

Please note on your calendars that beginning next weekend, Saturday and Sunday May 14 and 15, the Masses will switch between Lake Reno and Villard. The Saturday 4pm Mass will be at St. Bartholomew in Villard, and the Sunday 8:30am Mass will be at St. John Nepomuk by Lake Reno.

I realize the change will be an inconvenience to some of you. Unfortunately this is a result of the Bishop's implementation of Area Catholic Communities. What remains important is we keep Holy the Sabbath and attend Mass at one of our three parishes, or another parish of your choice.

On Mother's Day, say a prayer for your mother. Remember our mothers who have passed away and pray they are at peace and watching over us from heaven. We pray also to Mary the Mother of God who watches over all of us.

Remember SGT Bishop E. Evans who died while attempting to save people who were crossing over the river from Mexico. He imitated Jesus by his service to others. Pray for the peace of Ukraine.

In Revelation, John saw a vision of a great multitude, people from every nation, race and language. They wore white robes (the baptismal garment) and worshipped God with songs of praise. "The Lord will shepherd them and lead them to springs of life giving water, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

Please refrain from placing decorations at the cemeteries until Memorial Day weekend. We are in the process of cleaning and making repairs. Remove beforehand any items you want to preserve. Rather than spending money on decorations, consider making a contribution for perpetual care of the cemeteries.

Something to ponder...a Gospel meditation

"Human beings, while capable of the worst, are also capable of rising above themselves, choosing again what is good, and making a new start." (Pope Francis) We have a difficult time figuring out what is true and best for us. There are many voices talking and so many trying to get our attention. We wrongly convince ourselves that the true voice is the voice of progress, the one that speaks of contemporary wants and desires, enticing us with the latest trends and causes. We are taught, by listening to the voices around us, that truth is found in feelings and thought, and ideals must match current and popular human wants. Because we feel a particular way it must be true. Then, we find a shepherd who empathizes with us and affirms us. We follow that voice even though listening to that voice will render us powerless and lead us to harm. There are many with me in this procession to this pasture. I must be on the right path and listening to the right voice.

We are very confused. What can keep us safe and from harm? Where do we go to find life, love, and happiness? Jesus tells us that he is the way, the truth, and the life. The only way to get to Truth, who is God, is through him. There is no other way. The Church, the gate around God's pasture of life, is charged with the mission of directing us where God desires that we go. In the midst of all of the conflicting voices around us, the voice of truth is often muffled in all of the noise, but it beckons us to a life of virtue and grace. Helping us understand who we are and where we have to be, it discerns the voice of God, providing us with the safety net we need to stay straight on our path to life eternal.

We have to trust the voice of God, the true Shepherd, even when it does not mirror what we want and what others may believe. Faith goes way beyond feeling and involves a radical trust in Someone who can lead us and form us. At day's end," if we do not know to find our way home, we will be truly lost. ©LPi

Eucharist for the homebound—If you are homebound and wish to receive Communion at home, contact the church office at 634-3813.

Anointing of the Sick is available on request. If you or a family member wish to be anointed before surgery, when in the hospital, or for any sickness, please contact Fr. Joe. He can be reached by calling the parish office at 634-3813, and if necessary, by leaving a message on Extension 20.



The Anointing of the Sick is offered at regular intervals in the parish and at area nursing homes.

Hospital Visits—If you find yourself or a loved one in the hospital, and would like a visit from a priest, please call the church office directly and leave the patient's name, room number, and name of hospital. Due to privacy laws, hospitals are not allowed to give out patient's names, making it challenging to know who would like a visit.



Baptism Classes: Baptism class is required before a first Baptism. Parents expecting their first child should attend. For questions contact the church office.

The Wedding Policy of the Diocese of St. Cloud requires that you contact the parish at least 6 months prior to your wedding. This is necessary so that all the required steps can be completed in a timely manner. For second marriages, more time may be required. To begin your marriage preparation or for questions about the marriage preparation policy, contact Father Joe (634-3813).
