

From the Pastor's Desk

Month of the Holy Rosary


October is Respect Life month and also the Month of the Holy Rosary. October 7th is the Feast Day of Our Lady of the Rosary and we will gather as a parish family to pray the Holy Rosary outdoors at 6:30 pm that day in honor of our Lady!

I thank God for the vibrant devotion to our Lady that blesses our parish built to the Glory of God and honoring the Mother of Jesus with the title Queen of the Holy Rosary. There is an unshakable trust in her since day one here at QHR-Wea. Marian piety is what distinguishes us after our Lord for Jesus truly present in the Eucharist.

A valuable catechesis in genuine love for our Lady came from Pope St. Paul VI in his apostolic letter of 1974, *Marialis Cultis*, on the right order of veneration to Mary. St. Paul VI called for a genuine, reinvigorated veneration to Mary, a cultus purified of any stain of so called Mariolatry.

St. Paul VI proposed four checks to make sure our devotion to the Mother of God is pure, sound, and mature, that it be:

- 1. Christological
- 2. Scriptural
- 3. Liturgical and Ecclesial
- 4. Ecumenically sensitive.



CHIRSTOLOGICAL.- as the old maxim goes: "Ad Jesum per Mariam." ("To Jesus through Mary."). The only goal of attention to Mary, as is the only goal of anything we do, is to reach Jesus.

"It is simple Catholic wisdom that the more effective, reliable, enjoyable, and tender ways of growing closer to Jesus is holding the hand of his Mother. The woman whose last recorded words in the Gospel are. "Do whatever He tells you," resists and disdains more than anyone else any attempt to place her above or in front of her son." NYC Cardinal Timothy Dolan.

If our attention to Mary stops with her, it is wrong. She loves being a means to an end, the end being her son. True, genuine, orthodox veneration to Mary is always Christological.

SCRIPTURAL. - Mary's piety is found in the Bible.

"A more pure and genuine devotion to her is not dependent upon the more exotic features of apparitions, secrets, miracles and new revelations."

"Genuine devotion to Mary is Scripture-based." Cardinal Dolan.

LITURGICAL-ECCLESIAL.- the richest way the Church honors Mary is in the Church's official public prayer, celebrating her feasts and content with the liturgical prayers we are blessed with. Mary Mother of God (January 1). Annunciation (March 25th). Visitation (May 31st). Assumption of Mary (August 15). Birth of Mary (September 8th). Our Lady of the Rosary (October 7th). Immaculate Conception (December 8th), and many others.

ECUMENICAL.- positively we are eager to share with separated brethren the richness of true devotion to Mary. Our Blessed Mother shows us all the necessity of <u>fidelity to Christ</u> both in the joys and sorrows of our life. She was with her son at the happiest moment ever: Christmas; and at the saddest moment ever: the crucifixion. So many saints have said this: God may not have favorites, but his Blessed Mother does: Our Lady exemplifies special care for certain people, namely the sick, forgotten, poor, sinful and troubled. Indeed, she is the Comforter of the Afflicted.

Let us continue to go to Jesus through Mary as we pray the Holy Rosary fervently daily, individually, or as a family.

Pray for us, O Holy Mother of God, That we may obtain the promises of Christ! Amen.



Kids Corner Read the Gospel & Color



History of the Rosary Ouestion:

What is the history of the rosary? Where did this prayer come from?

Answer:

Although a longstanding tradition attributed the rosary to Saint Dominic and the Dominican Order, the practice of using beads to count prayers predates the Dominicans by a few hundred years. In fact, it seems that what we now think of as the rosary (which means "garland of roses") was first developed by illiterate peasants and religious brothers and sisters as a way of offering 150 "Our Fathers" to replace the praying of the 150 psalms in the Divine Office.

The practice of reciting 150 Hail Mary's, which was later subdivided into 15 decades of 10 Hail Mary's, arose during the late Middle Ages. Devotion to the rosary began to flourish in the nineteenth century, especially as new devotions to Mary began to spread throughout Europe and the New World. An annual liturgical celebration of Our Lady of the Rosary was introduced into the Church calendar in 1573 and it has been observed on the date of October 7th since 1913.

In the apostolic letter *On the Most Holy Rosary*, Pope Saint John Paul II not only added five new mysteries to the traditional fifteen, but he also reminded Catholics that the rosary is, at its core, any opportunity to go deeper into the life of Jesus: "The rosary, though clearly Marian in character, is at heart a Christocentric prayer...It has all the *depth of the Gospel message in its entirety*, of which it can be said to be a compendium. It is an echo of Mary's prayer, her perennial *Magnificat*...With the rosary, the Christian people sit at the school of Mary and are led to contemplate the beauty of the face of Christ and to experience the depths of this love" (no.1).

Parents need time to talk alone. Each child needs time to talk to his or her parents. Children need time to talk with each other. When you listen to each other, you listen to God. If you have a fight with someone in your family, stop fighting and walk away. Take a deep breath. Pray for yourself and the person with whom you were fighting. When you go back, God will help you make peace.

Prayer

Lord, help my mommy, daddy, brothers, and sisters get along with each other.
