

Praised be Jesus Christ!

We continue recapping our homily series on money: “God’s Money... In Your Pocket.” Over the first few Sundays of this series, we spoke about what Jesus said or taught about money. Then, last time, we began talking about the next main part of our series on money in the Church, particularly in the parish. We spoke about some biblically rooted “rules” for giving our money in the Church: (1) that giving our money is an act of worship, (2) that we are to give in our place of worship as an act of worship, and (3) that we are called to tithe – i.e., a ten percent offering of what we have or what we earn. Today, I’d like to continue with two more “rules” for giving in the Church, that is, our place of worship. They are: (4) give beyond the tithe, and (5) give to the poor. So here we go.

Rule 4 – Give Beyond the Tithe. In Mark’s Gospel we read, “[Jesus] sat down opposite the treasury and observed how the crowd put money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums. A poor widow also came and put in two small coins worth a few cents” (12:41-42). Often people will contend that God doesn’t care about or even notice what they do with money at church, but clearly Jesus did. He was watching and listening. And he not only noticed, but he evaluated their giving levels, and then commented on them: “Calling his disciples to himself, he said to them, “Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury” (Mark 12:43). Interestingly, Jesus doesn’t look to the acts of wealthy donors as a lesson in giving for his disciples. He

turns to this poor widow and says astoundingly that she gave more than all the rest. In God’s view, according to God’s economy, the percentage is far more important than the actual amount. This is why Jesus says, “For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood” (Mark 12:44). The wealthy whom Jesus observed at the Temple gave from their surplus, so it cost them nothing. The widow revealed her trust in God by giving from her subsistence.

In a way, I suppose this makes it difficult to claim people’s giving at church generous. Generosity is certainly a value and a virtue we must promote in our parish. We are called to grow in generosity, but we usually don’t know when someone is actually being generous, do we? Jesus is clear that to honor God, we are to give from our substance, even if that means giving beyond the tithe. The widow gave “more” because she gave more than the tithe (more than her 10%). When it comes to dollars and cents, the amount can be deceiving. Sometimes, people can make a gift that, in light of their financial situation, is very small. However, that same gift may be significant considering where their heart is when it comes to money. The tithe (10%) isn’t a ceiling; it’s more like the ground floor, but oftentimes as Catholics, we may find ourselves starting in the basement. The idea of tithing – giving at 10% right off the bat might be hard for us to fathom. We may not feel that we’re in a place to give at 10%. That’s okay. The key is that we start at a percentage that is “generous” for us. Every year then, we will have the opportunity to re-evaluate our tithing and discern if we can make one more step.

Rule 5 – Give to the Poor. Jesus himself didn’t teach about giving in your place of worship very often, because he didn’t really have to. However, he talked about giving to the poor all the time. One of the principal ways Christ’s followers give is by donating to the poor. Essentially, Jesus paints a vision that money and possessions are of diminished significance in the light of eternity. Jesus’ instruction on giving to the poor is clear: disciples give to the poor; money must be used to do that; the poor can present themselves in many different ways; and there is no excuse for being ignorant of the poor. Jesus does not, however, address many of the questions and concerns that can slow us down and trip us up when it comes to giving: What are the right charities to give to? What about people who take advantage of others’ giving? When is it harmful or counterproductive to give money to someone? What about all those annoying mailings you get asking for money? To be sure, these are important concerns and considerations. They just shouldn’t get in the way of our giving. When in doubt, better to give. Giving is how we grow as disciples, but that’s not all. It turns out there is a connection between giving and growing the Church, which we’ll speak about in the coming weeks.

WASH YOUR HANDS!

When I was young, my parents always reminded us to wash our hands before coming to the table. A direction given to us during Covid was: "WASH YOUR HANDS" Washing our hands is important for a number of reasons. The Pharisees and Scribes knew that the Jews had a tradition of purifying everything, so when they saw the disciples not follow the tradition, especially in regard to hand washing, they questioned Jesus about that. "What about it Jesus?" Jesus is trying to teach what is essential to life. He dares to call these hecklers, watching for other people's faults--hypocrites. Jesus makes a new law by declaring all foods to be clean, and He insists that it is not what enters a person that defiles one but what comes from his or her heart. It is easy to honor God with our lips because it is the acceptable thing to do in our society, We make judgements about others. It is easier to keep the law and forget to love. Our life in Christ requires a delicate balancing act in which our outward behavior is important, though ultimately it is the state of our heart that matters to God.

How are we challenged by this Gospel? In our desire to show that we are holy, we might give too much credence to externals and follow the rules without thinking of the intention behind them. Jesus reminds us that we do not make ourselves holy by our actions. Rather we become holy when we allow God's Holy Spirit to transform us. Our actions should be an expression of our heart. When I think of water and of washing I recall the year 2003 when Jim Olson went to Haiti to drill a well for the people there. He had many stories to tell of that experience. It was a work of love. Let us pray for the people of Haiti who are suffering as a result of earthquakes. We can't dig another well, but we can pray with and for the suffering poor in Haiti. Let us pray for each other, too! Have a good week!
