

A MESSAGE FROM FR. ANTHONY Wroblewski

So often it seems that we are inundated with requests for donations. Mission Sunday, Disaster Relief, school fundraisers – you name it, we have been asked to be generous. The thing is, you have always responded so well! In the short time

that I have been pastor of St. Mary Star of the Sea and rector of the Cathedral, you have been generous. So, I fear bringing up this topic: UCA – the United Catholic Appeal for our diocese.

Over the last few weeks I have been asking you to help us achieve our UCA goal, which is an obligation that we have as a parish in this diocese. (We are in the midst of taking up a second collection every week until we have achieved our goal.) All the programs in our diocese need the UCA funds to operate: the money literally goes to directly pay for the needs we have in the Diocese of Duluth. And please remember that if we do not make our goal, then we must take money out of our operating funds to achieve the **goal.** We do not have the choice to simply ignore it. It is sad when that happens, since that parish, in essence,

gets taxed twice, since the regular income they get is used to calculate the next year's UCA. And that money, since it comes from our regular operating accounts, won't be available for parish needs.

For many years now, my predecessors and I have recounted for you all the ways in which UCA helps us to do the work of Christ in and beyond parish boundaries. We've heard about Youth Ministry, Religious Education, our Diocesan Offices, and many other topics. You know how blessed both our parish cluster and diocese are with vocations, whose seminary training is paid by UCA. You are probably aware that one of the single largest line items in the budget for the diocese is seminarian education. We are grateful each year to be able to witness the ordinations of so many young men to the priesthood at the Cathedral. Their education wouldn't be possible without the UCA.

As I write this article, St. Mary is close to achieving their goal, needing less than \$470 more. (Perhaps when this article is published you will have already put that goal to bed.) The Cathedral still has a ways to go: about \$41,000. We will continue the weekly Sunday collections until we have achieved our goal. Once we do, the second collections will end. So I once again ask you to do what you can to help us reach this attainable goal. Many thanks for your generosity!



FAITH FORMATION

As we approach the end of the Church year, our Gospel invites us to consider Jesus' predictions and teaching about the end of the world. Jesus does not want us to be fearful about the fact that the world will one day come to an end but to beware of the signs that the time is coming. Many things in our world may change or have changed. Yet all of us find security in our relationships with others and our values. We can confidently accept change because we know that we will continue to be loved by our family and by God. We also help impart this sense of trust and confidence in our children with our daily assurances to them that nothing can change our love for them.

Our younger children are learning to accept change in their lives, as our older children prepare for changes in their lives. As we find security in God in our lives amidst change, they also find feel security in the people whose love for them will not change. It is our job as parents to be there and support them in understanding that no matter what changes or difficulties may occur in life, Jesus' love for us is unchanging and eternal. We don't know when the things that Jesus talks about will happen, but we know that they will happen. Even though we don't know when the end of time will come, we do know that Jesus does not want us to be frightened by these signs. Nor does he want us to be fearful about the fact that the world will one day come to an end. Rather, these readings are offered to prepare us for the changes we will experience during our lifetimes.

Our consolation and hope is found in the lasting nature of Jesus' words and God's never-ending love for us. Many things in the world may change, but Jesus' words to us and God's love for us will never change.
