Soles4Souls



Praised be Jesus Christ!

We continue recapping our homily series on money: what Christ and the Scriptures teach us about it, and money in the Church and parish. Last time, I spoke about how the functioning of parishes today is much different than the way things worked a couple generations ago. We no longer have as many priests and religious doing things. To accomplish our mission today, we as parishes need qualified lay staff, along with volunteers, more than we ever have before. Much like the churches of our evangelical and Protestant brothers and sisters, who see expanding their budgets and staff, as crucial to their outreach and mission, so we need to rethink how we fund our mission and have the manpower our parishes need to be effective.

I'd now like to say a bit more about funding the mission of the parish. Think about some of the most successful organizations that you know of, and their leaders, religious organizations, or secular. What do they all have in common? They have a great and compelling vision. But they also know to fund their vision. The healthiest, growing churches in our country (and I'm particularly referring to many non-Catholic churches), the ones most successfully reaching their communities (again, think of Jacob's Well, which I spoke about last time), all have enormous budgets, even though they're mostly "scrappy start-ups." How did they do that? They taught their people to give, and as a result they can reach more people. I'm not saying that we're all called to be like Jacob's Well, but we cannot be the parishes that God wants us to be if we are not regularly increasing our parish budget and consistently strengthening our stewardship of what we have already received.

As we think about funding the mission of the parish, I'd like

us to consider again the people who work for our parishes to serve our mission, as well as our approach to regular giving to fund that mission. First, our people. Most Catholic parishes I know these days tend to focus a lot of their financial resources on things like building needs and the maintenance of their physical plant. That's very important, and we will always need to attend to those things. Those things are very easy to focus on because they're very tangible and visible. It's easy to give money to fix or build something we can see and touch. But we can't forget that central to our parish's mission of outreach are *the persons* that work for us: not only our volunteers, but especially any of our paid staff who help give direction to volunteers. Our qualified and hardworking paid staff should be paid justly, so that they can support themselves and their families. When we think about our tithing, are we thinking about those kinds of needs of the parish. Is my tithing not only supporting keeping the heat and lights on, but also those who work for a living to serve the Church?

Second, and finally, our approach to regular giving to fund our mission. Because of our history as Catholic parishes in this country, coming from poor immigrant roots, the Catholic approach to funding parish needs and operations has often been, more or less, "nickel and diming" people with lots of fundraisers for things (picnics, bingo, craft sales, etc.) – fundraisers that tend to really exhaust the volunteer base of many parishes. Catholics a long time ago were generally poorer and were not able to tithe significantly – so we had different ways of supporting our parishes. As a result, Catholics today have not grown accustomed to seriously tithing.

While such parish fundraising events and activities aren't bad in and of themselves, and they often make up a significant part of the social life of the parish (or at least they did in the past), they can often lead to the Church seeming like we're always asking for money. How many of us have heard the complaint that "the Church is always asking for my money"? Having lots of different events and fundraisers to support the operations of a parish can make that criticism seem true.

The ironic reality is that because our focus has not been on tithing and developing a full sense of stewardship with our parishes, most Catholics statistically give to their parish at a percentage much lower than non-Catholic Christians give to their churches. In part because of our poor immigrant history, the Catholic approach to giving to the Church in our country has been fundamentally different than that of other denominations. Therefore, one of the reasons for this series of homilies is to get us to think not so much about the dollar amount that we give to this or that fundraiser, or even the dollar amount that we put in the collection each week or each month, but rather to think about our *annual tithe* and *plan for giving* to support the gospel mission of the Church and parish. I think it's time that we as American Catholics begin to move toward giving away our money in a more biblically rooted way – in which we plan to make a tithe – a percentage of our income or what we have that is both an act of worship and a way of setting our heart on the evangelizing mission of the Church and parish.

A Bit of This & That by Sr. Yvonne

In today's Gospel, Mark 8:31-35, Jesus asks two questions-1) "Who do people say that I am?" (the easier question) 2) "Who do you say that I am?" (the harder question) The first question gets a quick answer, but the second gets only Peter's response.

By saying "You are the Christ" Peter was naming Jesus as the long-awaited Anointed One, the one who would come to restore Israel's political kingdom and overthrow the Romans. But this was not to be. Instead Jesus says that he must suffer and die and then rise again after three days. Peter's statement that Jesus is the Christ is correct, but Peter did not want to hear of his suffering and death. Peter rebukes Jesus and as much as says that suffering is beneath him. But Jesus will not be swayed from the cross and the pain that goes with it.

Notice that Jesus reprimands Peter and in some translations even calls him Satan.

Why was Peter so upset by what Jesus was saying? Like Peter, we sometimes forget to let God be God for us. We may get discouraged because God doesn't act in our world the ways that we expect. But God is always working for the world's salvation in ways that are beyond our imagination.

Jesus told the disciples and also tells us today that we have to follow Him by taking up the crosses that come our way. Is that part of our faith or do we say: "Lord, everything--but not that?" Jesus assures us that whoever wishes to save his or her life must deny himself, take up the cross and follow Him.. Peter was the rock, but at this point Peter became the block. God's plan is not that we do all of our good works on our own. God assures us that He is with us every step of the way, to help us love, serve, speak the truth and help bring forth the Kingdom. Let us pray for each other as we answer the question that Jesus asks of us, too. "WHO DO YOU SAY THAT I AM?"

God bless all of our grandparents as we celebrate Grandparents Day on Sept. 12!
