

Praised be Jesus Christ!

Fr. Guenther and I have begun a new series of homilies called “*God’s Money... In Our Pocket.*” In this series, we are speaking about Christ teaches us about money and how we are to use it, and money in the mission of the church, particularly in our parish. As I have done before with previous homily series, I’ll be offering here a bulletin summary a re-cap of what we spoke about. It’s worth pointing out that we’re drawing a significant portion of this series from a book called *Church Money*, by Fr. Michael White and James Corcoran. I’d certainly recommend the book to anyone, as this is a topic that gets too little attention in the Catholic world.

It’s been said that about 15 percent of Jesus’ recorded words were all on the topic of money. That would mean that Christ said more about money than he did about heaven or hell. He said more about money than what he said on sex or marriage. He said more about money than what he said about the Church. So, what exactly did Jesus say about money? This is a question that, especially for us as Catholics, deserves a fresh and candid look.

We begin by summarizing from the Gospel Christ’s key teachings on money. These key teachings are as follows: (1) we are stewards, not owners of money, (2) we build treasure in heaven through good stewardship, (3) be on guard against greed, (4) use money to direct our heart toward God, (5) pay your taxes, and (6) don’t worry about money. We’ll begin with the first two this week and pick up with the rest next time.

(1) We are stewards, not owners of our money. In Luke’s Gospel, Jesus said that the kingdom of God can be compared to a rich man who decided to fire his steward because the man

mismanaged the master’s funds. Do you remember the story? The steward, knowing he was about to lose his job, decided to radically reduce the debt of the master’s debtors to ensure friendship and support from others in his unemployment. Surprisingly, at the end of the parable, Jesus commends this dishonest servant for his actions. While this parable confuses a lot of people, the point Jesus is trying to make is to remind us that the money in our possession is only temporary and that we are not real owners of it. Through this and other similar parables, Jesus teaches that money doesn’t belong to us. It belongs to God. God is the owner of the money that passes through our hands. The money we have now is on loan to us, and it is to be given back with interest. Recognizing that we are his stewards helps us to use money more wisely, which is in our best interest because it brings us expanded responsibility. If we think of money as in our own possession, we will use it differently than if we think of it as God’s. If I am a steward, then when I lose money in the stock market or suffer some great financial setback, it doesn’t become an emotional defeat as well. If I grow in wealth, then I know that God has given me the money and possessions to accomplish a greater good. Again, we are stewards, not owners, of our money.

(2) Build treasure in heaven. In Mark’s Gospel (10:21), when a rich young man approaches and asks him what he is missing, Jesus says, “You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.” We know that he went away sad. We’ve all heard the passage, and it tends to make more than a few of us uncomfortable. Perhaps though the rich young man didn’t hear the rest of the statement. He was so attached to his money and possessions that the loss of them was unthinkable. Jesus wasn’t telling him to give away his possessions for merely altruistic reasons, but to build up a heavenly reward. Jesus also says in his Sermon on the Mount in Matthew’s Gospel (6:19-20), “To not store up for yourselves treasures on earth where moth and decay destroy, and thieves break in and steal. But store up treasures in heaven...” Jesus, as it turns out, is not against having money or treasure. He just wants us to use it for good. He is for treasure, but of lasting value. We can’t keep it, but we can send it on ahead. We run into problems when we want to use money for our own plans, our own pleasures, and our own kingdom. Using money to serve God and his purposes brings rewards of lasting value. Again, build treasure in heaven.

When it comes to our money, God usually has bigger and better plans than we do. With God, whether we have a little money or a lot, investing our money according to God’s agenda will always result in the greatest returns, both in this life and in the life of heaven to come. We are stewards of God’s money, not owners. And with that money, we are to build treasure in heaven. Next time, we’ll pick up with more of Christ’s teachings on money.

A Bit of This & That by Sr. Yvonne

"GIFT OF FINEST WHEAT"

The refrain from the hymn "Gift of Finest Wheat" fits the gospel story perfectly for today. "You satisfy the hungry heart, with gift of finest wheat, Come give to us, O saving Lord, the bread of life to eat" Sorry to say, I don't play that hymn often because it is difficult and beyond me with 5 flats!!

Last week, we heard that in Jesus' presence and with His blessing, thousands of hungry people ate their fill. After, the crowd wanted to come and make Him king, but instead Jesus snuck away. Today we read from (John 6: 24-35) that the crowd found Jesus back in Capernaum. When Jesus offered "true bread" they responded: "Give us this bread always" Jesus' answer was: "I am the living bread" That was not what they were looking for. Jesus was not offering free lunch but inviting them to be nourished by His life.

In the Gospel last Sunday, one child gave all he had and the crowd was fed, and no one was hungry any longer. If they wanted to do the works of God, if they wanted the food that endures, they needed to believe in Jesus enough to do what he did.

Jesus, the Son of God, entered our history not to "wow" us with miracles but to show how we can live. Jesus wants us to believe in Him and come to Him through the Eucharist. God wants to dwell within us! If God wants to feed us with "the bread of life" (John 6:35) God must really love us. We experienced loss during this time of Covid. Many of us missed coming to Mass in person and receiving Jesus in the Eucharist. The readings of today are very powerful and compelling. We can never forget that Jesus is our "Bread of Life" and He wants to feed us in the Eucharist. Together we are grateful!

The UN has designated 2021 as the Year for the elimination of Child Labor and urges all to take direct action to ensure that all children are safe and can flourish. Let us pray for the safety of all children.


