
Eucharistic Devotions

MONSIGNOR'S Musings

What Work Must You Do to Let Jesus Change You?

Let me share with you some of the story of St. Cajetan (Gaetano). He was born into a noble family in 1480. If you know your history, that should tell you something. The dawn of the Protestant Reformation was about to begin. In 1517 the Catholic monk, Father Martin Luther, posted his 95 Theses (objections to Catholic Faith and practice) on the door of the Cathedral at Wittenberg. And, not without reason: the Church was in a shocking state of ill-health. There was general corruption and moral laxity among the clergy from high to low. The Church was sick. This is what Gaetano was born into. His father died when he was two and mom raised the three children on her own. She did a good job-she kept God first in their lives. The hard work paid off. Gaetano had an unusual goodness about him as a boy. Later he went to the University of Padua. He studied hard, but prayed harder. He didn't let studies get in the way of prayer. Sometimes we want to shortcut prayer in favor of other things, like studies. In fact, for Gaetano, because he prayed much it purified his understanding of what he was being taught and made his learning holy. He received a degree in Theology and Canon and Civil law. He went home to Vicenza and was made a senator. He toyed with the idea of priesthood but put it on the backburner, feeling that Rome was calling not to take some cushy job with money at court, but rather he had a great sense God was calling him to do some great work. Thus, he formed an oratory, which is a group of priests, living in common, who make a special vow particular to their apostolate (charismatic work), and who carry out

their duties in the midst of the secular world. St. Cajetan knew that if you wanted to change the people, you first needed to change the priests.

His second approach to reform was the Eucharist. He introduced Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament at Venice. He said "I shall never be content until I see Christians flocking like little children to feed on the Bread of Life and with eagerness and delight, not with fear and shame." In another letter he says even more strongly "He has offered himself to be our food. How wretched is the man who knows nothing of such a gift! To us has been given the opportunity to receive Christ, son of the Virgin Mary, and we refuse him. Woe to the man who does not care enough to receive him!"

So, we have incredible graces from the Eucharist. We have God Himself! We are commanded absolutely to feed on Christ, to eat His Body and drink His Blood. And, this is not a symbol! Just because it looks like a little small piece of bread, it isn't—and we must never ever treat it that way. When we receive Jesus, how do we do so? We must receive Him with tenderness, with love, affection—just like you would a newborn baby. Receive Jesus in Holy Communion like you would on that first Christmas night. Imagine the Virgin Mother giving Jesus to you, lovingly and with great care. How would you receive the newborn Infant into your arms, pulling Him next to your heart? The same must be so for the Eucharist. It is the very same Christ. It is spiritually deadly to say one is different from the other. Yes, the Eucharist is the glorified Christ (not the earthly body) but it is the same Christ in His nature and substance. Communion can and will change your life if you let it. In fact, I think it'd be a scandal if it didn't. What work must you do to let Jesus Mag. Hiller change you???

SACRAMENTS & SERVICES

Marriage

Couples requesting the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the rector at the time of formal engagement or at least six months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. If a couple wishes to be married as a registered member of our parish, they must actively participate in the faith (Sunday worship) and be a registered member of Cathedral parish at least three months prior to requesting the Sacrament of Marriage. Weddings are not celebrated during Lent.

Baptism

Parents may request the baptism of their infants at least two months prior to the anticipated date of baptism. To request baptism, please call 782-0322.

Wills & Estates

As you prayerfully execute your will or do estate planning, please consider keeping the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman in mind. The most common and simplest way to include the parish in your last wishes is to include a bequest in your will or trust.

Hospital Visits & Visitation of the Sick:

To secure a priest for unplanned or emergency admissions to a local hospital, it is important that the patient, if possible, or a family member and/or friends, contact the hospital pastoral care department to have the on-call priest administer the sacraments. The on-call priest is considered part of the pastoral team and does not count toward the maximum number of visitors per day rule.

If you become homebound because of illness or a post hospital stay, and would like to be visited; or those who are seriously ill or have been sick for a long period of time should receive the Sacrament of the Sick and Holy Communion. Those with preplanned hospital procedures should call the parish office to make arrangements for anointing. If possible, one should be anointed apart from a hospital stay since there are visiting restrictions.

DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE


The Diocese of La Crosse, through its policies and procedures, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safeenvironment/reporting. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local Parish and on the diocesan website. 




