

Formed.org: The Siege of Vienna

This epic film tells the powerful true story of one of the most important military battles in history, recounting the Ottoman Turks massive invasion of Vienna, the gateway to the West, on

September 11, 1683, a moment when Christendom and Western civilization truly hung in the balance.

The Christian forces in Vienna, under the leadership of a weak Emperor Leopold I, were unprepared and vastly outnumbered for the onslaught. But a holy, courageous Capuchin monk, Blessed Marco D'Aviano, arrives in Vienna to rally the forces, and calls all the Christian people to fervent prayer, reminding them what is at stake. Pastor's Corner

Many years ago I heard Fr. Gary Pennings giving a speech to the priests while at our annual Fall Convocation the third full week in September. He was the Vicar General of the Archdiocese (like a Vice President) and the pastor of QHR-WEA. He shared that when he became the Wea pastor he was told that new volunteers were needed for the main fundraising events in the parish and he took the task seriously to recruit new volunteers to do the job. People responded generously to Fr. Gary's call to get involved and share their time and talents. Indeed, there is so much God-given talent here at QHR-WEA and you people are great stewards of those gifts and love sharing them with others in our community. Next month, on October 3rd, our new Parish Administrator (PA), Merle Petz will begin serving the QHR-WEA community. Currently Merle Petz is the PA at Christ the King parish in Kansas City, Kansas. He is a parishioner at Church of the Ascension and lives in Overland Park. He is a retired business owner with a vast experience in administration and personnel management. He brings all of that business management and church administration experience to QHR-WEA. Merle will be a great asset to us. Please join me in welcoming him to our community in October. I'll ask Merle to introduce himself to you all at masses on one of the weekends in October.

A hallmark of our Wea community is being welcoming. Let us welcome this transition in our parish administration department and the new faces in the parish office with openness to fresh ideas working all together for the Greater Glory of God.

Gospel Meditation

"You cannot serve both God and mammon." Merriam – Webster defines mammon as material wealth or possession, especially having a debasing influence. While God does not take issue with our need to use money for the business of our lives, there can be a problem with the attitudes we bring to it. We can easily become so preoccupied and obsessed with money that it becomes the real "god" we worship. Do we serve mammon instead of God? In their book, Wealth, Riches, and Money, Craig Hill and Earl Pitts outline symptoms of mammon's influence in our lives..Some of these are worry and anxiety over money, money mismanagement, fear over "never having enough," an "I can't afford it "mentality, impulse buying, stinginess, greed, debt, and discontent.

Many of the things on that list can consume us to the point that we are distracted from what we really need to be doing. Many people spend an inordinate amount of time worrying about money and it becomes the source of their worst fears. If we are honest with ourselves, we need to admit that we place far more emphasis on our material securities than we ought. In fact, we have actually convinced ourselves that we cannot live without it. Are we that certain about the presence of God? Many of the world's problems, especially those involving inequity and injustice, result from the conflicts about money. Many equate money with happiness. Those successful in accumulating large amounts of it quickly realize just how wrong they are.

"Your ultimate allegiance is not to the government, not to the state, not to nation, not to any man-made institution. The Christian owes his ultimate allegiance to God, and if any earthly institution conflicts with God's will it is your Christian duty to take a stand against it. You must never allow the transitory evanescent demands of man-made institutions to take precedence over the eternal demands of the almighty God" (Martin Luther King, Jr.) This is the point Jesus is trying to make. Unfortunately, when we look around our man-made kingdoms are far more prevalent than God's kingdom. When we start seeing greater evidence of justice, equity, dignity, respect, opportunity, gentleness, holiness, solidarity, honesty, simplicity, care for creation, and a decrease in ambition, then we will know God's kingdom is being served. We will be doing what we are supposed to do.

Why Do We Celebrate Catechetical Sunday?

The mission of the church reflects the mission of Jesus to teach, preach, heal, and forgive. 
