday, and that Jesus will let us share the power of his resurrection. Each time we display our love of others, we share in the resurrection. Each time we face a betrayal of trust, we share in the resurrection of Jesus. Each time we fail in our attempts to ward off temptations - but keep on trying to overcome them - we share in the resurrection. Each time we continue to hope - even when our hope seems unanswered - we share in the power of Jesus' resurrection. In short, the message of Easter is that nothing can destroy us - pain, sin, rejection, death - because Christ has conquered all these, and we too can conquer them if we put our faith in Him. Be bearers of the good news of resurrection power. Resurrection is good news, but at the same time, it's sometimes painful because it involves death. Before the power of the resurrection can take hold in our own lives, we're called to die to sin, to die to self. We may even have to die to our own dreams, so that God can do what He wants to do with our lives. Resurrection is about seeing our world in a new way. Early that Easter morning, Mary did not find what she was looking for, the dead body of Jesus. But she found something better than she could have imagined: the risen Jesus. Sometimes, the things we think we want most are not granted to us. What we get instead is an experience of God's new ways of working in the world. That's the power of the resurrection. When those moments come, we must spread the news--just as Mary did: We have seen the Lord!

The Extraordinary Grace of the Feast

Jesus promised St. Faustina that those who received Holy Communion in a state of grace on Divine Mercy Sunday would receive "the complete remission of sins and punishment."

"My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy."

The soul that will go to confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day are opened all the divine flood-gates through which graces flow. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sin be as scarlet.

My Mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity.

The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My mercy."

Pope John Paul II announced in his homily at the canonization of St. Faustina on April 30, 2000, that "It is important that we accept the whole message that comes to us from the word of God on this second Sunday of Easter, which from now on throughout the Church, *will be called "Divine Mercy Sunday."*

So, Our Lord's promise of complete forgiveness is both a reminder and a call. It is a reminder that He is *truly present and truly alive* in the Eucharist, filled with love for us and waiting for us to turn to Him with trust. And it is a call for us *all* to be washed clean in His Love through Confession and Holy Communion--no matter how terrible our sins--and begin our lives again. He is offering us a new start.
