

Keeping You in the Know.

The Building Committee, Finance Council, and Parish Council have been hard at work continuing the effort that Father Gary chartered for us in 2021 to address the Parish building needs. We were specifically tasked with 4 activities:

- 1. Determine the anticipated facility needs by conducting studies, surveys and other assessments.
- 2. Recommend individuals or firms with the necessary expertise to assist with this purpose.
- 3. Based on identified needs, research options to meet those needs.
- 4. Propose a strategy for proceeding that prudently considers the needs and the ability of the parish to fund the needed improvements.

As you know, the church assessment was completed last spring and has provided us important information about the condition of our historic building. The next step is to identify future church and campus facility needs like handicap accessible bathrooms, a vestibule that can serve as a true gathering space, and investigating future seating capacity needs.

In early September, SFS Architecture (firm that performed the building assessment) provided a presentation to the combined Parish and Finance Councils to discuss a proposed master planning effort to address these issues. The master planning process starts with reviewing the entire campus to determine how all buildings and functions interact. SFS will then meet with Parish and School personnel to capture how we function and identify potential future facility improvements to support our mission. SFS will then conduct a town hall meeting to give all parishioners an opportunity to provide input. Finally, SFS will take this information and provide up to 3 options that will address our future needs. These options will include cost estimates so that the Parish can review and determine what further action, if any, should be taken as we plan for the future. This process will begin this fall and will likely conclude by February.

One specific point that is important to remember is that this is a planning effort and does not commit us to any renovation or building project. Rather, it collects information and provides recommendations that will assist the Parish in determining facility improvements that are needed to serve our community for many more years to come.

The Building Committee appreciates the past, present, and future support and involvement from all parishioners as we move forward with this effort. Your input will be very important to this master planning process and we encourage you to participate in the upcoming information gathering sessions. Updates and details on how you can get involved in this process will be provided in the bulletin and Mass announcements.

This Year in the School of Religion

QHR-Wea School of Religion (SOR) began on September 18. We are so blessed to have catechists who love what they do! All our SOR catechists and team returned from last year, and we had a great time preparing for the opening of the 2022-2023 SOR year. Last Sunday, it was lovely to see everyone returning and greeting new families. How wonderful to see returning students eagerly waving at their catechists from the previous year and walking into their new classroom with such joy on their faces.

For those who do not know, QHR-Wea SOR serves our parish families whose children attend a school outside the Catholic school system (4-year-olds – 8^{th} grade). Our program exists to instill confidence in our students to become missionary disciples of Jesus Christ. Our goal is to support parents as the primary educators of the faith by encouraging families toward a growing relationship with Jesus Christ and living out this relationship in their daily lives.

Since our program is structured to support parents in forming their children to be disciples of Jesus Christ, learning happens both at home using an online platform and at the school through in-person sessions led by parish catechists. In-person sessions are held two Sundays per month.

What Will the Children and Teens be Doing this Year in SOR? Four-year-olds and kindergarteners will meet in the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) Atrium located in the school. CGS is an approach to children's religious education with presentations based on the Bible and liturgy. This approach to nurturing the faith life of children evolved from children themselves. It is based on the conviction that God and the child are already in a relationship; the task before us is to help the child deepen that relationship.

During each atrium session, children are allowed to work alone and at their own pace. Children are encouraged to walk slowly, speak quietly, and listen for the voice of Jesus in their hearts. The children's prayer life is supported through the use of Scripture, songs, and silence. Your child will learn about the Kingdom of God, the Sacraments, the life of Jesus, and other elements of the Catholic faith tradition. But more importantly, the children will fall more deeply in love with God!

Grades 1-6 will be using **Faith and Life** online series by Ignatius Press for the curriculum. It provides students with solid content suitable for diverse learning styles and allows more flexibility in completing the grade level catechesis. Students cover the content at home and engage in activities, prayer experiences, conversation and group work in the classroom. Each year has a systematic approach covering foundational truths of the Faith as presented in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, fostering spiritual, moral, and intellectual conversations and leading students to become disciples of Christ.

Grades 7 & 8 will be using the Confirmation prep program, Chosen, by Ascension Press. Chosen utilizes a powerful and effective methodology with lessons designed to capture teens' attention to present the faith through videos, student workbooks, and a small faith group format during classes. Teens will be captivated by the story, from Creation all the way through salvation history, and will come to see how the sacraments, prayer, and discipleship are the keys to a happy life.

We look forward to a wonderful SOR year together growing in our Catholic faith!







Gospel Meditation

"If they will not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead." Regardless of how the message of faith is received, a total conversion of mind and heart is needed to take root and have meaning. It is easy to become complacent and comfortable with all that life can afford us. Life can become "all about me," preserving my livelihood and protecting my securities. Often, this drive can become so strong that we eagerly strive to protect our self-interests at the expense of others. Other people are necessary only to the extent that they are "useful" to us and profitable.

Merriam-Webster defines entitlement as "the belief that one is deserving of or entitled to certain privileges." In a world that pretends to offer us so many necessities, this is perhaps the greatest contemporary sin. When we feel "entitled" to something, even if it is perceived necessary, our relationships can get skewed. Unless we adopt a global vision of entitlement wherein everyone is entitled to the same things, we risk becoming extremely self-focused and selfish. All we care about is defending our rights and protecting turf. This impulse can be so strong that we pursue it even at the expense of another. Is this what God intends for his children?

Holding on to this myopic vision, the plight and station of others are off our radar and of no real concern to us. Relying on our own merits and becoming resilient to life's challenges, we replace the true and real God with the one we created ourselves.

Jesus and the prophets before him have consistently reminded us of the dangers of wealth, ignoring the poor and the needy, and becoming too fiercely independent and arrogant. Yet, we conduct our lives as if that message has never been preached. We give our faith a nod and never consider for a moment that we may be wrong in terms of what we see as important. "The things that we love tell us what we are (attributed to St. Thomas Aquinas)." Ponder those words a bit and remember that when we leave this world and go to the next one, what we loved here is what we will look for there. What we sought here may not be there.


