

# COLLAR COMMENTARY- FR. BURISH



## Praised be Jesus Christ!

Last Sunday we concluded our homily series on money with what will be for our parishes our annual Stewardship Sunday. This will be the only weekend, every year when we ask our members to evaluate their giving and make a commitment to giving to our parish for the coming year.

It is chiefly through the Church, and the local parish particularly, that we are regularly called, invited, and reminded to respond to this call of being a disciple of Jesus. Where else do we hear Christ's message and the fullness of his truth proclaimed more often and more consistently? Where else will we find more people who are on the same journey as we are and are here to accompany us, and to challenge us onward for growth? This is why we exist as a parish: to invite all people to encounter Christ and inspire them to become saints. This is discipleship. This is why stewardship and giving to the parish is so important and worthwhile. By doing so, we are participating in the mission of Christ and the Church for the good and conversion of our local community. Recall here what we said in the homily series that we give in thanksgiving for what we have received, and that we give particularly in our place of worship (i.e., the Church or parish) as an act of worship.

In order to give most effectively in our place of worship as an act of worship, I'd like to recap the four "P's" for your consideration from Stewardship Sunday. As you pray about making your commitment to giving in your place of worship as an act of worship this year, I ask you to consider the words: planned, priority, percentage, and progress.

**Planned.** If you're just throwing change into the basket on Sunday as an afterthought or out of guilt, we challenge you to plan your gifts instead. Each year we'll be inviting

you (i.e., every household in our parish) to make a commitment to plan for giving in this coming year – that you plan for it in your budget.

**Priority.** We challenge you, if you don't already, to make giving to the offertory a priority in your annual budget. For all of us, over time, myself included, the challenge will be to make such giving *the* priority in our budget – to make sure our gifts to the Church come first over any other expenses.

**Percentage.** This marks a key change in thinking for a lot of us as Catholics. I'd like to emphasize here that it is not so much about the **10** in the **10 percent** – it's about the **per-cent**. Percentage giving is what will bring about real transformation in our Catholic parishes.

**Progressive.** Believe it or not, as we become percentage givers, this "progressive" part takes care of itself. Once we root those first three "P's" in our life, this begins to happen automatically. Once we start to give, and our heart finds itself in what we are giving to, we'll want to give beyond the tithe – to increase our percentage. Again, at this point we may not be able to start at 10 percent exactly. The key is to start at whatever percentage we can start at. And then, as those first three "P's" – planned, priority, and percentage begin to take root in our lives, we will begin to see a change in our lives and experience the amazing generosity of God as we see ourselves as stewards of his money.

As a parish, we are making a difference in people's lives. We are one significant place in our community where the truth of Christ is preached. Because of your investment in this parish, we have a place/a building in which many can come and worship God as members of Christ's Body, and as a community of faith. Through that regular worship, celebration of the sacraments, and community of faith, people grow in their relationship with the Lord and as his disciples. Because of your investment in this parish, we can build a firm foundation of faith for hundreds of children in our Catholics schools, religious education, and youth ministry opportunities. Because of your investment in this parish, we can invite more people into the Church through RCIA, or invigorate their call to discipleship through Bible study, and other such opportunities. Because of your investment in this parish, we can provide a place for charitable outreach in our community like St. Francesca Resource Center and Sojourner House. We are also providing for diocesan-wide needs through the Annual Appeal, and internationally through things like the annual Mission Coop. Because of your investment in this parish, you are making it possible for: marriages to be revived, families to be put back together, students and young adults to live their life with purpose, and people who are preparing for the next life and to live with hope.

Again, we ask you to evaluate your financial investment in this parish and its mission. If you have prayed over your commitment for the coming year, then we invite you to fill out a card in church this weekend. Your investment makes the unique and challenging call to being a disciple of Christ heard in a world that would otherwise be lost.

## A Bit of This & That by Sr. Yvonne

### WHO IS THE GREATEST?

In the early days of my schooling at Springfield Prairie School, recess would be time when we neighborhood kids would argue about things that we thought were the best.

"What kind of cars are the best? What kind of cows are the best? or What church is the best? ( kind of silly, right?)

Today, we hear politicians saying: "We are the greatest, mightiest, and the strongest nation on earth" A certain boxer said, "I am the greatest of all time" A manager might say: "I am the boss and you do what I say." Or we might hear on the playground: " I am stronger than you so look out" (kind of silly, right?)

In today's Gospel, (Mark 9: 30-37) Jesus again speaks of His coming passion and death, but the disciples not only don't understand, they don't even ask for clarification.

Rather, they begin to argue among themselves about who is the greatest. Likely the disciples are wondering who among them would take the lead after Jesus' death.

Jesus upsets their expectation by saying that a leader is one who serves. As a good teacher and to prove His point Jesus uses a child as His visual aid. Jesus says: "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name receives me, and whoever receives me, receives not only me, but the One who sent me"

Greatness does not mean being first, or at the head of the class. Greatness is found in willingness to be last and the servant of all. "YOU GO FIRST" is not just a matter of good manners, but the willingness to be the last or the least which comes from the example of Jesus Himself.

As we come together at Mass today, we offer ourselves, our prayers, works, joys and suffering and we can say: "Thank you for the many blessings and gifts that we have received and continue to receive. Help us to be open to the message of the Gospel today. Let us look at ways to serve our neighbor who may need the gifts that we have to share." Have a great week and God bless you!


