

THE GIVE AND TAKE OF WORKING TOGETHER

May 11-13, will be remembered as the great flood of 2022. It was of epic proportions which remind us of the flood of Noah's day. It may also be a warning of what is to come in the future, weather wise.

The first major council of the church was the Council of Jerusalem. The apostles met together and decided what tenets of the Jewish faith the gentile converts would need to accept. They reached a consensus that gentile converts should be required to "abstain from meat sacrifices to idols, from blood, from meats of strangled animals, and from unlawful marriage."

These regulations were to avoid any type of pagan practices or emperor worship.

Since then the church has held several major councils to determine the direction of the church in contemporary society. Vatican II was the most recent ecumenical (meaning bishops of the whole world) council. The bishops called for updating of church rites and the liturgy of the Eucharist.

Consensus is a messy was to govern. It requires hours, and possibly days, of discussion back to forth. It doesn't always bring the results we want. However, it remains part of the democratic process and something we hope the bishops remember to strive for in their synod discussions.

Thank you to those who returned your synod questionnaire. Thank to you to our pastoral council (committee) members who contribute their time and talents to guide our parishes. In the future, the Trustees of our three parishes will be the core of the ACC committee.

Please share the word with our summer visitors about the Mass changes.

Something to ponder...a Gospel meditation

Iesus tells his disciples, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you." The peace that Jesus gives is far different than the kind that comes from the absence of war, conflict, or affliction. The peace that God offers is found alongside suffering and hardship, not necessarily in their absence. St. Teresa of Avila offers us a bit of wisdom regarding peace: "May today there be peace within. May you trust God that you are exactly where you are meant to be. May you not forget the infinite possibilities that are born of faith. May you use those gifts that you have received and pass on the love that has been given to you. May you be content knowing you are a child of God. Let this presence settle into your bones and allow your soul the freedom to sing, dance, praise, and love. It is there for each and every one of us."

In order for us to experience the divine peace Jesus offers, we have to allow God's presence to settle into our bones! It is only when this happens that we can be truly taught by the Holy Spirit to discern the true path to peace and find ourselves with untroubled hearts. The world and our lives are so unpredictable and changeable. If we look for a source of lasting and real peace only there, our search will never be satisfied. Something will always unsettle and disturb us. The Jewish disciples could really relate to what Jesus was saying about peace (shalom). They already knew it was more a matter of achieving wholeness and wellbeing than anything else.

Wholeness and wellbeing are precisely what is uncovered when we begin to really see and know the height, depth, and breadth of God's presence and promise. The elegance of God's Divine life flows through our blood and the marrow in our bones. It is that close and deep As we breathe in and exhale God's life, peace becomes what we know within and what is exhaled out. This remains in the midst of intense conflict, persecution, suffering, rejection, and even death. ©LPi

Eucharist for the homebound—If you are homebound and wish to receive Communion at home, contact the church office at 634-3813.

Anointing of the Sick is available on request. If you or a family member wish to be anointed before surgery, when in the hospital, or for any sickness, please contact Fr. Joe. He can be reached by calling the parish office at 634-3813, and if necessary, by leaving a message on Extension 20.



The Anointing of the Sick is offered at regular intervals in the parish and at area nursing homes.

Hospital Visits—If you find yourself or a loved one in the hospital, and would like a visit from a priest, please call the church office directly and leave the patient's name, room number, and name of hospital. Due to privacy laws, hospitals are not allowed to give out patient's names, making it challenging to know who would like a visit.



Baptism Classes: Baptism class is required before a first Baptism. Parents expecting their first child should attend. For questions contact the church office.

The Wedding Policy of the Diocese of St. Cloud requires that you contact the parish at least 6 months prior to your wedding. This is necessary so that all the required steps can be completed in a timely manner. For second marriages, more time may be required. To begin your marriage preparation or for questions about the marriage preparation policy, contact Father Joe (634-3813).
