Synod 2021 – 2023 Phase Two

As the Diocese moves forward in its synodal process related to Synod 2021-2023, I would like to express my appreciation to all of our parishioners who took time to attend the parish meeting in the Phase One Process at the local level on November 30 and share their thoughts and wisdom.

The next phase in our Diocesan Synodal Process is for the Diocese to host Deanery-Wide Listening Events which are twofold. These Listening Events are for pastors and their parish representatives to share directly with the Bishop what they heard at their parish gatherings and for the faithful and those in attendance to have the opportunity to add to those comments and conversations. The Deanery-Wide Listening Events are not sounding boards for specific complaints or concerns about any particular parish grouping but are designed to listen to the thoughts and recommendations as to how the Church Universal should proceed and move forward. In addition, these sessions are designed for the Bishop to listen, to process and to take note of. They are not occurring for him to give answers, debate or otherwise comment.

It should be noted and is important to know that the Deanery-Wide Listening Events in addition to having the pastors and their representatives present are open to the public both Catholic and non-Catholic. The meeting for our Northeast Deanery will be held on <u>Thursday, 13</u> January at the Divine Mercy Parish -St. Cecelia <u>Church Hall.</u> The agenda and timeline are as follows. The Prayer, Conversations / Listening will be facilitated by our Directors in the Office of Evangelization. anxiety of family life.

The word "family" connotes many different things for different people and situations. But, no matter what our family circumstances may be, our second reading recalls that we all belong to one family that is indeed holy; the family of God. God made each of us with a unique love and with a future beyond imagination.

BAPTISM


Parents need to be registered in the parish and actively practicing their faith. First-time parents are required to take a Pre-Baptism class. Call the Rectory at 515.295.3435.


