

Keeping You in the Know – October –2021

Hello Folks,

You know, I imagine when people unfamiliar with QHR drive by our parish and get a glimpse of our church and school, they might think what a "nice, sleepy little country parish". Even though I've been coming to this church since the mid 1990's, I used to think that. Not until I started to get more involved and come out of my comfort zone, did I see the reality of this parish come to life. I'm recognizing the sheer volume of activity that takes place, the faith in action by our teachers both at the school and through the school of religion, the dedication of our parish groups and ministries, the amazing 24 hour a day adoration chapel which is foundational to our blessings, and the incredible sense of community that exists. This wonderful sense of community was no more apparent than our recent auction. I'm genuinely humbled by all of you and I thank you, thank you, thank you. Alright, back to 'keeping you in the know'.

Outdoor Classrooms

The site was prepped, forms constructed, conduit placed, the piers and slabs have been poured and saw cut. Site grading is partially complete, and we are waiting for the steel for the classrooms to be delivered. Gunter Construction is the general for the project and AB Creative the contractor for the placement and installation of the steel structures. We just received news that AB Creative has been delayed by yet another three weeks on the steel structures. As a result, Gunter will complete the site prep that they can, install and stripe the 12-space parking lot, and wait. AB Creative is aware that they won't use / damage the newly installed parking lot during installation of the buildings. I'll keep you posted.

We are needing as part of our permanent certificate of occupancy from Miami Co. a stormwater letter from an engineer stating that the additional parking area and structures will not increase the run-off of our site. If, there's someone in the parish that can help with this, please send me an email, or give me a call.

Fund A Need – "FIRMITAS"

With the tremendous success of our auction we *should* be able to fund the following "Firmitas" functional items. New roof for the school, parking lot repair and replacement of certain trouble spots, crack fill, seal, and restripe the affected areas, and new window shades for classrooms at the school. We will be gathering additional bids so costs may vary hopefully go down... We look to complete these projects when interruptions would be minimized. If you'd be interested in providing bids for any of these projects, please contact me.


