

Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann: Kansas Value Them Both Amendment Isn't A Catholic Issue

The recent commentary by Rabbi Mark H. Levin, targeting the Catholic Church and me personally to attack Kansas' Value Them Both amendment, combined flagrant mischaracterization and anti-Catholic rhetoric.

I have the greatest respect for Judaism and the Jewish people. They know what it means to suffer religious persecution. I am opposed to all forms of antisemitism. I am proud that the Catholic Church in Kansas was a leading advocate for a resolution passed in the Legislature acknowledging the growing problem of expressions of antisemitism in the United States. In my experience, both in Kansas City and St. Louis, the vast majority of Jewish leaders and community members oppose anti-Catholicism.

Levin says that the Church is imposing its religious beliefs on Kansans through its support of the Value Them Both amendment. The mere fact that a law coincides with religious beliefs does not mean it is an impermissible imposition of religion. Many laws coincide with religious beliefs.

From a Catholic perspective, abortion is not primarily a religious issue but a fundamental human rights issue. Our faith helps us understand the dignity of every human life created in the divine image as taught in the Hebrew scriptures, but reason alone is sufficient to know that it is wrong to destroy an innocent human life.

Prominent abortion rights advocate Bernard Nathanson became pro-life not because of religious dogma, but because of science. Nathanson was ethnically Jewish but for most of his life identified religiously as an atheist. He was a co-founder of the National Association for the Repeal of Abortion Laws and directed the largest free-standing abortion facility in the world. He presided over more than 60,000 abortions, personally performing thousands of them. Ultrasound technology, providing a window into the womb and revealing the undeniable humanity of the unborn child, and advances in fetal science compelled Nathanson to reconsider his view of abortion. He renounced his previous strident support for abortion and became a passionate pro-life advocate.

After his conversion, Nathanson acknowledged the lies and manipulation at the heart of his abortion advocacy, confessing he exaggerated statistics regarding the number of illegal abortions and the number of women who died from them. He acknowledged that the had developed what he called the "Catholic Strategy":

• Appeal to anti-Catholicism by blaming the Pope, bishops or priests for abortion limits.

- Elevate in the media pro-abortion Catholic politicians

- Promote the "Catholic Straddle": "personally opposed" but supporting the right of women to choose abortion.

Sadly, Rabbi Levin's commentary is a page out of the Catholic Strategy playbook. The rabbi accuses me of trying to deprive Kansans of personal choice regarding their destinies. Yet, this is exactly what the Kansas Supreme Court did by making the outlandish claim that a right to abortion exists in the Kansas Constitution, taking abortion policy out of the hands of the people and their duly elected representatives and putting it in the hands of the court.

Several months ago, I made an appeal to every Catholic in the archdiocese to donate to a special Respect Life Fund to provide additional support for abortion alternatives, post-abortion healing ministry, the expansion of our efforts to help children in foster care, and support for the Value Them Both amendment. I am proud of the generous response of our Catholic people.

I am also very proud that the Value Them Both coalition includes many other faith-based and secular leaders and organizations, including the Lutheran Missouri Synod, the Kansas Nebraska Convention of Southern Baptists, James Dobson, the Family Research Council, Democrats for Life, 200-plus Kansas medical and mental health professionals, Concerned Women for America of Kansas and Kansas Family Voice.

Value them Both is not a Catholic issue. Preserving current laws and reclaiming the authority of the people of Kansas to determine public policy on such an important societal issue is something every Kansas should be eager to support.



Pastor's Corner

Message of His Holiness Pope Francis for the Second World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly "In old age they will still bear fruit" (Psalm 92:15)

Dear Grandparents, dear elderly persons, we are called to be artisans of the *revolution of tenderness* in our world! Let us do so by learning to make ever more frequent and better use of the most valuable instrument at our disposal and, indeed, the one best suited to our age: prayer. "Let us too become, as it were, poets of prayer: let us develop a taste for finding our own words, let us once again take up those taught by the word of God". Our trustful prayer can do a great deal: it can accompany the cry of pain of those who suffer, and it can help change hearts. We can be "the enduring `chorus` of a great spiritual sanctuary, where prayers of supplication and songs of praise sustain the community that toils and struggles in the field of life".

The World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly is an opportunity to proclaim once more, with joy, that the Church wants to celebrate together with all those whom the Lord - in the words of the Bible - has "filled with days". Let us celebrate it together! I ask you to make this Day known in your parishes and communities; to seek out those elderly persons who feel most alone, at home or in residences where they live. Let us make sure that no one feels alone on this day. Expecting a visit can transform those days when we think we have nothing to look forward to; from an initial encounter, a new friendship can emerge. Visiting the elderly who live alone is a work of mercy in our time!

Let us ask Our Lady, Mother of Tender Love, to make all of us artisans of the *revolution of tenderness*, so that together we can set the world free from the specter of loneliness and the demon of war.

To all of you, and to your loved ones, I send my blessing and assurance of my closeness and affection. And I ask you, please, not to forget to pray for me!

We have truly been blessed through the years with so many wonderful leaders, staff, and volunteers serving our parish. Being involved in Pastoral Council, Finance Council, and with children in our amazing school, it is evident how hard our staff and teachers work to make Wea great. As a relatively small and vibrant parish with a growing school, many of the parish staff wear "several hats" to keep everything running smoothly. Mark Andrasik is one such individual. Mark was hired several years ago to work part-time managing much needed IT and security upgrades in our buildings. Mark's passion for this parish and its people naturally turned that part time job into a fulltime activity managing much needed improvements to our campus, bookkeeping and financial reporting, our church database, and other ongoing needs. Like so many of our staff, he saw a need and filled it. However, when Mark recently answered the call by the City of Leawood to also help with a part-time need there, it became evident that our parish would really benefit from a full-time Parish Administrator.

Father Jerry asked a small group to help research the typical role of a Parish Administrator and define what that would look like here at Wea. After consultation with several parish staff and leaders of other parishes, a job description was written to not only meet our current needs but to provide better support and management to the staff as we grow. This role will report directly to Father Jerry and work hand-in-hand with Nick Antista, our school principal. More information is available in the job posting that has been published on our website. Associated postings have been published in several other local and national employment websites as well. Resumes are due back to Father Jerry by July 31st, and a selection committee of parish organization leaders will be screening, interviewing, and selecting a candidate by end of August. Gospel Meditation

"Our families need to ask for the gift of the Spirit! Through prayer, even in the busiest times, we give time back to God, we find the peace that comes from appreciating the important things, and we encounter the joy of God's unexpected gifts. Through daily prayer may our homes become, like the house of Martha and Mary, places where Jesus always finds a warm welcome (Pope Francis)." While it is necessary to attend to the details of hospitality, learning how to be present to people, experiences, and God is sometimes more important. Creating homes that are welcoming environments requires not only organization and structure, but members who truly enjoy being there and celebrating life with one another.

Details can often get the best of us. While attending to details is important to success, our obsession with them can be problematic. Whether wanting to make a good impression, fear of failure, insecurity, or emotional immaturity, throwing ourselves into the "details" of hospitality can distract us from being present to those we want to serve. Conversely, focusing exclusively on being present without any attention to detail also sets our attempts at hospitality up for disaster! We need a balance of both. But creating a truly welcoming space in our homes and within ourselves requires still more.

We have to be empty of ourselves. Becoming a welcoming, hospitable person is not possible in someone focused on their own needs and desires. If the one we serve is the one who looks back at us in the mirror, then tere is no space for anyone else. While Martha and Mary had different ideas of what it means to serve, they both had the inner space and freedom to do so. They were detached from themselves. Detachment becomes the challenge to hospitality and creating a God-centered, open-hearted space in our lives. When we impulsively act out of our personal agendas, violence, abuse, pride, greed, lust, power, control, passion, and selfaggrandizement encroach upon the space needed to be present to another human being. Not only can others not find a home in us, but even God cannot find a home in us!


