

Our Journey Continues in Revival

In today's Gospel, for the 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time Cycle C, Jesus teaches us a valuable lesson in evangelization. We find Jesus preparing to embark on a journey. He felt that His ministry in Galilee was complete and that He needed to make a final trip to Jerusalem. As was His custom, He sent messengers on ahead to ensure that all was in readiness. When Jesus' messengers were rebuffed, they asked Jesus if He wanted to rain down curses on the offending Samaritan village, but Jesus rebuked them and they simply left for another village.

Luke's Gospel illustrates the loving, benevolent way of Jesus' evangelizing. You can't force someone to do something they don't want to do or to listen if they don't want to hear. Additionally, Jesus set the bar pretty high for those who wanted to become His disciples. They had to be capable of leaving possessions, responsibilities and cherished relationships in order to be fully committed to the reign of God. Salvation is to be received only with complete devotion to God's reign.

If we look deep within ourselves, we see an awesome truth. We belong to the Triune God: the God who created us, the God who saved us and entrusts us with the great gift of the Church, the God who sanctifies and guides us. We belong to the Body of Christ. This is the whose we are. We are called to be one in Christ, to go forward on this journey to learn who we truly are and whose we truly are. These are key words: who we are and whose we are. When we know who we are, then we can do the works of the whose we are.

The only way we truly can know who we are, and whose we are, is to enter into a personal relationship with Jesus Christ, and not be afraid to be the real me. We have been given the gift and the challenge of the Renewal: Eucharistic Amazement. The mission of the Revival is to renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist.

Michael Podrebarac, Archdiocesan Consultant for Liturgy and Sacramental Life, says that since Catholics celebrate the Eucharist every Sunday and virtually every weekday, the first thing we all should do is be aware of what we do when we gather at the table of the Lord. Podrebarac is well known throughout the archdiocese for his expertise in liturgy and music. Next month he is going to start rolling out informational sessions and archdiocesan workshops for musicians and liturgical ministers. These can be very beneficial to the "people in the pew" as well.

Podrebarac cites participation in one of the devotionals – such as Eucharistic Holy Hours, Eucharistic adoration, Eucharistic processions – as things the archdiocese needs to kindle and rekindle. He has a vision of making sure all parishioners are centered around the Eucharist, which Podrabarac has termed as THE SOURCE AND SUMMIT of the life and mission of the church.

As we continue on our journey, let us value the WHO we are and the WHOSE we are. We thank God for providing us with this Journey to Revival. For more details go to: www.archkck.org/revival.





Dear Clergy, Religious, and Lay Faithful,

Our celebration this year of the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord (June 19, 2022) marks the inauguration of a three-year National Eucharistic Revival initiative, known locally as Revival: Eucharistic Amazement. The goal of the Eucharistic Revival is to renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. This initiative will be marked by four distinct movements over the next three years: Diocesan Phase, Parish Phase and the National Congress leading into the Year of Going Out on Mission. The first year of the Eucharistic Revival (beginning June 19, 2022) is the Diocesan Phase. We will be offering a variety of diocesan-level events; we encourage your participation and invite your communities to do the same. Included with this letter is an overview of the three year initiative which lays out the three phases of archdiocesan and parish concentration. We share this information to provide a general framework for parishes to begin planning for the Parish Phase in June 2023. Several workshops and study days will be made available to clergy and parish leaders as opportunities for formation and conversation around themes of celebrating the Sacred Liturgy, catechesis, devotion, and mission. A new Archdiocesan website has been developed to serve as the hub for event planning, information and resource sharing on Revival: Eucharistic Amazement and can be accessed at: www.archkek.org/revival.

The second year (June 2023-June 2024) of the Eucharistic Revival is the Parish Phase. This phase begins on June 11, 2023 - the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord. During this year, parishes, institutions, organizations and religious communities are asked to devote their attention to three main areas of increased concentration:

- Formation of the laity
- Enhancement of Eucharistic zeal in priests, deacons and liturgical ministers
- Experiences of Eucharistic amazement

In year three (July 2024), we look forward to local celebrations and sending a delegation to the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, Indiana. This national gathering of the faithful will begin the third year of the Eucharistic Revival, which is the Year of Going Out on Mission. Locally, we will be further equipping the faithful in the Enflame process of spreading the Good News through praying, caring and sharing. Extended training resources, custom workshops and relational information about effectively sharing the joy of the Gospel can be found at: www.archkck.org/enflame.

We are very excited to enter into this prolonged period of intentional focus on our personal relationship with Christ in His Body as shared with each of us in the Eucharist! Please join us in praying that the National Eucharistic Revival and our local Revival: Eucharistic Amazement initiatives will draw each of us into deeper intimacy with the Most Holy Trinity.

When talking with others, here are some key messages we want to continue to reinforce about Value Them Both:

- Value Them Both is a reasonable response to an extreme KS Supreme Court ruling that makes it nearly impossible to limit or regulate abortion in even the simplest of ways.
- Value Them Both returns to Kansans the ability to limit and regulate the abortion industry through our elected officials just as we have done for the past 25 years.
- Value Them Both will protect our existing common sense laws
 - a Woman's Right to Know
 - prevention of state tax-funded abortion
 - parental notification requirement
 - restriction on late-term/extreme procedures
 - basic clinic sanitation and safety standards
 - Healthcare Rights of Conscience Act
 - and others
- Value Them Both is not a ban.

Regardless of what the U.S. Supreme Court decides on Roe v. Wade, Kansas will remain a destination for abortion in unregulated clinics unless Kansans pass the Value Them Both Amendment.

Please continue prayers for the passage of the Value Them Both Amendment as well as women and families facing unplanned or challenging pregnancies.


