

Msgr. David H. Benz was born in Chester Pennsylvania in 1943. He enlisted in the US Air Force in 1962. In 1965, after serving two years in Panama, he was assigned to Than San Ut AB, Vietnam as a paramedic. Upon completion of his enlistment in 1966, Msgr. Benz returned to Pennsylvania and received a Bachelor's degree in accounting from Drexel Institute of



Technology. He entered St. Charles Borromeo Seminary, Overbrook in 1967, graduating with a Bachelors of Philosophy and a Masters of Divinity.

He was ordained May 19, 1975 in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. During the next several years Msgr. served as assistant pastor to various parishes and as Professor at Bishop McDevitt High School. He joined the Air Force as a Chaplain in 1986 and served until his retirement from military service in 1999. During his career with the Military, he served in the U.S, Washington D.C, Korea and the UK. He distinguished himself by establishing programs to care for deployed spouses during Operation Desert Storm, and was awarded the Air Force Outstanding Unit Award, Air Force Good Conduct Medal and the National Defense Service Medal with bronze star.

Upon returning to the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, Msgr. celebrated his jubilee in 2000. He served as Associate Pastor

and Pastor in many parishes and was made a Prelate of Honor with the title Reverend Monsignor on June 12, 2005. He retired from St. Therese Parish, Mt. Airy in 2013 and currently resides in Florida. His calling to serve God has not diminished and has led him to Cross Catholic Outreach where he travels and speaks on behalf of the poorest of the poor.

From the Pastor's Desk

Ending Liturgical Year B and beginning Liturgical Year C.

The end of the church's Liturgical year is next weekend on November 21. Then we begin a new Liturgical Year on November 28 with Advent.

As you remember, the Catholic Church's liturgical year is divided into seasons and marked by colors:

Advent - Purple Christmas - White or Gold Ordinary Time I- Green Lent - Purple Sacred Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Sunday) Red, White, Gold Easter - White or Gold Ordinary Time II - Green

During the entire Liturgical Year we walk with Christ the journey of Faith and we grow in the three theological virtues of Faith, Hope and Love as we read the Sacred Scriptures and deepen our knowledge, the mysteries of the Nativity, Life, Teachings, Miracles (signs), the Passion, Crucifixion, Death, RESURRECTION and Ascension of Jesus Christ.

There are 3 liturgical years:

Year A = St. Mathew Year B = St. Mark Year C= St. Luke

What about the Gospel of John? It is high Christology! We read it during Christmas, Holy Week, Easter and during many Feasts and Solemnities of the Liturgical Year.

As we approach the end of Liturgical Year B, the readings focus on the End Times, the Second Coming of Christ in All Glory!

We affirm each Sunday in the Creed:

"and I look forward to the Resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen."

Before the 2011 changes in the English Mass responses, we used to proclaim: "*Christ has died, Christ is Risen, Christ will come Again*!"

In today's Gospel Jesus affirms that nobody knows when his Glorious Coming will be when he states:

"But of that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father." Mark 13:32

We know that Christ:

A) Already came into history. He was born in Bethlehem. He was crucified and rose from the dead in Jerusalem.B) He comes in Sacraments. He is truly present in the

Eucharist. His WORD we hear when the Gospel is proclaimed.

C) He will come again in Glory.

How can we prepare for Christ's arrival in Glory? The answer is given by Christ himself in Matthew 25: 35-40 when he lists the <u>works of mercy</u>:

- * Feed the hungry
- * Give drink to the thirsty
- * Clothe the naked.
- * Shelter the homeless
- * Visit the sick
- * Visit the imprisoned
- * Bury the dead

Because when we do it for others, we do it for Jesus himself who may be in disguise in the face of those in need!

There is a story that one day Christ came back to earth and appeared on a busy corner downtown. Everyone panicked. People called the priest to ask what they should do. The priest didn't know the answer and said: Let us ask the Bishop. They called the Bishop and the Bishop said: "I don't know, let us call the Pope!" They called the Pope to report that Christ had come back to earth as He had promised and He was at the corner downtown and they didn't know what to do. The pope responded: "*Look busy*!"

That's what we have to do to prepare to meet Christ one day: Look busy being good Catholics and practicing works of mercy of out love for Jesus.

All to the Glory of God!

Hello Folks,

<u>**Outdoor Classrooms**</u> – the saga continues... Supply chain issues are hitting everything, and this project seems to embody that. The steel has finally been manufactured and delivered to the powder coater. The powder coater is swamped and short on materials. Delays continue. Also, we had an issue with the parking lot that after multiple meetings will result in the contractor milling and providing a minimum 2" overlay. This won't occur until after the building is erected, most likely in the spring, so as not to damage the top layer. Thanks to Ralph Theis for his help!

<u>Rosary Path</u> – Father Jerry & I have been meeting with Kathryn Sarnecki & Deb Heine, among others, regarding a rosary path and improvements to the existing area around the Virgin Mary statue to the east of the church. Here's a note from Kathryn –

"What began as just cleaning up some weeds and planting a few flowers for a Mary Garden has blossomed into an exciting plan for meditation with Our Blessed Mother. We are in the early stages of a rosary meditation path to encircle the area around the St. Mary statue rock section and the new garden behind her. If funds allow, we are hoping to incorporate some new lighting to enhance the meditating experience. We would like to offer the walking pavers in memoriam for a donation. These names would be included in a plaque of some sort to be placed in the area where the rosary would begin (with the cross). (We hesitate to have the pavers engraved due to weathering and wear.) Eventually this could possibly be combined with an outdoor Stations of the Cross. Access to the Mary/Rosary Garden will be ADA

Wea Men's Club


