

From the Pastor's Desk



"I received from the Lord what I also delivered to you." 1 Corinthians 11:23

Youth and children have been fascinated, and us adults too, watching the Tokyo Olympics these last two weeks. Great athletes inspire us all, especially our children and youth, to strive to imitate their achievements in sports. Children and youth learn the importance of the effort, dedication, discipline, self-abnegation of athletes to compete and achieve the gold. The athletes evoke new admiration and astonishment at the stamina displayed and the determination against the odds that prevail. The rules of the game must be learned, memorized, and put into practice for every victory.

A pivotal moment at the Olympics is the passing on the torch, the sacred fire, from one group to another. Passing on the torch is the perfect image for us to understand passing on the Catholic Faith to children through faith formation, namely catechesis.

The challenge to go for the gold in the living of our faith is certainly not a new one. St. Paul used it centuries ago:


You know that while all the runners in the stadium take part in the race, the award goes to one athlete. In that case, run to win! Athletes deny themselves all sorts of things. They do this not to win a crown of leaves that withers, but a crown that is imperishable. I do not run like someone who loses sight of the finish line. I do not fight as if I were shadowboxing. What I do is discipline my own body and master it, for fear that after having preached to others, I myself should be rejected. (1 Corinthians 9: 24-26).

Parents, grandparents, and religion teachers pass on the faith to the new generations by word and example. The passing on the faith, entrusted to us by Jesus when he said "Go and Teach all nations...." (Matthew 28:19), must be done with holy pride, with conviction, with joyful vigor, and above all in truth, undiluted as Christ gave it to us as our faith is our greatest heritage.

Humanly speaking, the challenge to teach the faith may produce a kind of "appropriate anxiety" to parents of young children who may wonder: How do I do this? For this reason it is essentially important to have a place to start, a structure within which to work, a set of instructions, a guideline, a tool.

Cardinal Ratzinger, who later became pope Benedict XVI coined the four cornerstones model to teach the faith: the Creed, the Sacraments, the Our Father and the Ten Commandments. This framework is a basic approach system in passing on the faith. It is an excellent framework for learning, re-learning and teaching and preserving the Catholic Faith.

Four Cornerstones



If we are to awaken in our youngsters a taste for the things of God, we must introduce them to Him and have them meet Him daily in prayer so that a living relationship is formed. An added blessing is to discover that one of the greatest side effects of passing on the faith for parents, grandparents and religion teachers is a growth and dependence on their own faith and prayer life.

Finally, it is wise to explain what a cornerstone is. Many children, even the older ones, do not know. When they find out, they see the importance of a cornerstone in a building, it is easy to have them point out how many cornerstones are in a building, and then it is easy to have them point out how many cornerstones there are in a .And what would happen to the walls if they weren't fastened at the cornerstones in some way? When we point out how the cornerstones are a firm basis for the doctrine of what the Church teaches and lives, they will want to understand as much as they can about them.

Please know that here at QHR-Wea we are ready, equipped and happy to support parents, grandparents and religion teachers through our office of Faith Formation and Evangelization and our Catholic School.

A word of gratitude to the faith-filled, courageous men and women who so generously volunteer to pass on the torch of faith to our children and youth at our School of Religion (SOR) and Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) programs at QHR-Wea parish.

Keeping you in the Know - August 2021

As the summer winds down and we ramp up to receive our bright, shiny, and rested students for the new school year, there are some items I'd like to keep you in the know about.

Online Enrollment Process for School, School of Religion (SOR), and Daycare

We've completely revamped our enrollment process for payment of registration fees, tuition, daycare expense, etc., for our school, SOR, and daycare. All of these payments will now be received on-line via our school and church websites. These all use the same payment engine, are PCI (payment card industry) compliant, and have the same look and feel. If users of this system don't have internet access, we provide a local device for their use.

Networking Equipment

We've purchased spare networking equipment as replacements. This includes a network controller, router, switch, and access point. If any of these devices fail, we have immediate replacements on hand. This is especially important given the scarcity of microchips and the on-line nature of our student's education. As the pandemic ebbs and flows, its impact related to services and construction schedules is significant.

Gym Floor Resurfacing

Due to many factors we've had to delay the resurfacing of the gym floor. Our contractor is running late and couldn't start until, at the earliest, the first week of August. The job takes 12 to 14 days and then requires 3 days of drying time before you can walk on it and 7 days before kids can play on it, and even longer to put tables and chairs on it. Given that our auction will be located in the gym we couldn't risk starting the job. The job is scheduled and confirmed with our contractor for June 13, 2022, fixed at the same cost -\$15,600. We chose this date because it was right after the garage sale and provides plenty of wiggle room before next year's auction. A silver lining is that we can solicit donations to redo our school eagle at midcourt. The cost is \$4,600 for a large eagle the same as what we have now or \$3,100 for an eagle that would fit within a 12 ft center circle. We would love to provide this for our students and if there are groups or individuals willing to help financially, please contact Father Jerry or myself. I know the students would be very thankful.

Gym Floor Covering

We've ordered a floor covering for our gym which is slated to be produced and delivered by the end of August. This covering will protect our gym floor when we have events like the auction, garage sale, Mass, etc. A big Thank You to the Altar Society \$2,500, Men's Club \$2,000, and the Knights of Columbus \$1,500 for their donations.

Outdoor Classrooms

Delays in getting steel for the outdoor classrooms have resulted in pushing back the construction until mid to late August. In discussions with the contractor, Gunter Construction, they know our concern for the safety of our students and will take all appropriate actions during construction. Thankfully no related cost increases at this time.

Gospel Meditation

The lens through which we view life makes a difference. It also determines who we choose to learn from and what we allow to shape our thoughts and feelings. For many, life is simply what it appears to be, a given that either through evolution or some other means just came to be. There is no apparent rhyme or reason to things and things can be dissected and understood only in terms of what they empirically present. To the person using this lens, a tree is a tree and a flower is a flower. Their composition and existence can be understood only to the extent that current human knowledge allows. Through this lens, what gives life purpose and meaning? This lens has an essentially unknown beginning and definite end. Once those are accepted, the middle becomes some kind of pursuit of happiness, with values and principles being things that are self-created and found acceptable.

But there is a Divine lens that also exists and deserves mention. It is found when one stumbles upon faith and begins to see things differently. This lens is of God and reveals a Divine Energy and Life that flows through and in all things. Faith then shows us that all that lives comes from this one true lens that can give human beings the purpose and meaning they desperately need. From this perspective, all of life is much more than what is immediately apparent! It now tells and reveals a story about God's generous, creative, and unconditional love! The unfolding of the human story is the unfolding of God's story. What meaning our lives have when they are viewed as a part of God's love affair with humanity! We are indeed special.

The lens of our faith asks us to learn from Jesus Christ. Jesus, as the real Bread of Life, shows us eternal destiny and completes and frames our lives. It is only in allowing ourselves to be taught by Jesus, that faith, hope, and love take on much greater importance. All the relationships in our lives are now structured and ordered using God's primary commandment of love. Jesus, then, is not just some man who lived at some point in history. Jesus is the incarnate Son of god who shows us the way, the truth, and the life. Using this lens changes things up a great deal. Looking at the creation that surrounds you and the special unique people you love, what is God trying to teach you about His love for you and the eternal life He wants you to have?


