Keeping You in the Know – January –2021

Hello Folks,

I hope you all had a great Christmas & start to the New Year, enjoyed some time off, good food, time with family, and God ever present.

End of Year Donations – Seeing all of the year end donations coming into our parish has been very humbling. I'm amazed by the generosity of our parishioners. A sincere thanks to all of you!

Building Committee – “The Building Committee was created in April of 2021 to investigate how we could address some key church building concerns such as accessible bathrooms, larger gathering space and planning for future growth of the parish. In order to determine the best path forward, it is important that we understand the current state of the church building and its capabilities to support these improvements. The committee created a scope of work for a full church building assessment to be performed by a group of professional engineers and architects that have experience in assessing and modifying historic structures similar to our Church. We met with several firms and reviewed their qualifications and proposals. Schaunesy Fickel and Scott (SFS) was deemed to be the most qualified firm and provided the best value to perform the assessment. Award of the assessment contract will occur in early January with a final assessment report to be submitted by mid-March. Once the assessment is completed, this information will be used to guide the creation of options that will address the key building concerns.”

Rectory Updates – At the Rectory we are needing to address a number of issues related to the age of the building. We are needing to update mechanical & electrical equipment and address some chimney issues. It's important to know that the costs are open ended and could be substantial because we don't know what's required until we start the discovery process.

Site Signage – We are working with a company to create building signage, way finding signs, etc. for our campus. The intent is to provide those newer to our campus an easier way to find the buildings for which they're looking.

Trash Dumpsters – Just a heads up to those who use the parish hall. The closest gate and dumpsters to the school are for trash only and they can't be loaded higher than the dumpster height themselves. The dumpsters in the gate further from the school are for **recycling only**. When folks toss out trash into these recycling dumpsters and/or pile trash too high in the correct ones we get charged out the whazoo... and that's not good. Please plan accordingly.

Outdoor Classrooms – The classrooms are complete. The asphalt parking lot still needs some work that will be done in the spring. We've had a parishioner step forth to donate sod for this area in the spring as well.

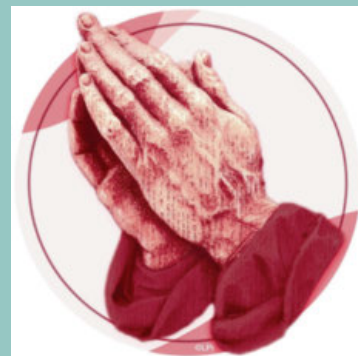

Reflecting upon the deep measure of joy God has in us can be a source of joy for ourselves. Delight is infectious. A very young brother and sister were playing on the beach when the all too familiar ice cream truck made its daily rounds. The boy shook with excitement and delight as he took his sister's hand and exclaimed, "The ice cream man is here, isn't it great?" As they ran off toward the truck, one could hear the girl reply, "Yeah, I can't wait!" The experience of a child's delight in something so simple as ice cream lifts our spirits from our burdens and transports us to the lighter, more innocent side of life.

Life is not meant to be a burden. Believe it or not, God actually wants us to be happy! In fact, the wedding feast at Cana shows us that God even puts His blessing on our happiness. 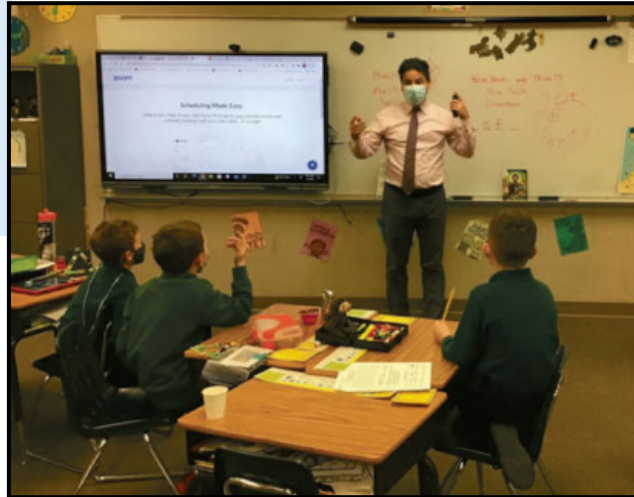

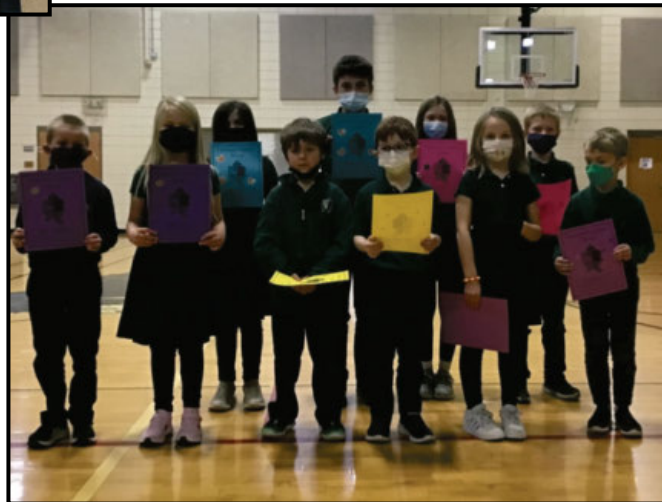

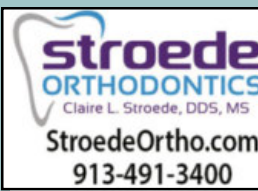
