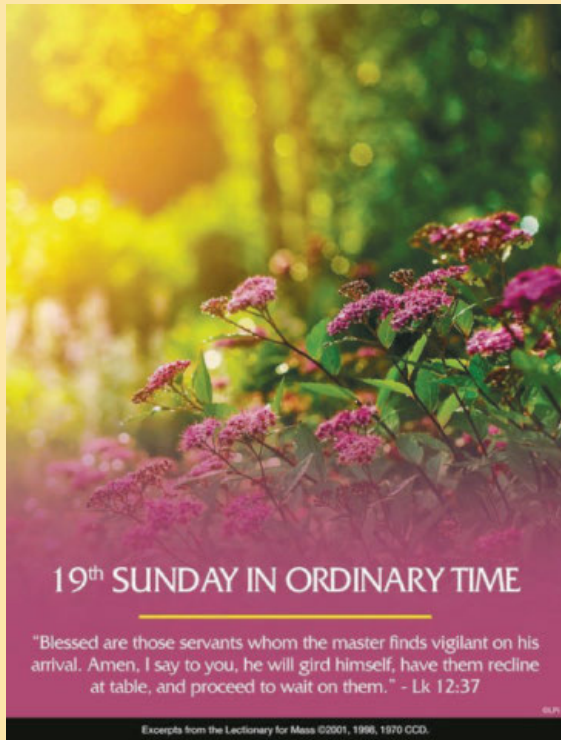

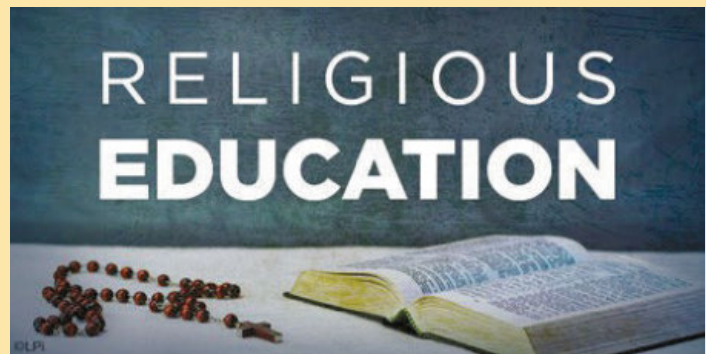

## Pastor's Corner

"Patience achieves everything." Patience is a virtue central to the life of any authentic Christian. Patience is a virtue necessary for success and happiness for any human being, even one without a creed. However, we all struggle with patience, especially in our prayer life.

The Holy Rosary helps us grow in the virtue of patience! It is a well kept secret among the saints!!

A journalist asked Archbishop Dominic Tang, imprisoned from 1958 to 1980 by the communist in China, how he spent his time for those twenty-two years and he responded:

"Everyone wants to know that. I prayed. You had to pray. You say the rosary, counting the prayers on your fingers. You try to fill your mind with religious ideas. Otherwise, you are finished! In fact, after so many years, your memory becomes weak and you can't remember. But, everyone knows the rosary. You can say it easily. And saying the rosary includes the whole life of our Lord and the Blessed Mother."

A patient prayer, the Rosary is.

In our drive-through culture of instant gratification, patience does not run well among some American Catholics. But God works differently than our American ways. We Catholics experience frustration with God when our prayers seem to go unanswered. Padre Pio says: *He has promised us that he will answer every prayer, but he has not told us how and when.*"

We are tempted to impatience with the Lord over our prayer and we can also get upset with him over the problem of evil. Are we not especially impatient with the Lord's apparent slowness in answering our prayers?

A priest took Holy Communion to a homebound ninety-year-old lady right after the Berlin Wall fell, and asked her to pray for vocations. She responded:

"Oh well, forget about that. I've been praying since I was seven for the conversion of Russia and look how long it took him to get around to that! I'm sure not going to be around another ninety years for him to take his time answering another prayer!" Boy, the priest was sorry he asked her for prayers. But yet was she not honest in expressing a very human impatience with the Lord, one that we are all at times tempted to express?

We have to admit that we do become impatient with God in our prayer life. The sterility, dryness, and tedium we experience in our prayer life leads us to discouragement that tempts us to give up.

Yves Congar has a book entitled *The Need for Patience*, and at the start he describes it for us:

"Patience is a quality of mind--or, rather, of soul--which takes root in these profound convictions: first, that God deals the cards and fulfills in us his plan of grace; and second, that for great things, certain delays are necessary for maturation....This profound patience is like the sewer who knows the seed will grow.....Those who do not know how to suffer no longer know how to hope. The man who is too busy, and who wishes to

immediately enjoy the object of his desire, does not know how to attain his goal. The patient sewer who confides his seed to the ground and to the sun--he is the man of hope....."

As we all need to grow in the virtue of patience, especially in our spiritual life, it is good to read and meditate once again Reinhold Niebuhr's famous prayer that those in the AA journey know by heart. It is a fitting prayer for patience:

God, grant me the serenity  
to accept the things I cannot change,  
courage to change the things I can,  
and wisdom to know the difference.

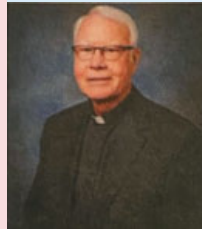
Living one day at a time;  
enjoying one moment at a time;  
accepting hardships as the pathway to peace.

Taking, as he did,  
this sinful world as it is,  
not as I would have it.

Trusting that he will make  
all things right  
if I surrender to his will.

That I may be reasonably happy

with him forever in the next.

### Keeping You In The Know.....

We are looking forward to an excellent school year here at Holy Rosary Wea! At our school we believe that each child is a masterpiece of God created with precision for a specific purpose. This guides us in the spiritual and academic development of each child. We are proud to have been recognized as one of the top schools in the United States by the Department of Education as a National Blue Ribbon School. We continue to have our students achieve at high academic levels, but most importantly, we take time each day to allow our students to develop a closer relationship with Christ.

This year we have some new faces on staff. We are happy to announce the addition of four teachers! First of all, we are welcoming back Anne Pivarnik. Mrs. Pivarnik was a classroom teacher for several years at our school. She now has her early childhood endorsement and is returning to teach preschool and other courses to grades K-8. Next, Christina White will be joining us as our new STREAM teacher. She has taught at Cure of Ars, Sacred Heart, and Holy Trinity. Mrs. White has experience as a classroom teacher and as a technology teacher. Susan Sommer is our new kindergarten teacher. She has been teaching elementary-age students as a classroom teacher and math specialist for 30+ years and has recently moved from Oklahoma back to Kansas with her husband. Last, but not least, Bryan Wallraff will be teaching sixth grade and was most recently a firefighter and EMT for the City of Overland Park. He is pursuing his Master's Degree in Education through a program for transitioning professionals offered through Kansas State University.

Our students' safety will always be our primary concern. Our school has many safety measures and protocols in place, and we continue to work with and receive training from the Miami County Sheriff's Office.

Our enrollment has grown by about 5% this year. We now have 186 students enrolled! We offer an excellent education at a great value. Our academics are strong with excellent teachers and curriculum, our STREAM program funded by the Brown Family Foundation continues to flourish, and our school continues to support each child's individual needs. The per pupil cost to educate a child at our school is \$8970.09. Because the church helps to subsidize the cost of our parishioners' education, the following are our tuition costs for grades K-8 this school year: 1 child \$4222.00, 2 children \$6968.00, 3 or more children \$9084.00.

**Caught In The Rising Action**  
*Tray Earl Welliver, MTS*

Think of some of your favorite iconic movies. I'm not talking about the feel-good comedies or the offbeat coming-of-age flicks. I'm talking about the movies that you found had a profound impact on you or made you go "Hmmm."

I'm willing to bet that the plot of this film features some tough moments and difficult scenarios. However happy the ending, at some point, the situation for the protagonist might look awfully hopeless. The script speaks some truth to you about what it is to be human in difficult circumstances. What it means to persevere.

We're attracted to the tension that exists when the hero is besieged. We're captivated by the decisions he makes in the darkest hour of the night when it seems like the dawn will never come. Why? Because we know that feeling so well. This is the essence of our human life on earth; waiting, hoping, doubting - and enduring.

We know the ending to our story, but we don't know it's coming. We live our whole lives in the rising action of the narrative. Sure, it gets old. Tiresome, even dull. We may start to despair that the climactic scene is coming at all.

But faith is the realization of things hoped for, and evidence of things not seen. We feel it watching a great movie, because we recognize it intuitively: it is faith which earns the happy ending. No one is drawn to the story when the hero gives up or gets tired of waiting for the payoff. Everyday stewardship is the collection of choices we make while we're waiting, because we are called to action, not idleness, even in our perpetual state of expectation.
