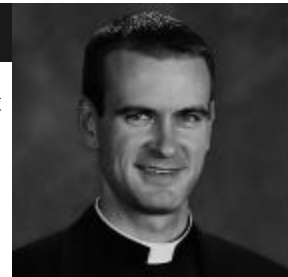

Praised be Jesus Christ!

For the coming weeks, I will continue to recap our homily series on money: “*God’s Money... In Our Pocket.*” Last time, we began to answer the question: what exactly did Jesus say or teach about money? We spoke about two of Christ’s central teachings about money: (1) that we are stewards, not owners of money, and that (2) we build treasure in heaven through good stewardship of money. This time, we continue with a couple more key teachings of Jesus on money: (3) that we are to be on guard against greed, and (4) that we are to use money to direct our heart toward God. So, we begin.

**(3) Money represents the greatest competition God faces for our hearts. Therefore, be on guard against greed.** Greed is a very subtle sin, and we’re not so easily inclined to recognize that we’re guilty of it, and many in our world never even give it a thought. And yet, obviously, it is undeniably present in our lives and prevalent in our community and culture. In Luke’s Gospel (12:15) Jesus says to “take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one’s life does not consist in possessions.” There is a danger of equating one’s money and possessions with one’s very identity. Financial difficulties end friendships and partnerships and are a leading cause for divorce. There is a real danger in equating net worth with real worth. Without even realizing it, we gradually begin to find who we are – our identity – in the money or wealth, or material things we possess. These things then gradually begin to win in the competition of

God for our hearts. To what extent do you find your identity in the money or things you possess? To what extent has God lost the competition? One way to know the answer to that question is to imagine if all our money and possessions were taken away from us. How would we feel about ourselves? Would we feel like a failure? Again, money represents the greatest competition God faces for our hearts.

**(4) Money can move the heart in the right direction.** Consider the story of Zaccheus, a chief tax collector in Luke’s Gospel, chapter 19. The only reason one would choose to be a tax collector was love of money. Such officials were considered traitors to their country and outcasts from their faith. The Jewish people detested their behavior because they collected money for the Roman oppressors. They were assigned to collect a prescribed tax for Rome, but then they could add any amount they wanted over and above that tax for their own benefit, which led to widespread corruption. But after Zaccheus climbs the sycamore tree to see Jesus, and then meets him, he has a change of heart. He discovers a new love. He gives half his fortune to the poor and promises to repay more than he has stolen from others, leading Jesus to say, “Today salvation has come to this house.” When we give our money as God asks us to give, we open our hearts to receive his strength and grace. As Jesus says in Matthew’s Gospel (6:21), “Where your treasure is, there also will your heart be.” Your heart automatically follows your money. If you invest in a company, their performance starts getting your attention. When you buy a new house or car, it takes part of your heart. If you buy season tickets, you are going to go to the game, no matter how badly the team is doing. Our hearts tend to follow our money. This isn’t in itself good or bad, but it is a reality that Jesus observed. And since our hearts will follow our money, then it makes sense to invest our money in places where we want our hearts to go. If you want to have a heart for your parish, then start investing your money there. If you want to grow in charity for the poor, give there. While money can be a problem for the human heart, we can correct it by using it to build God’s kingdom instead of our own.

As we learn this way of life in Christ, it’s worth asking if there are places that we put our money that cause us to set our hearts on things that do not serve God’s will or his kingdom, but actually work against his will or his kingdom. What are the treasures of our hearts that really do not belong to God? As we come to the Mass and prepare to receive Christ Jesus truly present in the Eucharist, let’s make sure that it is him and his will, and his life in us, that we truly seek – that our hearts are set on the right kind of treasure.

After having fed them with a multitude of loaves and fishes, and after sharing the news of His generous gift of self, saying: "I am the bread that came down from heaven" the crowd began to murmur about Jesus. They talk behind his back, they ridiculed Him, and said things about his family, putting doubt in other's minds about the truthfulness of Jesus. Jesus hears about this and calls them out. He stops the divisiveness in its tracks and reminds them about their past. Jesus says: "Your ancestors ate the manna in the desert, but they died, this is the bread that comes down from heaven so that one may eat it and not die." (John 6: 49)

What do we need to keep us going as Christians? I think it is our trusting faith in God. That faith is kept alive and growing in us through our close relationship with Christ. He nourishes us through the Eucharist. The Eucharist is our food and drink for the road of life. It gives us the courage to stand up for what is right and good.

Why did some people "get it" and others not? Those that got it opened their mind to what Jesus was saying and what they experienced of Him. He spoke of God's love and mercy. He gave sight to the blind, healed the sick and the lame, celebrated with them and prayed with them. He was one of them. So when Jesus said: "I am the Bread of Life they could say, "Yes, I have experienced you as bread. You have given me hope and a promise of eternal life".

Sometimes murmuring is much easier than praying and believing. The Eucharist is the foundation of our spiritual life and we are always thankful. 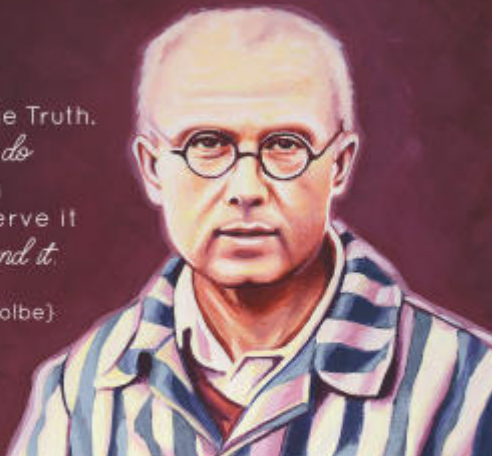
