Friends,

When you think of the great politicians of the past fifty years, they really don't seem to have very much in common. After all, politicians like John F. Kennedy, Ronald Reagan, Barrack Obama and Donald Trump do not share similar ideologies, or similar personalities or even similar qualifications. There is, however, one trait common to all four men. All of them, like all great politicians, were able to give people what they wanted.

In the 6th chapter of the gospel of St. John, Jesus demonstrates that He has something of a great politician in Him. This chapter begins with Jesus' feeding of the 5,000 with just five loaves of bread and two small fish. This was a stroke of political genius since there is no surer path to political advancement than an economic stimulus package that includes free food for everyone. Is it any wonder, then, why the crowds following Jesus seek to make Him their king? Jesus, like any great politician, had given them exactly what they wanted.

But being a great politician is not the same thing as being a great leader. Whereas the great politician gives his constituents exactly what they want, the great leader gives them exactly what they need. So, instead of using this miracle to advance His political career, Jesus chooses instead to teach the crowds the truth. When the same crowds return the next day looking for more free food, Jesus chooses to explain the deeper significance of this miracle. "Do not labor for the food which perishes," Jesus tells the crowds, "but labor for the food which endures to eternal life." Jesus calls this food the bread of life.

This move is political suicide when Jesus tells the crowds, "I am the bread of life. Whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." Needless to say, the crowd is scandalized. Yet despite this hit to His popularity, Jesus states, not what His followers want to hear, but what they need to hear. "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you have no life in you." Jesus actually tells the crowds following Him that they are to eat His flesh and drink His blood. How could Jesus command something so vile?

Yet it is clear that Jesus cannot be speaking in hyperbole or in metaphor or by using a symbol. Why? Well, first of all, the Greek word translated "eat" is far too descriptive to be a metaphor. This Greek word literally means, to gnaw or to rip or to chew. Also, the crowds following Jesus understand Him to be speaking literally, not figuratively. How else do you explain why they immediately begin to murmur and quarrel amongst themselves at these words? Yet, despite this unfavorable reaction, Jesus doesn't send His spin-doctors into the crowd for damage control. Since Jesus is a leader, not a politician, He refuses to spin the truth, even when it is unpopular.

This will cost Him dearly. First, the crowds following Jesus will begin to abandon Him. Then, some of Jesus' own disciples abandon Him and return to their former ways of life. Finally, even one of His apostles, Judas Iscariot, will choose to betray Jesus all because of these words. Still, Jesus doesn't soften His words in order to regain His popularity. He can't! Jesus is not a politician, but a leader, and, to a leader, the only thing that matters is the truth.

But, before we dismiss those who walk away from Jesus as unenlightened, uneducated or just plain stupid, we might ask ourselves what is our reaction to this truth? How well do we recognize Jesus' presence in this, the greatest of all His gifts? Do we, too, reject this truth through our lack of attendance or participation at mass? Do we take time during the week to make a visit to the King of the Universe, who is granting personal audiences 24 hours a day, 7 days a week in our church? (***continued on last page**)

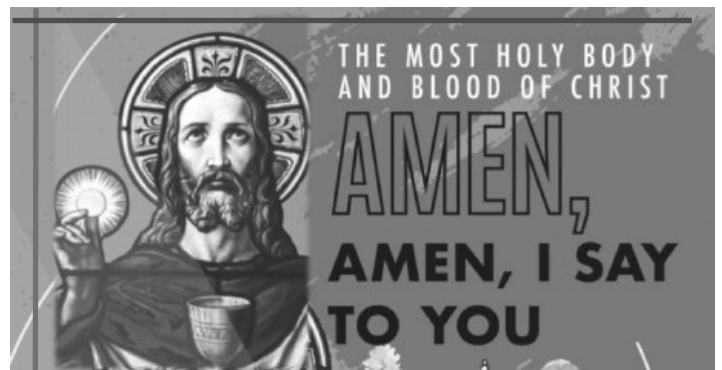
