



## Keeping You in the Know - April 2022

Hello Folks,

I hope you all had a great spring break! I just want to keep you in the loop – I'll be reducing my hours here at the parish where I'll be working from around 6:15am to 11:30am Monday thru Friday. This is more in line with what was originally planned for me when taking over Nancy Doyle's old position -- continuing my IT responsibilities for the school & parish and assuming her bookkeeping / payroll / HR functions. When Father Jerry transitioned into our parish, he and I saw numerous other items that needed to be accomplished, many of which seemed to fit into my wheelhouse: construction, project management, maintenance, etc. It's interesting when you see a need, you want to fill it and so what started as a 25-30 hour a week position blossomed into 45 or more hours a week. Problem is, even with these additional hours, all of the work can't be done with appropriate attention to detail.

So, while in adoration I was praying to God asking for direction and my phone chimed. I normally pay no attention to the phone during adoration but this time I felt compelled to view it. Probably need to ask forgiveness for that... Anyways, I looked at my phone and it was the City Attorney for Leawood, my former employer, asking if I'd be interested to come back under a temporary six-month contract to help with their IT department. A friend of mine in the department has had some serious secondary covid symptoms and they need some help. The contract was approved by the Governing Body March 21st, and I started the following day where I work from 12:30pm to 4:30pm (Monday thru Friday). I'll be reviewing the department as a whole and aid with the City's budget. So much for a lazy retirement! Just goes to show God has plans and I have to be open to them.

I hope you know this is where my purpose lies and I'm so thankful to be here in the capacity of IT Manager & Bookkeeper / Payroll, etc. Future plans will take shape to address the additional workload, but that's for a later Keeping You in the Know.

#### **School Roof**

The Brown Family Foundation, who has provided many grants to our school for STREAM, has provided help in the form of Charles Hamilton. Charles was a commercial contractor and has vast related experience. He helped form our RFP and list of contractors. Bids ranged from \$270,000 on up. One of the contractors indicates we still have roughly 5-7 years of life left on our roof. He did a core sample of the roof and found three significant layers of protection. He took many photos of the roof and indicated that we have roof penetrations that leak and additional repairs that need to take place. We asked him if doing the repairs and waiting on the new roof would cause us to have to rip off the old roof when installing the new one in 5-7 years? He said a "firm no". Bottom line, we can repair the roof, save the remaining fund a need "roof" funding (\$189,000 minus \$7,000 for repair) for the future replacement. This buys us time to increase funding moving forward.



We love to make examples out of those who have erred and done wrong. Publicly punishing others serves as a means of demonstrating the consequences for what is deemed inappropriate or

wrongful behavior. While this may appear an effective way of achieving conformity to established rules, it runs the real risk of distorting motivation. Obviously, we want people to do what is right and pursue healthy, virtuous behaviors and ideals. But is fear of punishment ever the best motivation for

avoiding one action in favor of another?



Doing something out of fear is never healthy, Focusing exclusively on our behavior and what others expect or think, leads to living life with a self-focused superficiality. We become concerned about protecting ourselves from something negative and unpleasant, than investing ourselves in the freedom, wonder and awe of being human! We can still find our way to the unacceptable or inappropriate behavior as long as we do not get caught! Being a whole, focused, and God-centered human being requires more. It demands an investment of the heart. Virtuous, moral, and mature lifestyles reflective of the Gospel necessitate love.

When we experience and recognize love, God's unconditional love, in the depth of our soul, we fall in love with what we have found. We then find ourselves leaving destructive and sinful actions behind in search of something more holy, dignified, true, integral, and loving. This is really "mercy realized." God's tremendous, loving, eternal forgiveness and willingness to bring us back to something more real and tender is transformational. The respect for myself that I receive from God is so life changing that it causes me to run quickly away from anything sinful and selfdestructive to things that are whole and holy.

There are many people who want nothing more than to judge or criticize us. What would actually stoning the woman caught in adultery really accomplish? Nothing more than the inflation of the already self-righteous egos of a few men who think they have power. They have no power because they are sinners too, just like everyone else. What all of us have is the humble ability to express sorrow for pursuing destructive thoughts and actions and receive the power of God's mercy. Then, Jesus' request to "go and sin no more" will be one we proudly heed and follow.

In Bible days, people who did wrong were stoned to death. Jesus changed that. He said, "If you have never done anything wrong, throw the first stone." Everyone makes mistakes. 
