She is Attentive to Every Detail

Pope Pius IX in 1854 promulgated the dogma of the Immaculate Conception (her conception in the womb of her mother, St. Anne, brought about by the natural act of intercourse between her and her husband St. Joachim). It was the age of Enlightenment which said reason alone was enough to save us. Enlightenment had no use for so-called superstitious religious ferry dust. This Dogma asserts that without God's intervention on all levels, we are incapable to realize God's plan for us and salvation is not possible.

In 1792, sixty-two years before the Dogma's promulgation, the first bishop of the United States consecrated his Diocese to Mary under her title of the Immaculate Conception. Fifty-four years later, in 1846 all of the Bishops of our Nation unanimously voted to declare Mary under that same title as the Patroness of our Nation. While our Nation was founded on Enlightenment ideals, the Bishops had the wisdom to place the American Experiment under the patronage, protection and influence of Mary who is the Immaculate Conception. I wonder what would our Nation be like today had that not happened. I have no doubt it would be much different and not for the better. Mary has a unique way of arranging things with her loving hands—mediating God's graces in accord with the desire of Her Son.

The Immaculate Conception: Why? Why did Mary need to be conceived without stain of original sin when she came to be (was conceived) in the womb of St. Anne? Why was this so important or even necessary? On a basic level, it was necessary because she was to be the vessel in whom the Son of God was to be conceived. The all Holy One could only fittingly be conceived in the womb of one free from all taint of sin-both original and actual. Unthinkable for Jesus, the Eternal Word, to become incarnate from sinful flesh! I used to somewhat "stop there" in pondering Mary's I.C. I used to stop half-way through the opening prayer of the Mass (the Collect): "O God, who by the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin prepared a worthy dwelling for your Son..." That isn't enough. There's something more. Her Immaculate Conception was setting the stage for the big plan of salvation history which would intimately involve Mary's role and participation in the unfolding of salvation. You see, salvation isn't merely a static one-time event. It's an on-going, unfolding and dynamic. This is what we pray in the second half of the Collect: "... so through her intercession, we, too, may be cleansed and admitted to your presence."

As Mary historically worked with God in her Immaculate Conception; in the great Fiat—her YES—of the Annunciation wherein she said to God "I'm all in!"; at the foot of her Son's cross on Calvary when she consented to be the Mother of each of us, so her work of cooperation and mediation is on-going even now. Her gaze is upon each of us always. Her mantle surrounds each of us like a protecting shield. She is attentive to every detail of our lives. Nothing we need or suffer is insignificant to her.

And, she did all of this with our good St. Joseph at her side. Together, the two of them at the request of Jesus usher in an untold number of graces. Let us "greedily" beg for as many of them as possible! St. Joseph the Workman, Pray for us!

SACRAMENTS & SERVICES

Marriage

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the rector at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered member of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of Cathedral parish at least three months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

Baptism

Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

Wills & Estates

As you prayerfully execute your will or do estate planning, please consider keeping the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman in mind. The most common and simplest way to include the parish in your last wishes is to include a bequest in your will or trust.

Hospital Visits & Visitation of the Sick:

To secure a priest for unplanned or emergency admissions to a local hospital, it is important that the patient, if possible, or a family member and/or friends, contact the hospital pastoral care department to have the on-call priest administer the sacraments. The on-call priest is considered part of the pastoral team and does not count toward the maximum number of visitors per day rule.

If you become homebound because of illness or a post hospital stay, and would like to be visited; or those who are seriously ill or have been sick for a long period of time should receive the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion. Those with preplanned hospital procedures should call the parish office to make arrangements for anointing. If possible, one should be anointed apart from a hospital stay since there are visiting restrictions.
