


Register Your Children Today for Vacation Bible School - Cathletics: Training to be Champions for Christ!

Pastor's Corner

"For my house shall be called a house of prayer for all people."

Isaiah 56:7 Matthew 21:13

God's heart is inclusive. We all are welcome at God's house to pray and celebrate the sacraments. Jesus says: "Whomever comes to me



I shall not turn him away." John 6:37

It was not always so. The Jewish Law, found in the book of Leviticus, excused many people from public worship: bleeding women, people with leprosy, eunuchs, renegade Jews who sided with the Romans, Roman centurions, themselves, soldiers of the hated occupying power, adulterous, divorced and remarried people, alcoholics, compulsive liars, and many others.

The Gospels are full of stories of JESUS welcoming those considered misfits into his circle of friends and followers. They, "sinners", were all touched by Jesus, who not only welcomed them but was willing to be ritually contaminated by accepting a welcome into their homes. That infuriated the religious elite of Jesus' time: the priests, the Pharisees and the Scribes who criticized Jesus by saying: "*This man welcomes sinners and eats with them.*" Luke 52:2. Jesus condemned the hypocrisy of the religious leaders, Pharisees and Scribes, of his time.

The German priest and painter Sieker Koder was asked to paint a mural of the Last Supper at the villa of the German College in Rome, where seminarians are prepared for a lifetime of welcoming people to the sacraments. But in practice, some are excluded from sacramental practice due to many circumstances such as divorce and remarriage. This is a vexed, and for many, a painful question.

Koder had his own way of dealing with this. In his painting, gazed upon by future priests and bishops of Germany while they ate, the first person welcomed at the table is a Jew in his prayer shawl. For anyone familiar with German history in the twentieth century, this is a provocative choice. Around the table are odd assortment of prostitutes, clowns, and beggars and an injured African migrant worker, wearing the blue-stripped pajamas of the concentration camp. The message of the mural is muted and clear, and in the background is a barely discernible etching of the parable of the prodigal son. God's criteria for who is welcome are not ours. An American Jesuit recently wrote that at the Eucharistic feast we are neither the ones who draw up the guest list nor the bouncers. It is Christ who is both the host and the feast itself. The Sacraments are medicine for those who are sick, not a reward for virtue.

Let us remember that the Church is not a club for Saints but a hospital for sinners in need of healing, forgiveness, conversion and redemption in Christ.

Gospel Meditation

Unity and diversity can exist together. Our western minds have a grave difficulty seeing unity without conformity. We tend to believe that unless



everyone believes the same thing, assents to the same body of truths, styles, and opinions, unity is not possible. Jesus, in today's Gospel, expresses a tenderness and an intimacy that the disciples actually can witness. This same tenderness and love are also reflected in his desire for unity and oneness. Jesus passionately wants all to be one. It is very clear that the success of Jesus' mission and the advance of the Gospel rises or falls with whether this unity is achieved. And it is a unity that is achieved around a person and not particulars.

Our Church is extremely divided. These divisions all center on various theologies, philosophies, structures, and styles. We allow these particular concerns and interpretations, valid as many can be, to drive wedges between us and put us at odds with each other. They enrage us and cause us to lash out at other members of the Body of Christ. Differences are bound to exist in any group. We are a unique and diverse people. Staunchly clinging to particular agendas and ideologies while waving the "we're right, you're wrong" banner as we forge ahead in battle does little to advance the real mission of Christ. We are perceived as weak, fractioned, self-focused and serving, and lacking empathy and love. How can the work of salvation be accomplished like this? We sacrifice our credibility. For what?


"I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end." These words describe exactly who the glorified Christ really is. Jesus wants us to see this glory! Believe this! This is the unifying principle that draws the Body of Christ together as one, not our particular preferences of worship! We give too much power to our preferences, and all too easily forget that the real mission of Christ is much more than that! If we can work at truly loving each other as members of Christ's Body despite the differences that can so quickly divide us, then maybe we'll be a bit more convincing to those who do not believe. The Risen Christ comes to us through the Eucharist. It doesn't mater where or how. Gather wherever you can and receive. We cannot substitute Jesus' passion with our own. We are one.


