

KEEPING THE FAITH

The apostle Paul offered many admonitions to his fellow Christians, warning them not to adopt the social values of their day. He warned them this would lead to the loss of grace and life in Christ.

Philippians 3:18-19

For many, as I have often told you and now tell you even in tears, conduct themselves as enemies of the cross of Christ. Their end is destruction. Their god is their stomach, their glory is their shame. Their minds are occupied with earthly things.

Much of Paul's preaching was to reinforce faith in Christ the Redeemer and steer people away from the spiritual fads of the time. He especially warned people against the false religions of the Romans and Greeks.

As bishops grapple with how to discipline public figures who are at odds with the church's teachings on social issues like abortion, our focus remains on education. How do we pass on the knowledge and experience of the faith to a new generations of believers?

The Unites States Catholic bishops, on the Feast of Corpus Christi, will begin a three year focus on the Eucharist, culminating in a Eucharistic Congress. A Eucharistic Congress can be a diocesan or nation wide gathering, consisting of speakers and the celebration of Mass. We might think of it as a conference.

We are always encouraged to continue to read and study our faith. We have many resources available online and in books. I recommend first and foremost reading official church documents and pastoral letters. Both Pope John Paul II and Benedict wrote much on the topic of the Eucharist.

We will have a fundraiser for Marlena Marthaler and her family after Mass Saturday, June 11.

Religious Education Notes



Saintly fun-fact this week: Did you know some people called this saint a witch? And here is why. Joan was always very prayerful, pious (religious) young girl, but when she was a teenager, she began to hear "voices." The voices told her God wanted her to go to the commander of the French army and tell him the French forces were going to suffer a serious defeat. The commander laughed at her and said her

father should give her a good spanking! Joan went back home, but she kept hearing the voices telling her God wanted her to lead the army. She told God she was just a poor girl and couldn't even ride a horse, much less fight with an army. But the voices persisted! Finally, she went back to see the commander. This time he listened to her, as the French had been defeated, just as Joan had predicted. After LOTS of questioning, the French finally decided she could be trusted. Joan was outfitted with a suit of white armor, and a special flag was made with the words "Jesus and Mary" on it. Joan then rode off to battle and free the city of Orleans from the British. After several other success, the king proudly stood at her side. In a later battle though, Joan was captured by the enemy, put in prison, accused of being a "witch", and burned at the stake. Because of her bravery and holiness, this young girl became known as the Maid of Orleans and Saint Joan of Arc!

Something to ponder...a Gospel meditation

We have the ability to walk with joyful hope! Jesus, during his earthly ministry, pointed the way to God's kingdom. What is finally understood about God's kingdom is that it is filled with the glory of Christ! We are all in the process of being emptied into and becoming one with Christ. We are new creations, clothed in Christ, made in God's very image and likeness, and on this incredible journey of glory. The Ascension allows us to see this truth about ourselves and it enlightens our hearts. Christ who was most perfectly, vividly, and brilliantly transfigured before the very eyes of the disciples will be our destiny. Seeing only imperfectly now, we will see perfectly then. We will bask in the brilliance of understanding and truth. Christ is our destiny and our hope. Alleluia!

Believing this with our whole heart allows us to walk proudly through life's darkness. There is so much that can upset us and weigh us down. Sometimes, life's news can not only be challenging but downright discouraging. Our own lives can easily become unsettled and empty. We rely too much on the things of this world to please us and wonder how we lost our excitement, enthusiasm, wonder, and joy. Getting so caught up in superficialities and unnecessary dependencies, we lose our axis, anchor, and center. Today, we can claim it back again! We are reminded that it is not here that we find fulfillment but in the world of Christ yet to come. Jesus sent this promise of his Father upon his disciples, and he sends it to us as well.

Faith in God really has power to change things. In essence, all we have to do is believe in what God promises. God is ever close to us. He can even use what we see as the "useless scraps of life" to create "God moments" of inspiration and invitation. Then, even what is perceived as unpleasant, distasteful, or even hurtful can be transformed into an experience of joy. The Ascension of Christ becomes our reference point for self-knowledge. This firm anchor, allows us to work through whatever comes our way and never be robbed of joy!

Eucharist for the homebound—If you are homebound and wish to receive Communion at home, contact the church office at 634-3813.

Anointing of the Sick is available on request. If you or a family member wish to be anointed before surgery, when in the hospital, or for any sickness, please contact Fr. Joe. He can be reached by calling the parish office at 634-3813, and if necessary, by leaving a message on Extension 20.



The Anointing of the Sick is offered at regular intervals in the parish and at area nursing homes.

Hospital Visits—If you find yourself or a loved one in the hospital, and would like a visit from a priest, please call the church office directly and leave the patient's name, room number, and name of hospital. Due to privacy laws, hospitals are not allowed to give out patient's names, making it challenging to know who would like a visit.



Baptism Classes: Baptism class is required before a first Baptism. Parents expecting their first child should attend. For questions contact the church office.

The Wedding Policy of the Diocese of St. Cloud requires that you contact the parish at least

6 months prior to your wedding. This is necessary so that all the required steps can be completed in a timely manner. For second marriages, more time may be required. To begin your marriage preparation or for questions about the marriage preparation policy, contact Father Joe (634-3813).
