Collar Commentary- Fr. Burish

Praised be Jesus Christ!

"If you are too busy to pray, you are too busy!" That was St. Mother Teresa's response to people who told her about the overwhelming amount of work in their lives. In 1973, Mother Teresa made a radical decision about how the sisters of her order, the Missionaries of Charity, would re-prioritize their daily busy schedule of serving the poorest of the poor around the world. While her sisters were already committed to prayer in the Mass, the Liturgy of the Hours, and various devotions, Mother Teresa introduced to their schedule in 1973 the daily "Holy Hour" – one hour of prayer in Eucharistic adoration, modeled after Jesus praying in the Garden of Gethsemane.

From a worldly or practical perspective, this move seems counterintuitive. With such a great need in caring for the poorest of the poor, why spend an extra hour in prayer each day? But Mother Teresa testified that this extra hour of prayer, this "wasted time with Jesus," brought about a great change in the work of her order. It made the work of she and her sisters did not about their own talent, planning, and effort, but it allowed God to work through them in more powerful ways. In effect, it truly put God in charge of everything, and therefore it brought about a greater fruitfulness in their work.

We need time to pray each day if we want to grow spiritually. But what exactly is prayer? Prayer is not a complicated formula or a series of rigid steps; it is our very relationship with God. We are reminded of our identity as children of a good Father in heaven, and that all we do – our work, relationships, responsibilities – is enriched by the Holy Spirit. Prayer is not about what we do so much as it is something God initiates as he puts a desire for him on our hearts. Taking the leap to start a daily

Holy Ghost Parish Office 715- 723-4890 Notre Dame Parish Office 715- 723- 7108 prayer life can be intimidating, so I'd like to propose for you three principles to help get you started. These principles are: (1) consistent, (2) quiet, and (3) simple.


First, we must be consistent. Most great things in life all come about through a routine and consistent effort. Think about any athlete training for a competition, or any other unique skill that each of us have developed in our lives. They all come about through repeated practice. It's very similar with prayer. To begin, simply make sure you have a consistent prayer time and routine each day. Even if you can start to pray for only ten minutes a day, find a way to do it every day so that you build up the habit, and through the habit build your relationship with God. Your consistency will be tested by busy schedules, competing priorities, and even feelings of boredom and frustration. In these circumstances, you will need perseverance to continue in the daily life of relationship with God.

Second, we need quiet in our hearts. When we talk to friends, we want to have their full attention. The same is true in the great conversation of prayer. God wants to hear what is on our hearts – our hopes, dreams, fears, hurts and needs. He wants to speak to us through Scripture, the words of the saints, or devotional books. But we won't be able to speak or listen if we don't have silence. Find a quiet place – your room, a chapel, the outdoors – where you're less likely to be distracted. Put down or turn off your phone so you don't get all the notifications to distract you.

Third, we need a plan for prayer that is simple. After you quiet yourself and recognize God's presence, take some time to read: perhaps a few verses from the Bible, a few lines from a saint, passages from a devotional book like *In Conversation with God* or *The Imitation of Christ*, or meditations found in publications like *Magnificat*. Then, have a simple conversation with God about what is going on in the passage and how it relates to your life. Pay attention to what stands out to you or what seems to apply to your life right now.

One simple and powerful way you can begin to pray is with a method known as Lectio Divina, which means "divine reading." I know John Shakal has done a bit of this in his Bible studies. It consists of reading a short passage of the Scriptures that you are drawn to, meditating or reflecting on it, praying on it by asking the Lord what he desires to show you about your own life, and then just contemplating or resting in God's presence in whatever graces, insights, encouragements, or challenges you received.

Set a goal and plan how to incorporate some time of daily prayer into your life. Start simple and choose something attainable that you can do each day.

What Must I Do?

In today's Gospel (Mark 10:17-30) a young man runs up to Jesus and asks :"What must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus' answer to the rich young man knocks the wind out of his sails. Jesus asks him to sell what he has, give it to the poor and then follow him. The young man went away sad because he had a lot of possessions. The disciples were confused about what Jesus said, too.

Wasn't wealth a sign of blessing? When one holds on to it, there is less room for God. Valuing money more than God, keeps us from the freedom we need to let go of whatever gets in God's way. We can think back to the recent Sunday homilies given by Father Burish and Father Guenther in regard to the use of God's money given to us for our well-being, to be shared and not hoarded.

Jesus doesn't mention the first three commandments. They really hold the answer to the man's question about the key to eternal life. A person can follow the last seven commandments by simply doing what the commandments require by following the letter of the law. The first three commandments determine what is in one's heart.

The young man went away sad because his possessions were more important to him than his relationship with God.

Many people decide to tithe giving at least 10% of their income to the Church to support the Body of Christ while others give directly to the poor. Some people live simply which is not easy, because we want to have so much "stuff" There are some who live without any belongings beyond what is absolutely essential. Whatever path we choose, we try to love God above all and our neighbor (that includes the poor) as ourselves. However we live, we see that the Gospel is clear in it's insistence to care for the poor. So when we ask "what must I do?" Jesus spells it out pretty clearly.

I get countless begging letters to help the poor and I can't respond to most of them. What I can do, when I go grocery shopping, I buy at least one extra thing that I can share by putting it in the basket at the back of church to be given to the food pantry. I can share with a cause that I see helps the poor, especially children. I am sure that you also have a way to share your possessions in order to follow Jesus more closely.


