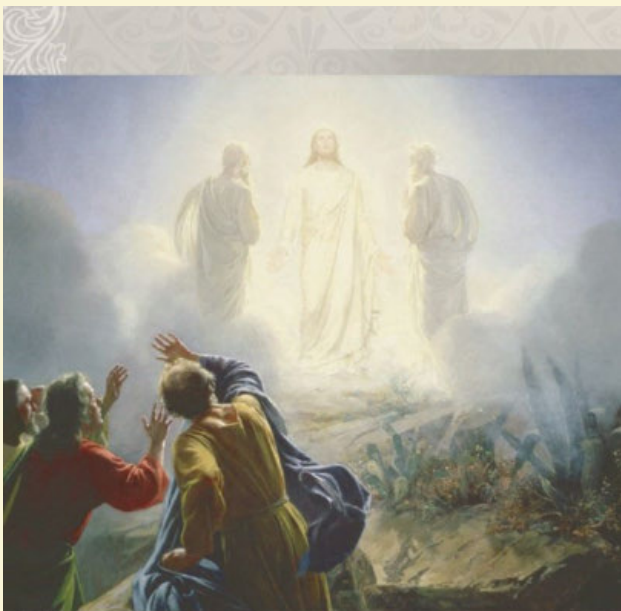

From the Pastor's Desk

Biblical spiritual weapons against temptations

Last Sunday the Gospel presented us Jesus being tempted by the devil during his 40 days in the desert. As we imitate the 40 days of Jesus in the desert during our 40 days of Lent, we also experience being tempted by the devil in our spiritual life. Let us invoke with fervent faith the Holy Name of Jesus always because Jesus can help us when we are tempted because he himself was tempted. Jesus' experience teaches us that there is nothing wrong with being tempted. It is how we react to the temptations that matter.

The devil is the tempter trying to make us fall into temptation and commit sin. For that reason Jesus taught us to pray: *"Our Father...do not let us fall into temptation but deliver us from evil."*

Temptations come to us in three ways:

1. Temptation of power. Someone who is controlling tries to control other people or situations at work or in the family to an extent that is unhealthy. A person may try to control a situation by placing themselves "in charge" and doing everything their way.
2. Temptations of Passions. Being greedy, always wanting more material things, shopaholic, gambling addiction, dishonest business deals. Envy.
3. Temptations of Pleasures. Indulging frequently in eating, drinking, drug abuse, pornography, sex outside of marriage, adultery.

Biblical Weapons Against Temptations

"The Lord is faithful. He will strengthen you and protect you." 2 Thes. 3:3

"Submit yourselves to God, so that you may be able to stand against the devil." James 4:7

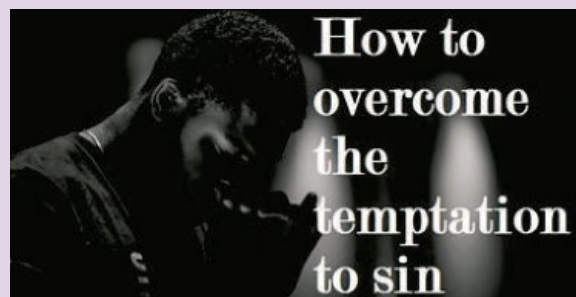
1. **The Word of God.** "Ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ" says St. Jerome. Reading the New Testament is powerful.
2. **Prayer.** Lent is a time to rekindle our prayer experience and recommit to the Lord. For those who have no time to pray, you can book an appointment with God in your daily calendar as if you were texting or making a phone call!
3. **Sacraments.** Reconciliation is a gift of God's forgiveness and inner peace. The Eucharist is our spiritual food for the journey of life.
4. **The Holy Name of Jesus.** "For every one who calls on the Name of the Lord will be saved." Rom. 10:13
5. **Fasting.** It means mortification and sacrifice. Giving up one's own interests and pleasures for the good of others.

6. **Joyful witness of the Gospel.** Reading the lives of the saints and having godly friendships motivates us in life.
7. **Being grateful.** Counting our blessings and giving thanks to the Lord constantly. Mass is a prayer of Thanksgiving for Jesus' salvation.

Have a faith-filled Lenten season overcoming temptations and growing in Faith, Hope, and Charity.

FASTING & ABSTINENCE**

Catholics in good health ages 18 to 59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.

Gospel Meditation

There is so much wisdom in the first commandment. The daily demands of life, current political ideologies and dynamics, social expectations, corporate philosophies, and even technology can easily become lesser gods. We can find ourselves beholden to and held captive by these secular constructs and systems. Even for those who profess a faith in the one true God, these lesser, attractive but false gods are a temptation. Being overly preoccupied and even obsessed with the state of our present lives, we lose sight of our real destiny and purpose.

Jesus showed his disciples a glimpse of this destiny when he was transfigured before their eyes. In fact, Peter was so caught up in the brilliance, awe, and sacredness of these fleeting moments that he wanted to extend them as long as possible. Wonderful things happen when we leave our illusions and discover something that is true. This is why creating some sacred space in our lives for reflection, prayer, renewal, refreshment, centering ourselves, and disconnecting from the noise is so important. It shows us how false and shallow our lives can be and what is really of importance. Do you create some kind of sacred space in your life? Lent is a perfect time to do so.

St. Irenaeus, one of the early fathers and martyrs of the Catholic Church, said that, "he who was the Son of God became the Son of Man that man.....might become the son of God." We mistakenly believe that life is all about us. It's not. Ours is a journey of transformation in which we become more and more one with the mind of Christ and Christ himself. St. Augustine saw this same transformation occurring when the Eucharist is received. In receiving the Eucharist, we become what we eat, the Body of Christ. Honestly acknowledging false gods that we cling to can open the door for God to show us the wholeness and holiness to which we are called. Take time to discover the sacred. When we do, we will want to stay there for a while. Then, when we return to our personal affairs, we will see more clearly.
