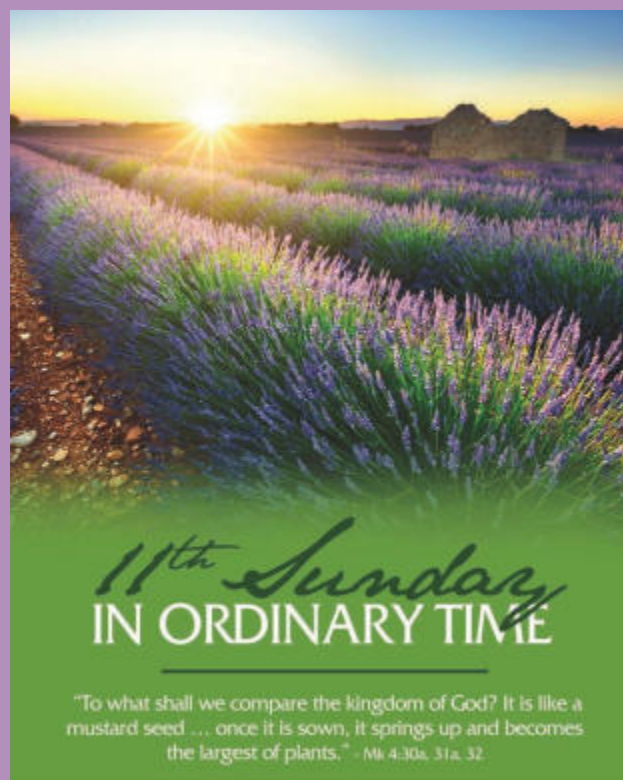

Pastor's Corner

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In Mark's Gospel, Jesus' first words of His public ministry are, *"This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel."* (Mark 1:14-15)

The Gospel account from St. Mark today speaks again of the Kingdom of God. Jesus uses parables to make a comparison between some things that the common people are familiar with and the Kingdom of God. He says the Kingdom is something like a planted seed. It mysteriously grows secretly, underground, before it breaks through the earth to form stem, leaves and fruit. Jesus says all this happens and man "knows not how".

I am told that Chinese bamboo seeds are amazing. The seeds lie buried in the soil for five years before any shoots appear above the ground. However, after continuously watering the ground and putting manure on it, hey presto, in just 6 weeks the bamboo plant grows to a height of around 90 feet. How come? Botanists say that, unseen and unknown, the seeds germinate and develop strong roots that eventually break out and produce tall bamboos. So, it is with the kingdom of God." *

Jesus also compares God's Kingdom to a mustard seed, small and seemingly insignificant. Yet it grows into a large bush. God's Kingdom started in humble ways with a carpenter's son from Galilee but will culminate with the end of time and the consummation of all things. That Kingdom is now growing in ways visible (the Church) and ways invisible (seeds planted in hearts).

What is our role in growing the Kingdom? Plant seeds! Through prayer, friendship and good conversation share the blessings and work God is doing in your life. Share your faith. Such friendship and sharing plants seeds of faith in the hearts of others. Next, water, cultivate and nourish your own heart so that the seeds of God's Kingdom in you grow. Then water, cultivate and nourish the hearts of others through loving care, honest sharing and invitation to go deeper into life's biggest questions. Let God do the rest.

Tools for Building a Domestic Church

According to the Second Vatican Council's Dogmatic Constitution on the Church: "The family is, so to speak, the domestic church." (*Lumen Gentium* #11) This means that it is in the context of the family that we first learn who God is and to prayerfully seek His will for us. In the following bullet points you will find some suggestions on how to build your "domestic church" through a life of prayer that can help all the members of your family.

- Begin praying as a family and reading from Scripture daily, certainly before meals, but also first thing in the morning or before bed. Find a time that works for your family. Use the liturgy of the Church as a model for prayer, and try to include heartfelt unstructured prayer as well.
- Pray a Family Rosary (each member leads a decade, and everyone shares intentions).
- Have a crucifix in a prominent place in the home, and in every bedroom.
- Make the Sacraments a regular celebration – take the whole family to Confession and Mass!
- Begin family traditions based on the seasons celebrated in the liturgical calendar.
- Make your vacation a holy pilgrimage by visiting the shrines and saints of our land and the world.
- Make worshiping God a priority. Never miss Mass, even while traveling – to find a church near you, go to: www.MassTimes.org.
- Teach stewardship and charity to your children, through word and example.
- Demonstrate love for your spouse, your children, your neighbors, and the world. Remind your children that they are loved by God and have been given gifts to serve others.
- Talk freely about the presence of God in the joys and sorrows of your life.
- Welcome into your home and support priests, brothers, sisters, deacons, and lay ministers in the Church.
- Participate in the lay ministries and activities of your parish community.
- Allow your children to witness you in private prayer. Encourage your children to pray daily on their own, to listen for God's call, and if heard, to respond.

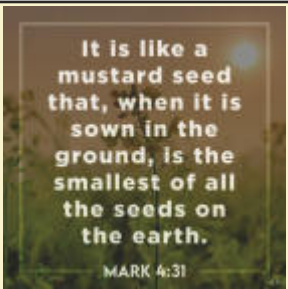

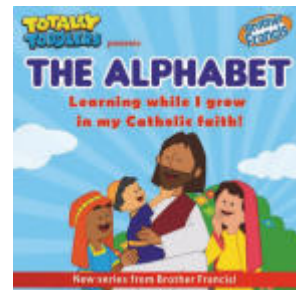
