He is no stranger to difficulty, work, hunger, upkeep on a home, travel, or family relationships. Thankfully, according to the logic of the Incarnation (that is, his taking flesh) Jesus remains with us each day in the Church. Through the sacraments and through each other, Jesus reaches, teaches us, and touches us. His presence has continued, all the way from the beginning until now, so the kingdom of peace and love may take root in our lives. In taking flesh, the Son of God indeed began something new. That newness continues in our lives of faith.

In our parish, as we enter a new year, we look to continue the mission of Jesus with something new. We will begin taking applications now for a new full-time position, filling the gap as Mary Wanhala retires and Josh Wopata departs, but with a new structure to help us form disciples, deepen community, and reach out to those in need. As we seek to be Jesus' heart and hands to others, we need a person God calls to be on our church staff to lead others, form disciples, and integrate our ministries of formation, outreach, and community-building. If you know a good candidate, please alert them of this opportunity!

Full-Time Position

This new role is responsible for assisting the pastor with the overall ministry and evangelization efforts in the parish to ensure that everyone in the parish encounters Jesus Christ and deepens their commitment to Him and His Church. The scope of the role is to engage in direct ministry as well as to support, accompany, equip and lead the lay leaders in discerning, designing, and implementing ministry and evangelization efforts. The director is responsible for the development, implementation, evaluation and ongoing improvement of the ministry and evangelization initiatives and is responsible for managing other ministry staff. The director must demonstrate strong leadership skills necessary to identify, develop, and retain a fully formed and well-functioning staff and volunteer teams critical to the success of parish ministry.

Essential Job Functions

• Collaborate with the Pastor and others on discerning the vision that best enables the parish to offer ways for all parishioners to encounter Jesus Christ, be formed as disciples and practice missionary discipleship.

• Direct and design practical steps to implement the pastoral vision focused on making disciples, building communities, and inspiring witness through integrated ministry and evangelization initiatives.

- o Engage in direct ministry of adult formation and evangelization, including formation of catechumens and candidates in the Order of Christian Initiation for Adults, in collaboration with clergy.
- o Engage in community-building efforts in the parish.

o Organize and integrate efforts for works of mercy and community service.

o Engage in direct ministry for formation of children youth as needed.

• Direct the recruitment, training and assessing of staff members and volunteers entrusted with leadership of the parish ministries.

- Collaborate with the Pastor and Business Manager to develop an annual budget for the pastoral ministries.
- Collaborate with our parish school to align and integrate efforts of teaching the faith, community-building, and service.

- Ensure that ministry, staff and volunteers comply with the Safe Environment guidelines of the Diocese of Duluth
- Direct special projects or ministries as requested by Pastor.

Supervisory Responsibilities

- Faith Formation staff and programs
 - Current staff to report to this position are full-time Coordinator of Faith Formation for Youth and Young Adults and part-time Coordinator for Sunday School.
- Outreach Ministries including homebound, hospital and nursing home ministry
 - Supervise one part-time Outreach Coordinator to be hired.
- Volunteers in the areas of ministry outlined above.

St. Stephen | Feast Day December 26

The Acts of the Apostles tells the story of St. Stephen, the first Christian martyr. A man filled with grace and power, he worked great wonders among the people. Some Jews debated with St. Stephen but could not match his wisdom and spirit. Eventually, a charge of blasphemy was brought up against him, and the local population demanded that he be tried and sentenced. He was seized and carried before the Sanhedrin.

Despite the danger he faced, in front of the Sanhedrin and his accusers, St. Stephen gave a long speech about the history of Israel and the blessings that God had given upon His chosen people. He talked about how Israel had become disobedient despite God's abundant mercy. This enraged his accusers, and eventually the crowd dragged him out of the city and stoned him to death.

Even in his final moments, St. Stephen displayed great forgiveness and even asked God not to hold the sins of his attackers against them. Hundreds of years after his death, he is still a role model for us to follow. @LPi


