Emails & Texts

Please be **aware** there are some "bad guys" that attempt to steal money, gather personal identification information, or do harm to our systems by posing as trusted officials asking you to click on a link, open an attachment, or send gift cards. Some emails / texts look very official, like they are from Father Jerry, asking for gift cards or for you to help by clicking on a link.

How does this happen? There are programs that the bad guys develop that scour the internet, bulletins, and websites searching for email addresses / phone numbers, or they hack phones and gather the stored address books. They then send authentic looking emails/texts trying to scam folks. Again, just delete them. If you ever have a question as to the authenticity of a parish email, you can always call the parish office at 913-533-2464.

Pastor's Corner

The Psalms cover every human emotion.

"All the sorrows, troubles, fears, doubts, pains, perplexities, stormy outbreaks by which the hearts of men are tossed have been depicted here to the very life," wrote John Calvin. He called the Psalms an anatomy of the soul.

"Even when the Psalms are changed in Latin, they soothe my spirit. Even when I don't know the words, my soul recognizes them. The 150 Psalms speak of wonder, joy, and celebration, but also of the dark night of despair, desolation, and abandonment. Places we find ourselves too often. The Book of Psalms addresses every facet of the spiritual journey, the ups and downs, heights the soul ascends, depths to which it falls. The Psalms offer praises as well as curses, consolation, and desolation, boasts of strength and cries of weakness. Mostly they make me feel less alone."

"The Psalms reveal the many faces of God: powerful rock, shepherd, companion, comforter, provider, host, creator, judge, advocate, and deliver. The Psalms address every sort of inner and outer turbulence from crop failure to enemy attacks, from illness to loneliness. All of them are meant to be sung, and if they were, it would be like hearing an opera of the Bible."

Gospel Meditation

Jesus tells his disciples, "Peace I leave with you: my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you." The peace that Jesus gives is far different than the kind that comes from the absence of war, conflict, or affliction. The peace that God offers is found alongside suffering and hardship, not necessarily in their absence. St. Teresa of Avila offers us a bit of wisdom regarding peace:

"May today there be peace within. May you trust God that you are exactly where you are meant to be. May you not forget the infinite possibilities that are born of faith. May you use those gifts that you have received and pass on the love that has been given to you. May you be content knowing you are a child of God. Let this presence settle into your bones and allow your soul the freedom to sing, dance, praise, and love. It is there for each and every one of us."

In order for us to experience the divine peace that Jesus offers, we have to allow God's presence to settle into our bones! It is only when this happens that we can be truly taught by the Holy Spirit to discern the true path to peace and find ourselves with untroubled hearts. The world and our lives are so unpredictable and changeable. If we look for a source of lasting and real peace only there, our search will never be satisfied. Something will always unsettle and disturb us. The Jewish disciples could really relate to what Jesus was saying about peace (shalom). They already knew that it was more a matter of achieving wholeness and wellbeing than anything else.

Wholeness and wellbeing are precisely what is uncovered when we begin to really see and know the height, depth, and breadth of God's presence and promise. The elegance of God's Divine life flows through our blood and the marrow in our bones. It is that close and deep. As we breathe in and exhale God's life, peace becomes what we know within and what is exhaled out. This remains in the midst of intense conflict, persecution, suffering, rejection, and even death.

it. Plenty of prophets protested against God's call, whether it was claiming they were too young (Jeremiah) or running away entirely, only to end up in a whale's belly (Jonah). St. Joseph was asked to do something very strange. He was asked to believe - on the word of an angelic appearance in a dream - that his betrothed was pregnant not from another man, but by a miraculous intervention of God. Then he was called to marry her.

Author Flannery O'Connor once wrote, "You shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you odd." Sometimes God's invitation might seem strange or challenging. It might require sacrifices we never expected to make. Our life might look different than we had always imagined. But as we all know, life throws its own curveballs, regardless of whether or not we're listening for God's will. Better, one would think, to be open to the promptings of God and to follow along the strange trails that they lead. We have the assurance that, eventually, we will find green pastures.
