## Pastor's Corner

### Modifying weekday Mass schedule

The book of Canon Law describes the pastor's duties and functions in Canon 528 and 530.

*Can. 528 §1. A pastor is obliged to make provision so that the word of God is proclaimed in its entirety to those living in the parish; for this reason, he is to take care that the lay members of the Christian faithful are instructed in the truths of the faith, especially by giving a homily on Sundays and holy days of obligation and by offering catechetical instruction. He is to foster works through which the spirit of the gospel is promoted, even in what pertains to social justice. He is to have particular care for the Catholic education of children and youth. He is to make every effort, even with the collaboration of the Christian faithful, so that the message of the gospel comes also to those who have ceased the practice of their religion or do not profess the true faith.*

*§2. The pastor is to see to it that the Most Holy Eucharist is the center of the parish assembly of the faithful.*

*Can. 530 The following functions are especially entrusted to a pastor:*

- 1. the administration of baptism;*
- 2. the administration of the sacrament of confirmation to those who are in danger of death, according to the norm of can. 883, n. 3;*
- 3. the administration of Viaticum and of the anointing of the sick without prejudice to the prescript of can. 1003, §§2 and 3, and the imparting of the apostolic blessing;*
- 4. the assistance at marriages and the nuptial blessing;*
- 5. the performance of funeral rites;*
- 6. the blessing of the baptismal font at Easter time, the leading of processions outside the church, and solemn blessings outside the church;*
- 7. the more solemn eucharistic celebration on Sundays and holy days of obligation.*

As it takes a village to raise a child, it takes a parish team and hundreds of parish volunteers to run a parish. The pastor is like an orchestra director, a servant leader, who oversees the proper teaching of the Gospel, the devout celebration of the Sacraments and the good governance of the parish goods assisted by the pastoral council and finance council.

Jesus expected his apostles to be tireless workers of the Kingdom of God, but Jesus also gave them a break as we read in **Mark 6:31: "then because so many people were coming and going that they did not even have a chance to eat, he said to them, come with me by yourselves to a quiet place and get some rest."** St. John Paul II early in his papacy ordered a swimming pool to be built at Castel Gandolfo, a kind of papal Camp David outside Rome, so that he could swim laps for exercise on his day off and during his summer time away from the Vatican. Popes, Bishops and priests get a canonical day off to rest from office work rooted in Genesis 2:2 when God rested on the seventh day after creating the world. My day off is on Monday. If there is an emergency or something that cannot be otherwise

scheduled like a funeral, obviously, my obligation is to interrupt the time off; but as a rule, it is to be respected.

As your pastor, I am available to you. If you wish to schedule an appointment with me in the office or the church, please call the parish office to schedule a time to meet. Home visits for the homebound can also be scheduled to bring Holy Communion and anointing of the sick. Emergency anointing of the sick for the gravely ill or the dying is done anytime. If you have a scheduled medical procedure or surgery you can schedule the sacrament of anointing of the sick ahead of time too.

Our Sunday Mass schedule remains the same. Our weekday Mass schedule is as follows as of August 1:

- **No Mass on Monday**
- **Tuesday: Confessions 5:00 pm, Mass 6:00 pm.**
- **Wednesday, Thursday and Friday Mass 8:00 am.**
- **Mass on First Saturday of each month at 8:00 AM.**

We are so blessed to have many nearby parishes where there are three priests in each parish and they offer Monday and Saturday Masses: St. Michael's, Ascension and Prince of Peace.

Tuesday evening confessions and Mass time allow many teens, young adults, and people who work to receive the Sacraments at a convenient time for them. That was my experience while working at Holy Spirit parish in Overland Park.

Remember that the Precepts of the Church in the Catechism numbers 2041 & 2042 describe the bare minimum effort we must take in prayer and in living a moral life. All Catholics are called to move beyond the minimum by growing in love of God and love of neighbor.

The precepts are as follows:

1. Attendance at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation
2. Confession of serious sin at least once a year
3. Reception of Holy Communion at least once a year during the Easter season
4. Observance of the days of fast and abstinence
5. Providing for the needs of the Church

Let us remember to pray for Vocations to the priesthood and the consecrated life so that our church may continue to have plenty of priests to staff parishes and celebrate the Eucharist.





**Gospel Meditation**



Maybe the work is best left to the professionals. That's how many people view the preaching of the Gospel. That's the stuff priests, religious, deacons, lay ministers, and other professional Church people do. It has little to do with me. Well, that's not really true. The fact of the matter is that preaching the Gospel has everything to do with you, with all of us who are baptized members of the Body of Christ. Nobody gets off the hook from that job. The question is, however, how do we do it? Well, there's a safe way, which many choose, to preach the Gospel and the risky way. The safe way pretty much keeps the Gospel in church and around like-minded people. I say my prayers, go to Mass, contribute to the food pantry, tithe, and attend Bible Study. That pretty much covers the bases, right? Wrong.

The risky way is the more challenging way and for many, the "road less traveled." Imagine those first disciples going out and into people's homes. They must have had some amazing conversations with folks about God's kingdom, changing their hearts, forgiving sins, and looking at the world differently. They must have met people who were hurting, exiled from their communities, neglected, lost, or living self-insulated lives in a society that served the rich and neglected the poor. While there were many who welcomed what they had to say and the conversations they had, there were others who no doubt rejected them and literally tossed them out on their ears! The Gospel, while being a message of joy and hope, is not always received well by those who are very comfortable keeping things as they are.

The risky way involves example and conversation. We have to take the Gospel from church and carry it with us wherever we go. What kinds of conversations do we have with others? We interact with those closest to, in our work, social circles, institutions, corporations, in politics, and beyond. Our conversations with others reveal a great deal about how we see things and what we consider important.

If we are really interested in seeing God's vision for the world succeed, then we will talk about it. It will become a part of our everyday conversation and find its way into our interactions with others. How will we preserve the dignity of human life and encourage others to have a relationship with God? We must be the example, live value centered, virtuous lives, stand against injustice, combating racism, and learn ways to resolve conflicts without violence.

If we are going to succeed going forward, we have to find a way to bring our prayer centered lives into the marketplace. Our conversations have to change. Not everyone wants to hear what the Gospel has to say. That's a risk God asks us to take.



Jesus sent his disciples out in pairs. He gave them control over evil spirits. Through baptism you have control over evil spirits. Jesus is your partner. When you are thinking about taking a toy that is not yours, you can say, “No.” When you want to hit someone, you can say, “No.” When you would like to break the rules at school, you can say, “No. I choose to walk with Jesus.”

### Prayer

Lord, give me strength to say, “Yes. I’ll obey your commandments.”

### What We Carry From Town to Town

In my experience, there are two kinds of people: the folks who kick off their shoes the second they walk through the door, and the ones who don’t.

People can feel strongly about this on both sides. The main thrust of the Shoes-Off Brigade seems to be this: we track a lot of weird stuff on the soles of our feet. Little reminders of all the places we’ve been, whether it’s a private home or a public bathroom, cling to our shoes long after we leave.

This same theory applies to our spiritual lives. As human beings and as disciples, we visit a lot of figurative towns and pick up a lot of figurative dust. Sinfulness. Shame. Defeat. Anger. Fear. Doubt. No matter how hard we try to keep free of it, these things have a way of attaching themselves to us, sometimes without us even noticing. We need to take a good look at what unhelpful and unconstructive baggage from our past we’re tracking into our present and future encounters.

What is the “town” God is asking you to visit today in His name? Is it a tough conversation with a friend, a brief witness to a stranger in the checkout line, a call to be present to someone in your family? Before you go, remember, shake off the dust. Don’t let a past disappointment constrain you. Don’t allow yesterday’s failures or burdens to keep you from the joy of today’s witness, whatever form it might take.
